COMMITTEE REPORTS

Church Council Minutes Wesley Hall April 19, 2016 6:30 p.m.

Chairperson Al Remling called church council to order at 6:30 p.m. on Tuesday, April 19, 2016 in Wesley Hall. The call to worship was followed by a reminder that God is with us wherever we go in this life and the next. God uses people as human instruments to share his love. He reminded us that II Timothy 4 states that we need to keep our head in all situations, enduring hardship and doing the work of an evangelist. We should discharge all the duties of our ministry wherever that may take us. We must seek God's Word for the truth and not our own desires.

Prayers and praises were lifted up followed by prayer for guidance.

Jim moved, seconded by Janine, to approve the March minutes as written. Carried.

The financial report was approved as presented. John explained the new budgeting set up. In the future our apportionments will better reflect what is happening with our actual budget.

There was a motion by John seconded by Jim, to make available to the church body the following information in the *Chimes*: Monthly Income total, Monthly Expenses total, YTD Income and Expense and presumed apportionments to be paid. Motion carried. Apportionments are no longer being paid monthly but will be paid in June and December installments.

There was a motion by John, seconded by Ron, to arrange for payments directly from the church accounts for routine billings with the exception of the natural gas bill. Motion carried.

Motion by John, seconded by Kathy, to ask the Trustees to review our natural gas bills due the fluctuations occurring. Motion carried.

More paper copies of the *Chimes* are being asked for. We need to remind people that the newsletter is available online and can be printed as desired at home. If you read it on your computer or smart phone then you can decide which pages you would like to print for your usage.

There was some discussion that bowls and pans left in the back entry for pick up have wandered away. There needs to be a more secure place to store these items.

People are also encouraged to pick up their items as soon as possible. Kathy will address this and see what can be done.

The Library Brunch and fundraiser generated more than \$700 for the library. Two new chairs have been added to replace the old mauve wing back chairs. Please stop by to see this nice addition to the library. Leftover funds will be spent on new materials. Suggestions are always welcome.

We are still awaiting the final draft of the building use policy for approval. There is some concern that this process is taking longer than needed. Al assured us it will be ready for the May meeting.

We will be having a church-wide meeting after church on May 15 to discuss the new budgeting format and financial program that is now in use. There will most likely be other topics that will come up for discussion also. All are encouraged to attend.

Our next meeting will be May 17, 2016 in Wesley Hall.

Meeting adjourned at 8:15 followed by the Lord's Prayer and singing of the doxology.

See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it? I am making a way in the wilderness and streams in the wasteland. (Isaiah 43:19)

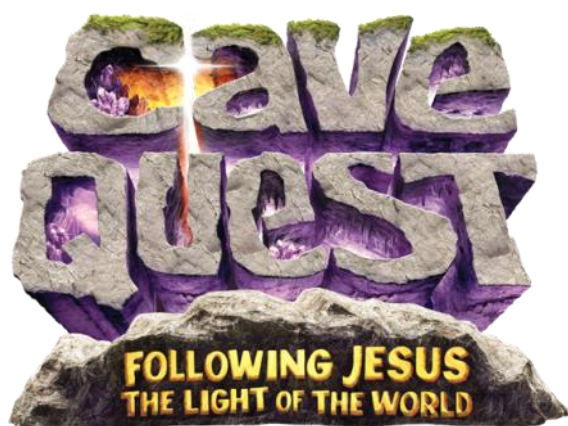

VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL

Spring has just begun, but it's already time to begin planning Vacation Bible School! This year's theme is *Cave Quest: Following Jesus the Light of the World!* The kids are in for an adventure-filled week, but it won't be possible without YOUR help!

This year's VBS will be July 18-22 from 9:00-11:45 a.m., and we are in need of a co-director, preschool leaders, station leaders, crew leaders, and decoration leaders. Descriptions of these positions are below. If you are interested in helping with any aspect of VBS, please contact Stephanie Stocks at 927-3351 or mstocks@iowatelecom.net or contact the church office.

VBS CO-DIRECTOR: Assist in organizing all aspects of VBS including recruiting and training volunteers, ordering supplies, advertising, collecting registrations, etc. Stephanie is looking to train someone to take over as VBS director for summer 2017.

TAD'S PRESCHOOL POOL: Rather than have our 3 & 4-year-olds rotate through the stations with the older kids, they will have their own class. We need two or three adults to lead this class. Crew leaders will help organize these kids and assist the leaders.

STATION LEADERS (Adults): Students (who are grouped in crews) move through various stations that are staffed by an adult leader and feature a different Bible-learning activity. You are the "teacher" for your station. Crews are at your station for approximately 20 minutes. Stations include:

Sing & Play Rock/Cave Quest Closing: This energetic individual opens and closes the morning with all the kids in the sanctuary. They introduce the Bible Point and Bible Memory Buddy each day. They help lead the praise songs, discuss God Sightings, and give hints about what the daily Bible story will be. They may use drama experiences and engaging object lessons to help kids apply what they've learned throughout the day.

Deep Bible Questions: This individual helps the kids experience the daily Bible story in a hands-on way.

Imagination Station: This individual leads the kids through science experiments that connect to the day's Bible story.

KidVid Cinema: This individual plays the daily video segment in our theater and helps the kids practice using a Bible by finding and reading each day's key Bible verse. God sightings and the week's mission project are also discussed.

Cavern Café: This individual prepares and serves the daily snack while reinforcing the daily Bible verse.

Spelunker Sports & Games: This enthusiastic individual leads the crews through a variety of games that connect with the daily Bible Point or Bible story. There are always a variety of games for the leader to choose from to best suit the kids at our VBS.

CREW LEADERS (HS Students or adults): These individuals are assigned to a group of approximately 6 kids. They lead their crew through each station assisting the station leaders as needed.

DECORATION LEADERS: Creative individuals with great vision and ingenuity are needed to turn the Narthex and sanctuary into a cave.

With approximately 75 kids attending VBS each summer, we need at least 16 crew leaders in addition to at least 6 station leaders and 2 preschool teachers to make VBS a success. We also need creative people to help decorate the church, people to man the registration table, assistants for the station leaders, and much more. Please consider how you can use your talents and gifts to benefit the children who attend this year's VBS!

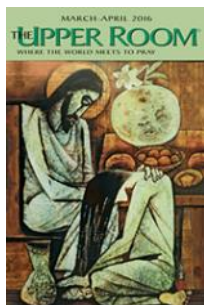

New Bible Study Proverbs *Learning to Live Wisely*

We often look for a book that will tell us “How to...” get a job, a good loan, a good investment, buy a car, buy a house. You can become a balloon artist, an astrologer, an athlete, a golfer or a good dancer.

All these books offer us wisdom-skill in one area or another. Books like these proliferate because we all need wisdom to live successfully and improve our relationship with God. One book of the Bible-the Proverbs of Solomon-specializes in wisdom. It gives us direction and guidance that is practical, concrete, reasonable, wholesome, understandable, shrew and fruitful. By reading and discussing it we gain skill in all areas of life.

Comparing the book of Proverbs with other ancient Near Eastern wisdom literature sheds light on how the collection arose in the first place. They were used in order to instruct the sons of Kings; court officials in many lands would pull together the wisdom they had acquired in a lifetime of diplomatic service.



Solomon tells us the purpose of the collection in Proverbs 1:2-6. Read those verses of the “wisdom” book and come prepared to discuss more of the book of Proverbs.
