A note from Reverend Phil...

"Then you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free."
John 8:32

On Wednesday night February 10 with Ash Wednesday we started the Holy time of Lent. This is the time when we come to terms with our own brokenness, and accept our mortality. Lent ends in March on Easter Sunday. On Sunday's mornings in Lent we are walking through the last several days in Jesus life. This year as we focused on the remembrance of Jesus' passion it occurred to me that you cannot fully appreciate Easter Sunday if you have missed the rest of the story! In Jesus' last days there was the triumphal entry into Jerusalem, the betrayal, the arrest, the trial, and the crucifixion and death. All this took place before the resurrection. This is the greatest story ever told, a story with power for the salvation of all of humanity. This is not the kind of story we want to take lightly, nor is it the story we should keep to ourselves. So this year we are going to do something different. We are going to do a book that will serve as our worship bulletins from Palm Sunday through Easter Sunday. They are going to be single books, because this is all one very important story, and we should all celebrate it together in worship of Jesus Christ for the sacrifice he made for all of us. We want to get these books into your hands prior to Palm Sunday so that you can take them to people you know that need to have a significant experience with Jesus in worship.

So make plans as a family to attend all if possible the worship experiences we will have during Holy Week to hear, remember, and to understand in its fullness this act of love and sacrifice for you, me, and for all. And be sure to invite someone you know so that they too can experience the depth of love Jesus has for them as well.

March 20th- Palm Sunday, 9:00 AM in Sanctuary. The triumphant entry into Jerusalem.

March 24- Maundy (Holy), Thursday 7:00 PM in Sanctuary. The last supper, betrayal, and arrest.

March 25- Good Friday, 7:00 PM in Sanctuary. Trial, crucifixion, and death of Jesus.

March 27- Easter Sunday, 9:00 AM in Sanctuary. The empty tomb, the resurrection!

Scrip News


"What's an AOP?" is a question that's come up recently. One of our families found out recently when they shopped at Honey Creek Furniture and saw a sign behind the counter indicating that they support the MUMC Scrip Program. Thanks to their inquiring about it, they recently added over \$60 to our church with no extra expense or effort on their part. That's a win-win! AOP stands for Amount of Purchase and it works like this: MUMC member Jane Doe shops at either furniture store and spends \$1500 plus tax. Instead of writing a check for \$1605, she writes a check for the \$105 tax to the store and a check for \$1500 to MUMC Scrip. A scrip team member goes to the store, which gives us a 3% return, and pays them \$1455. The remaining \$45 is now profit for our church. It's that easy. Jane has spent no more money but has helped her church. Local area businesses that currently participate in our AOP program (and their percentage of return) are: Boubin Tires (5%), Corcoran Furniture (3%), Edgewood Building Supply (2%), Georgen Auto (5%), Honey Creek Furniture (3%), Lake Design and Decor (3%), and Schroeder's Cash Supply (2%). Please support our church when you shop at these local businesses by using AOP.

One of our ongoing goals is to add new customers. We've recently added at least two new buyers and we thank them for their purchases! Are YOU supporting your church by buying scrip? If not, why not?? If you're not sure how to start, just inquire at the scrip table in the Narthex.

A recent addition to our library collection is entitled "a journey to an end" by Anita Dahlby. Anita is my first cousin and this is her first book. It chronicles the final three years of her elderly father's life (my mother's brother).
