

#### FRONT'N CENTER

I have been burdened over these past months with the spiritual life of our congregation. My heart and experience tells me that it is vital for all persons to have a saving relationship with God through Jesus Christ. There have been situations in which persons have expressed with both words and actions that their hearts are not set upon the things and purposes of God, but rather upon personal human interests.

The bottom line is that I am concerned about the salvation of your souls. It is paramount to me that each person has saving relationship with God. There is a popular verse in Joshua in which Joshua proclaims for his household that he says, "but as for me and my house we will serve the Lord" 24:7. The remainder of the story follows in which the people of God also affirm their obedience to God. Joshua says to the people that they will not be able to serve the Lord until they put away the things in their lives that are like gods to them.

Joshua continues to say that their vows which they made to God would be a witness against them if they turned from them. We each say that we have given ourselves to the Lord; we have confessed that we have sinned against God, that we cannot be righteous within ourselves, that we accept that Jesus is the one and only way to God, we have asked for forgiveness in the name of Jesus, and have promised to obey and serve only God for the remainder of our lives.

We have made our vow to God to serve him with our lives and yet we continue to walk in the way of our previous life and focusing upon our self rather than on God. We speak words that epitomize our human beliefs and we act like God does not exist. In doing so, we betray our witness that Jesus Christ the One and only Lord of our life. When we deny God in our everyday life and live like we are the most important thing in the creation we are not in or of God's kingdom. We say to God, I know what I promised to you, but I am going to live my life in my own way.

Examine your own heart and soul. What motivates you in your life? What is your highest priority? If it is all about you and what you think or do; then you are not in God's kingdom. Lent is the time to get your life right with God. Do not endanger your eternal life. Make sure your relationship with God is secure in Jesus Christ and begin to live like it.

#### Financial News:

The Administrative Council asked that I share important information with church concerning the financial health of the church. The first two months of this year have been hard on all of us and also on the life of the church. The months of January and February suffered low attendance and therefore the receipts were also low. As of the end of February the receipts were exceeded by the expenses by \$5880.00. The church has also had unexpected expenses with the boilers and water softener. The church was able to pay additional and shortfall expenses by using money from savings/emergency fund. We are current with all obligations excluding apportionments.

The savings/emergency fund is instrumental in the financial health of the church because it affords us a cash flow base. The more we draw upon it the less cash flow we have and we put the church in an unhealthy financial situation.

Therefore, the Administrative Council is asking each of you to be diligent in your offerings so that the church can continue to be solvent.

#### Administrative Council Meeting Minutes of March 18, 2014

Ad Council Chair Paul Kammarmeyer called the meeting to order at 6:00 in Fellowship Hall. Pastor Mike led us in prayer after joys and concerns were shared.

Kathy Waterman moved, seconded by Bill Scanlon to approve the February 25<sup>th</sup> Ad Council minutes as written. Motion carried.

Pastor Mike shared concerns of the January and February giving towards the budget. Giving is considerably less than needed. Pastor Mike will share concern with congregation at March 23<sup>rd</sup> Sunday Services.

Apportionments to be paid for February will be calculated at 10% of the base line receipts, plus designated apportionments giving for the month and rounded to the nearest dollar amount.

Marilyn Feldman-Alter Committee, reported on the purchase of Lenten and Funeral Banners purchased by the MUMW Memorial money. Also, a banner stand was purchased for displaying the banners

Mission Coordinator Tina Mead reported on activities scheduled:

- 1. Easter Bake sale on April 19<sup>th</sup> from 7-to 11:00, more details later. They will be selling after the Good Friday service if any wishes to purchase early. There will also be a sign up sheet in the hallway if anyone would like to bake something for the sale. Please bring items to the church on Friday the 18<sup>th</sup> so they can put it out.
- 2. Next mission meeting will be April 14<sup>th</sup> at 4:00 pm.
- 3. March's mission is the Heifer project and April's mission is Haiti. We are helping a hospital there to rebuild.
- 4. The ice cream social is set for July 30<sup>th</sup>, 2014.
- 5. There will be no kids "learn and lunch" program this summer due to lack of funding, at this time.

Tina is still working on a mission trip for this summer if anyone is interested in going please let her know.

Al Remling-Evangelism Committee reported on the CPL Wall (Care, Prayer and Love) sign off sheets located on the wall of the hallway ramp area. Many people are signing them but, much more work needs to be done to assist people in responding.

Randy Waterman reported on information from March 11<sup>th</sup> Finance Meeting. General Operations shortfall in budget for February covered from Savings/Reserve funds in the amount of \$3319.00. Approved a maximum of \$300.00 for training in the Church PowerPlus Software for Administrative Secretary by Goslings. A question on Program Expense budget for CORE was discussed. After reviewing Church Change Conference Meeting Minutes, dated November 19, 2013, budget set for

CORE 2014 year is \$625.00/month (maximum). Actual amount calculated from actual receipts compared to base line receipts. Finance Committee scheduled to re-visit this issue in June.

Pastor Mike shared concern about Funeral Committee. Kay Deahl, Funeral Ministry Team Leader has moved to DeWitt, leaving a need for someone to chair this committee. We will be looking for someone to step forward.

Annual Conference dates are June 7<sup>th</sup>-June 10<sup>th</sup>. Al Remling-Lay Delegate will be attending with Pastor Mike.

Script sales are up with Administrative Secretary position being filled, making Script available through the church office as well as Sunday mornings.

Randy Waterman reported that SPPRC has not met with a regular meeting since January with many special meetings involved with hiring process of Administrative Secretary. An April meeting is being scheduled with no date at this time.

Paul Kammarmeyer reported on MUMM rescheduling of the Buffalo Luncheon scheduled for Sunday, March 30<sup>th</sup> at noon. Also, Al Remling shared on the study, "The Way" that will be used with Sunday School and Monday morning Bible Study.

MUMW-Kathy Waterman reported on the rescheduling of the Lenten Breakfast to April 2<sup>nd</sup> at 9:00 a.m.

Pastor Mike reported that there is no scheduled Sunrise Service on Easter Sunday.

Pastor Mike shared up and coming event schedules:

- 1. Church Pictorial Directory Schedule-Pictures will be taken April 29<sup>th</sup> through May 3<sup>rd</sup>. Three (3) volunteers are heading up this event with sitting times being scheduled.
- 2. Senior Graduate Recognition-Sunday, May 11<sup>th</sup>
- 3. Choir-last Sunday set for May 18<sup>th</sup>
- 4. Vacation Bible School-July 21<sup>st</sup> through July 25<sup>th</sup>, with a program on July 27<sup>th</sup>

Tina Mead-Mission Coordinator announced there was no: Lunch and Learning Program scheduled at this time for the summer unless funding from the community becomes available. Approximate cost of the program is \$2300.00.

Pastor Mike was asked about the Nominating Committee and new committee members. Reported that he, Pastor Mike was the nominating committee and two (2) new members joined the Trust

Next Ad Council meeting will be April 22<sup>nd</sup> at 6:00 p.m.

Pastor Mike closed meeting in prayer at 7:10 p.m. and singing of the Doxology.

The meeting was called to order at 5:40 p.m.

All present reviewed the budget, Debbie pointed out the deficit in the General Budget for February. After discussion of whether or not to pull funds from the reserve, Randy Waterman made a motion to transfer funds in the amount of \$3319.00 from reserve to the General Budget. Roger Mueller seconded it, the committee approved. The motion was carried.

Debbie asked the council if there were funds available for training in the Church Power Plus software. It was approved to spend up to \$300.00 with Goslings for such training.

Randy Waterman asked if we were up to date on the automatic contributions being made in the absence of the secretary during January and February. Yes,

they have all been made with the exception of one member who Pastor is working with.

Debbie questioned the contribution to CORE as she understood the dollar amount was to be \$625.00 per month regardless of the funds brought in under the fund yet there was some discrepancy during training in the dollar amount, that there may have been some changes made. After discussion by the board it was determined that Debbie would review prior Ad Council minutes to determine their decision and make appropriate payment. The minutes were located; payment is to be \$625.00 per month.

Scrip sales were discussed, sales are up since the administration position has been filled and the weather has improved.

The next finance meeting has been scheduled for Tuesday, April 8, 2014.


The meeting was closed with a prayer by Randy Waterman at 6:30.
