John Nilsen Short Bio 2016

John Nilsen was born in Seattle, Washington in 1956. The Nilsen family moved to Portland, Oregon in 1960. Nilsen began studying classical piano from his mother at age six. Continuing his musical education, he began playing guitar at age fourteen. John moved to Ashland, Oregon in 1974 to attend Southern Oregon College (Southern Oregon University). Nilsen graduated in 1979 with a Bachelor of Arts in English, and was honored by the institution in 1995 in recognition of his outstanding achievements, dedicated efforts and leadership in the field of the performing arts with the Distinguished Alumnus Award, the most prestigious award bestowed upon Southern Oregon University graduates. Nilsen founded the Magic Wing recording label in 1987. The label has a catalog of nineteen successful titles, each with interna-



tional distribution. Before founding Magic Wing, John recorded three successful solo piano records on LA's, Eagle Records (1983-1985), has recorded 16 on his own Magic Wing label and has had fifteen other CDs licensed in countries including Germany, Great Briain, The Philippines, Canada, Taiwan, Singapore bringing reported total record sales to well over one million copies sold. Having performed in Europe, Asia and all fifty U.S. States countless times, John Nilsen has also had two hundred and fifty of his compositions and musical arrangements receiving royalties world wide. John played 250 performances in 2015 throughout the USA and Europe. John Nilsen's forthcoming release, Local Ocean, will released in summer

Scrip News

This month's article will focus on how scrip works, both for those who don't completely 'get it' and those who do but might like to know more!

<u>Scrip 101</u>. The MUMC scrip team gets most of our gift cards through Great Lakes Scrip. They contract with businesses to provide the cards at a discount so that churches and other organizations can use them as a fund raiser. We sell them to you at face value and you receive that same value - nothing is taken out of your card. If you buy a \$50 gift card you pay \$50 and you get \$50 - it's that simple. They are just like a gift card you would purchase at a store or other business with one big exception - our church makes money on them.

We have a large inventory on hand, but if we don't have what you'd like or enough of your choice you can fill out an order form for the next time we place a Great Lakes order.

Not sure what all is available? Go to shopwithscrip.com and you will find at least a thousand options for places all over the United States.

Next time you're entering the church on Sunday mornings and you see the friendly face at the gift card table you'll know what's going on! Stop by and see how your scrip team can help you. Gift cards are also available Wednesday nights before WOW.

<u>Scrip 201</u>. From time to time customers ask how much we receive on various gift cards. It varies - a LOT! Typical amounts: Groceries and gas are 1 - 4%. Restaurants have the most variation: 3 - 5% at Burger King, Dairy Queen (other than Manchester), Pin Oak; 6 - 8% at Subway, Starbucks, Applebee's, Pizza Hut; 9 - 10% at Red Robin, Olive Garden / Red Lobster, Panera, Fireside, Manchester Hardee's, Chuong Garden, and the local Dairy Queen.

Some of the best contributors are See's Candies 20%, LL Bean 16%, Old Navy 14%, Bath & Body Works13%, Payless Shoes 13%, Best Western 12%, and Cabela's 11%,

When you purchase scrip our profits are based on each card's % value.

Here's a sample order and its proceeds:

- \$100 Fareway (3%)
- 100 WalMart (2.5%) 100 KwikStar (4%)
- 100 RwikStai (4%)
 100 Thompson Shoes (5%)
- 50 Chuong Garden (10%)
- 50 Kohl's (4%)
- 50 Home Depot (4%)
- 25 Applebee's (8%)
- 25 Shutterfly (9%)

Your total order is \$600; MUMC's profit is \$27.75.

Bottom line. No matter how much you buy through scrip or what each card gives back to us, every time you purchase gift cards through us you are helping MUMC financially!!

<u>Scrip 301</u>. What is AOP and how does it work? AOP stands for amount of purchase. The participating businesses do not issue gift cards; instead, when you make a purchase you write two checks - one to the business for the sales tax and the second to MUMC Scrip for the subtotal. The scrip committee then writes and delivers a check to the business for that subtotal minus the percentage they give us. Businesses currently on our AOP list, with the percentage profit to us in parentheses, include: Boubin Tire Company (5), Corcoran Furniture (3), Edgewood Building Supply (2), Georgen Auto (5), Honey Creek Furniture (3), Lake Design and Decor (3), and Schroeder's Cash Supply (2).

Our History~Why Ronald McDonald House?

The idea for a Ronald McDonald House began in Philadelphia in 1973, when Fred Hill, a member of the Philadelphia Eagles football team, learned that his three-year-old daughter, Kim, had leukemia. The Eagles organized fundraising efforts to assist Kim's, as well as other children's, fight against leukemia. During the course of these efforts, the idea of a 'home-away-from-home' where out-of-town families could stay during their child's hospital treatment, was born.



Why Ronald McDonald?

The Eagles enlisted the help of their local McDonald's restaurants to raise money for the first-ever House. In 1974, the Philadelphia House opened bearing the name of McDonald's happy clown, Ronald McDonald. Today there are over 300 Ronald McDonald Houses worldwide, all serving the needs of families during their child's hospitalization. Each House is independently owned and operated. McDonald's is only one of many generous donors, so community-wide support is the essential ingredient for each House. The Ronald McDonald House of Iowa City

The Ronald McDonald House of Iowa City, opened in 1985, has been a "home away from home" for more than 70,000 family members from all 99 Iowa counties, all 50 states, and over 60 foreign countries. Since opening, the Ronald McDonald House has grown in capacity from 15 rooms to the current capacity of 31 rooms following the House expansion in 1999-2001.

Ronald McDonald House Charities of Eastern Iowa

In 2008 the organization embarked on an expanded mission to help families and children in Eastern lowa outside the walls of the Ronald McDonald House, resulting in a change in our organizational name to Ronald McDonald House Charities of Eastern Iowa. The Ronald McDonald House of Iowa City continues to operate as the cornerstone program while enabling the grant and scholarship programs to make a significant impact in surrounding communities. Since 2008, Ronald McDonald House Charities of Eastern Iowa has provided funding to 32 non-profit organizations whose programs improve the quality of life for children and their families in Eastern Iowa. Ronald McDonald House Charities of Eastern Iowa has also offered 35 scholarships to graduating seniors from Eastern Iowa intent on continuing their education after high school.

Ronald McDonald House Charities of Eastern Iowa & Western Illinois

In August of 2013, the organization more than doubled its impact area for grants and scholarships, and the name of the organization was officially changed to Ronald McDonald House Charities of Eastern Iowa & Western Illinois. Because of the expansion, students in 21 more counties became eligible to apply for RMHC of Eastern Iowa & Western Illinois scholarships. In addition, RMHC of Eastern Iowa & Western Illinois began administering a grants program in those areas. Previously, the McDonald's Restaurant owner/operators managed the grants program in that area. To learn more about the 2013 expansion, click here.

Ronald McDonald Family Room at St. Luke's Hospital

In January of 2015, RMHC-EIWI opened the first Ronald McDonald Family Room located in eastern lowa. The Ronald McDonald Family Room at St. Luke's Hospital in Cedar Rapids serves dual roles. Families from farther distances often welcome the opportunity to grab a quick snack or close their eyes without leaving the hospital. The Family Room also serves local families who may live nearby, but do not want to leave the hospital for a meal or a shower. The Ronald McDonald Family Room at St. Luke's Hospital serves families of children being treated on the NICU Unit, Pediatric Unit, or Child/Adolescent Unit at Unity Point Health - St. Luke's Hospital.


