COMMITTEE REPORTS

Church Council Minutes January 19, 2016 6:30 p.m.

Present: Gary Evarts, Randy Waterman, Barry Eike, Ron Stellick, Janine Stellick, Jim DeKeyser, Ron Gearhart, Bruce Nodurft, Linda Gearhart, John Tyrrell, Pastor Phil, Al Remling, Jean Gross.

Church Council met in Wesley Hall at 6:30 and was called to order by Chairperson Al Remling. After the Call to Worship prayers and praises were lifted up and Al led us in a time of silence followed by a prayer for guidance. Our meditation was about "Where is God?" Al reminded us that God works through His people going way back in the Old Testament from Adam and Eve through Abraham, Moses, King David on and on. We can see Him at work even in today's chaotic world if we seek Him out.

Janine moved, seconded by Randy to approve the December 15 minutes as written. Carried.

Trustees reported that the kitchen refrigerator is running well and is being well utilized. The funds from various sources to pay for it have been received.

The *Chimes* seems to be reaching those who want to see it either online or as a hard copy. These copies are available on the welcome table.

It was announced that Barry Eike will be our new Mission Chairperson. We welcome him to that team and look forward to a successful year in missions.

The sanctuary remodeling is being put on hold for now until we study that further. Several suggestions have been talked about but no consensus has been reached at the present time.

Reports from several committees were presented. A date was set for the ice cream social. This will be held on Wednesday July 20th from 4:30-6:30 with WOW service to follow.

Pastor Phil talked to us about the involvement of our youth (grades 6-12) in an ecumenical group coordinated by the Youth For Christ director in our area. Three other churches so far are interested in partnering in this endeavor for the youth of our community. They will meet at a neutral site on Wednesdays nights (after our WOW service) and Pastor Phil and the other pastors involved will be helping to lead this. It will be coordinated by the Youth For Christ director. Our church will also partner with a monthly financial contribution to YFC and \$300.00 was mentioned as a starting point for budget purposes. The director is in need of office space locally and it was suggested that he use the youth director's office which is currently not being used. Because of budget constraints this partnership will help with

youth programming and at the same time offer them a way to grow in their faith. Our youth will continue to meet on Sunday mornings at our church as usual. This program will start with some summer activities but will be meeting weekly starting in the fall.

A motion was made by Gary Evarts, seconded by Randy Waterman that we budget \$300 monthly for YFC support and that the YFC use the youth director's office for space when he is in Manchester. Motion carried unanimously.

Al spoke on budget preparation which is nearly completed. The operating budget asking for 2016 will be \$245,000. This just includes monies needed for operations and does not include any in/out accounts. Apportionments are based on operations only so this will affect our apportionments in the future. Apportionments are dropping \$5,000 this year and are projected to continue dropping for the near future. The budget committee will be meeting to approve the budget this week.

Al handed out the new building use revisions being proposed. We are to look at that and bring any suggested changes to the February meeting. Hopefully we can approve it at that time.

Our next meeting will be on February 16, 2016, in Wesley Hall at 6:30.

We closed with the Lord's Prayer and singing of the doxology.

A note from Reverend Phil...

“Celebrate the Festival of Weeks with the first fruits of the wheat harvest, and the Festival of Ingathering at the turn of the year. (Exodus 34:22)

As I am writing this article this scripture came to mind... At first I thought it might be out of context as it is a part of God's instructions toward the Sabbath rest. Work six days, then rest one and focus on God, even during planting and harvest. And then also celebrate when the harvest comes in. In further reflection I think this scripture is perfect!

As I take a look at all that has taken place in the last month, I sit in wonder and awe for all that God is doing in this place. For the first time in 20 years Manchester UMC paid their full apportionment. This is amazing! This mission gift will impact lives for the transformational power of Jesus Christ from Iowa to everywhere. This is a wonderful gift, and a heart for generosity shared by all who claim MUMC as their church home.

We also have a general agreement through the ministerial association to combine our efforts in youth ministry. To create an opportunity for all youth to come together in faith and fun in the name of Jesus Christ. This will be accomplished by several of the churches coming together in partnership with Youth for Christ to form a single youth ministry effort on Wednesday nights, while maintaining our individual programming on Sundays. To support this effort, the church is going to participate in monthly support of YFC and also provide some office space as well, if necessary. This is one of the most exciting ministry opportunities I have been involved in since moving to Manchester.

In the first six months we have been in ministry together. We have started a new worship experience on Wednesday, have 11 Confirmation students, started meeting with youth, and formed a total of 5 new small groups focused on discipleship. (Not to mention having the whole congregation dancing in service a couple weeks ago!) If that is not worthy of a harvest worth celebrating, then I would be at a loss of what is.

Every Sunday morning, I begin worship the same way... “Is there any place you would rather be than in worship this morning. Amen!” I can't help myself, because it is just so true, to be included in this special body, worshipping an awesome God, in this unique time and in this unique place! It is such an honor and privilege to be called to be your pastor. I am excited to see what the next six months holds, as y'all continue to amaze and God continues to take my breath away!



It's a brand new day at Manchester United Methodist Church. After multiple years of unpaid apportionments the leaders of Manchester United Methodist Church came to a decision point. Scrip News

Scrip sales report for 2015:

The scrip team is pleased to report that the profits from gift card sales this past year resulted in \$6513.50 going to MUMC's budget! \$2500 was presented in July '15 and again in January '16. Additionally, a \$1513.50 check was presented in January for the education budget. This amount is the 3% profit from sales of Fareway cards during the year. You, the congregation, purchased \$50,450 in Fareway cards alone! Our contract with Fareway stipulates that the profits be used for education. This can be children, youth, adults, Sunday School, Vacation Bible School - anything that is educational. So the more Fareway gift cards we sell, the more money goes to our educational programming. If you haven't yet tried scrip gift cards, please consider it and help your church at the same time. They work like any gift card that you buy at stores. At Fareway, you simply swipe the card - no checks to write, no cash to mess with, you don't even have to sign like you would for a credit card. Your remaining balance is on your receipt and stays on your card for the next use.

In 2015, \$148,060 in gift cards was sold. Our profit average was 4.15%. This great addition to our church budget happens only because of you who buy gift cards. If you would like any information to help you get started using gift cards, please talk to a scrip team member. Cards are available every Sunday before and after church in the narthex and also on Wednesdays before WOW.
