A note from Reverend Phil...

"faith by itself, if it is not accompanied by action, is dead." (James 2:17b)

I have participated in mission trips every year since 1995. Some years I have done just a couple, others three or four, but consistently every year. It is a part of my call in ministry, and part of who I am. In 2008/2009 I served as one of the directors of the UMCOR office in Cedar Rapids after the flood and lived for 14 months as if on a constant mission site. My move to Manchester in July 2015 complicated the trips I had planned for that summer, and the teams went on without me. I did have the opportunity to go to Costa Rica though in February 2015.

This summer I wanted to share this wonderful experience and passion with my new church family. I planned to do a trip that would allow families to serve together. I explored sites in Des Moines, Council Bluffs, and Cedar Rapids. All my efforts kept meeting barriers for one reason or another that could not be overcome. In the midst of my efforts, I had several people mention David to me as someone in our community who was in need and deserving of care. Al Saunders happened to be in my office when I ran up against the last obstacle one day, and I shared my frustrations with him. He said "have you thought about David's house?" "Who is this David?" I asked. Though I have put together literally hundreds of work sites in the past, nothing was working now... And I again hear about David... I wonder if this might be a God thing? When Al explained to me who David was, I recognized him from Pizza Ranch and also Second Helpings. So we drove by his house and I knew this was something we needed to get behind, though I was intimidated by the scope and budget of the project.

We found a "Go Fund Me" account online and contacted Cindy Ward, the administrator. There was a sizable amount to seed the project. We contacted David's sister Jo and brother-in-law LaVerle and discussed the possibilities. They provided a generous contribution to see the project forward. The church possesses a fund that was for a previous trip that did not happen, and so we contributed a portion of those funds for another sizable amount, and David kicked in all the money he had earned by saving cans over the last several years. We were about half way there. Then Phillipson concrete stepped in and offered to do all the concrete work as a free donation. Schroeder's Cash Supply in Dundee offered to provide the supplies with a generous discount. Delco Plumbing wanted to participate for an amazing discount, and Al Saunders volunteered to be our general contractor. All of this happened within 48 hours, we had

enough to move forward with the project... Perhaps this is a God thing?

Every step of the way as new issues arose that would challenge the budget, then suddenly unexpected funds were donated to see the project through. As our five-day project stretched to eleven, volunteers kept showing up and the work was completed.

The House of David is now safe, insulated, and beautiful. The work was completed with many caring hands that shared their gifts and talents with joy and fellowship.

Recently I have taught that it is our responsibility as Disciples to provide the energy for God's blessings. It is like providing the wind for the sails of the ship to move. Many hands, financial gifts, food preparation, and prayers propelled this ship of blessings towards Christ's Kingdom goal. I feel I must also extend special recognition to those who kept their hands on the wheel. To Randy and Kathy Waterman, Barry and Sarah Eike, thank you for your leadership on site, and to Al and Debbie Saunders, our Captain and first mate, who labored long and hard to ensure that this was a wonderful project and experience for all involved. James teaches us that faith without action is dead. People have heard enough about the gospel, what they hunger for is to see the gospel in action. Ours is a risen and living Savior, walking with us and loving us even now. This community now has a face to put on a living God, and it looks like all those who made this possible for one of God's beloved. I have heard many comments about how wonderful it is for this church to put the energy behind this blessing, to see it through. I had one person tell me he thought these kind of things only happened in the big cities. All of this does make you feel good, and perhaps even humble pride in what God has accomplished through you. But I think my favorite comment comes from David himself when he proclaimed "I soooooo happy!"



The House of David Mission Project 2016








