A note from Reverend Phil...

1Peter 1:3

Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! In his great mercy he has given us new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, and into an inheritance that can never perish, spoil or fade.

Last week I traveled to Indianapolis to attend the School for Congregational Development hosted by General Board of Discipleship of the United Methodist Church. This is a fantastic conference that really allows pastors to reflect and to dream about the ministries they are doing. I had the opportunity to focus some learning and dreaming time on developing Confirmation, small groups, and on how to make our new **WOW** (Worship on Wednesday's) an exciting opportunity to have an encounter with God. I look forward to sharing these ministry ideas with everyone as I get a chance to refine so much information into a realistic vision. Thank you to all for allowing me the opportunity to participate in this opportunity.

While I was there I ran into Bishop Trimble, who had heard about some exciting things happening at Manchester UMC, and wanted to know what I was doing to create such growth in worship. I really did not have an answer for him, because in all honesty I have not done anything new or special, in fact it started before I even arrived.

My first Sunday at Manchester UMC was July 5th, and there were 127 wonderful folks here to share in worship and to welcome myself and my wife Debbie. Imagine my surprise when I was told that the average attendance in worship for this year through June was just under 80. Since this first week, we have steadily increased so that the July average attendance was 156. The sanctuary is truly filling up, and there is so much positive Spiritual energy. But this all started before I even said one word, told a single funny story or joke, or even uttered one scripture. Something is truly happening here, but it was not of my doing, it was of Jesus.

In the scripture from 1st Peter listed above I saw a profound connection. To paraphrase I see it to say "Jesus Christ, in his great mercy has given us new birth into a living hope!" Jesus has revealed himself in a new breath of hope in this place, working through the people of this church to spread the good news into this community. "Come, you are welcome, be a part of something God is doing here in this church family." The hope resides in the people of this church, the invitation to this community through your words and deeds.

So again I say thank you for such a wonderful welcome, and the assurance that this is a place of acceptance and grace. Let the glory reside in its rightful place at the foot of the cross, and in the empty tomb. May our praise and thanksgiving always and forever be focused on Jesus Christ, our Savior. Amen

Co-directors are Beth Mueller & Lynne Rasmussen. If you have been considering joining us, please do! Come to rehearsal on September 9th and see what you think!!


ou rock!

That's why we offer fresh-baked cookies after each worship service, hot homemade meals at our Shelter, a clean and inviting atmosphere, and nice (and often new) clothes in our emergency closet. These are all ways we show people we care, that they have value, and that they are loved – by us and by God.

We believe in giving people second chances. Just as God never gives up on us, we never give up on people and always welcome them back. We never know when the "next time" will be the time that people truly embrace change. There is always hope.

We believe in loving people as they are.

It doesn't matter where they've have been, what they have done, or what they even continue to do, we love them anyway. Through this unconditional love, we build relationship and trust. Through relationship and trust, hearts are open to change.

We believe in partnering with the local church. Without the support of the local church and the community, we cannot do this work. We believe God calls us together to love each other, serve each other, and make a difference in the lives of our brothers & sisters.

OUR VISION

Mission of Hope's vision is to provide a 24/7 Christ-centered ministry offering physical, emotional, and spiritual help to former offenders and others in need. Just as our Shelter is open 24/7, we desire that the Mission be also – providing Bible studies, worship services, and prayer around the clock, day and night. As we meet people's basic needs, God begins to change hearts. As lives are transformed, His people are discipled through a number of different resources. And as the Church uses their gifts to serve the Body, it is also taught, trained, and transformed. Mission of Hope was created to "be the Church," offering His unconditional love, forgiveness, and direction to those who put their hope in Him.

OUR FUTURE

For nearly nine years, Mission of Hope has resided in a building that we don't own. We've paid over \$2,300/ month in rent for the past several years, and we desire to own our own building. Furthermore, we would love to have a facility that would house both the Mission and the Shelter – with everything under one roof. Our facility committee continues to watch for potential sites, and we've toured several places over the past few years, but we continue to wait on God for His will. We also want to have some type of a business or factory, hiring those who have difficulty finding jobs and paying them a decent wage. The profits made from this business will go back to support the ministry.
