Please join our church family as we journey through Holy Week in scripture, prayer, and song. The Worship Design Team has spent many hours preparing the worship services in observance of Holy Week - a week of somber reflection on the events preceding Jesus' death. It begins with His triumphant entry into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday, followed by His betrayal by Judas, the Last Supper with His twelve apostles, His arrest, crucifixion and death, and His burial in a tomb. We will look beyond the joyful celebrations of Palm Sunday and Easter, and focus on the suffering, humiliation, and death that is part of Holy Week. It is only in walking through the shadows and darkness of Holy Week and Good Friday, and contemplating the sense of despair that the disciples felt on Holy Saturday, that we can truly understand the light and hope of Jesus' victorious resurrection on Easter morning!

On March 19<sup>th</sup> Bishop Laurie Haller traveled to Manchester to lead worship here at Manchester United Methodist Church. She did not come because we had a special celebration, nor because she is on some rotation and everybody gets the Bishop every now and again... This was a special worship service dedicated to all the amazing things Jesus is accomplishing through this church family to edify the Kingdom. In worship, she talked about House of David, the Clothing Closet, and 2<sup>nd</sup> Helpings and she also met with our Single Board and with me. She was amazed at the transformation and change that has happened here in the last year and a half. We have moved from a place of scarcity to a place of abundance as we have fixed a roof, raised the money for facia, and paid apportionments for the first time in many, many years. We have started new small groups, a youth group, and a Wednesday night worship. Weekly worship has grown from less than 80, to well over 200. Bishop told me we are the fastest growing church in the lowa Conference. Bishop was very pleased with the organization of the day, the meal, the organ jam, and even the District meeting. She was also particularly impressed with the Garden of Gethsemane in the Sanctuary! It was an excellent day, and I was so proud to be the pastor of this family!

But it is important to remember she was not here because she had something to teach us, but instead because she wanted to learn something from us... She asked me directly, "what happened? What did you do to create this change?" My response was an honest confession, "I don't really know." We are watching a blessing unfold here in Manchester, lowa. My only role is to preach Jesus and Him crucified, and the hope in resurrection. There is nothing I could have accomplished without the Holy Spirit, and a wonderful congregation ready not only to see change happen, but be a part of making change happen.

Thank you to everyone who worked to help this day be very special. Thank you to everyone who makes this place so very special. I am blessed to be here and so very humbled to be your pastor. Peace

Thank you for the incredible hospitality that you extended to Bishop Laurie, DS Jackie, me, and people from around the NE District yesterday. You attended to every detail and I was amazed at how smoothly it all went. I know that each one of you brought your best to the day and it showed.

From the greeters at the door to the decorations, the food, the potluck feast, the organ recital, the room reset, the single board meeting, and even the duct tape on the banner ©, all worked together for good. It felt to me like the best of what happens when God's people cooperate with the Holy Spirit.

Your many ministries inspired me and others. I knew about House of David. I was especially moved by some stories I heard over lunch about the clothes closet. I am grateful that you were willing to share your stories and that it will help the whole NE District rise up in ministry. Shalom, Jaymee

Chairperson Al Remling called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. in Wesley Hall. He led us in the Call to Worship from Psalm 30:8-12. He also reminded us that God gives us second chances. He offers us more grace, pardon and love than we rightfully deserve.

#### **Action Items:**

Recommendation from Finance to continue our drive for fascia as people want to give until the end of April. Approved as presented. We have the monies to cover the expected expenses for this at the present time but are aware that funds will always be needed as expenses arise for the upkeep of our church building. Thank you to all who have helped to make this a success.

Recommendation from Finance and the Endowment Committee to apply for funds from the Donald Reth endowment for the years 2016 and 2017. These monies go only towards education and can be drawn once a year. Due to an oversight the funds were not drawn for 2016 but we are being allowed to draw for both years this year. Recommendation approved as presented.

Recommendation from Finance and the Endowment Committee to move the anonymous endowment of \$100,000.00 from a money market account to be invested in the Iowa Methodist Foundation. Recommendation approved as presented.

Recommendation from Finance to create an account for fascia monies and all additional income through April designated for such and transfer those monies into that account so bills for the fascia project can be paid as they arise. Approved as presented.

Recommendation from Missions to find suitable space on church property for raised bed gardens for community benefit. Approved as presented. Zach Rogers is our new Missions chair.

Al has asked to have a crosswalk on April 14 before Good Friday services for anyone who would like to take part in this time of carrying the cross, praying, singing and reflecting on the sacrifice Jesus made for us. This will be added to the calendar.

The organs pipes have been cleaned and due to some water damage extra work was needed on some pipes. They have all been returned and installed.

Randy Waterman has asked for some time away from SP/PRC duties for some rest and recuperation from health issues. Linda Curtis will serve during his absence.

Pastor thanked everyone for a successful Sunday with our bishop as everything went very well and the bishop was pleased with the proceedings.

Pastor gave everyone present a copy of the book <u>Shift: Helping Congregations Back into the Game of Effective Ministry</u> by Phil Maynard. He has had a chance to hear the author and highly recommends we use this as a study at our monthly meetings. We are to read the Forward and Introduction before our April meeting.

The purchase of the house directly south of the church is complete and we will be addressing tearing it down in the future for additional parking lot space.

# **Scrip News**

This month's article will focus on how scrip works, both for those who don't completely 'get it' and those who do but might like to know more!

**Scrip 101.** The MUMC scrip team gets most of our gift cards through Great Lakes Scrip. They contract with businesses to provide the cards at a discount so that churches and other organizations can use them as a fund raiser. We sell them to you at face value and you receive that same value - nothing is taken out of your card. If you buy a \$50 gift card you pay \$50 and you get \$50 - it's that simple. They are just like a gift card you would purchase at a store or other business with one big exception - our church makes money on them.

We have a large inventory on hand, but if we don't have what you'd like or enough of your choice you can fill out an order form for the next time we place an order through Great Lakes.

Not sure what all is available? Go to <u>shopwithscrip.com</u> and you will find at least a thousand options for places all over the United States.

Next time you're entering the church on Sunday mornings and you see the friendly face at the scrip table you'll know what's going on! Stop by and see how your scrip team can help you. Gift cards are also available Wednesdays before WOW.

**Scrip 201.** From time to time customers ask how much we receive on various gift cards. It varies - a LOT! Typical amounts: Groceries and gas are 1 - 4%. Restaurants have the most variation: 3 - 5% at Subway, Burger King, Dairy Queen, Pin Oak; 7 - 8% at Starbucks, Applebee's, Pizza Hut, Red Robin, Olive Garden / Red Lobster, Panera; 10% at Fireside, Hardee's, Chuong Garden.

Some of the best contributors are See's Candies 20%, LL Bean 16%, Banana Republic 14%, Bath & Body Works 13%, Best Western 12%, and Cabela's 11%.

When you purchase scrip our profits are based on each card's % value.

Here's a sample order and its proceeds:

#### We believe in loving people as they are.

It doesn't matter where they have been, what they have done, or what they even continue to do, we love them anyway. Through this unconditional love, we build relationship and trust. Through relationship and trust, hearts are open to change.

We believe in partnering with the local church. Without the support of the local church and the community, we cannot do this work. We believe God calls us together to love each other, serve each other, and make a difference in the lives of our brothers & sisters.

#### **OUR VISION**

Mission of Hope's vision is to provide a 24/7 Christ-centered ministry offering physical, emotional, and spiritual help to former offenders and others in need. Just as our Shelter is open 24/7, we desire that the Mission be also – providing Bible studies, worship services, and prayer around the clock, day and night.

As we meet people's basic needs, God begins to change hearts. As lives are transformed, His people are discipled through a number of different resources. And as the Church uses their gifts to serve the Body, it is also taught, trained, and transformed. Mission of Hope was created to "be the Church," offering His unconditional love, forgiveness, and direction to those who put their hope in Him.

#### **OUR FUTURE**

For nearly nine years, Mission of Hope has resided in a building that we don't own. We've paid over \$2,300/month in rent for the past several years, and we desire to own our own building. Furthermore, we would love to have a facility that would house both the Mission and the Shelter – with everything under one roof. Our facility committee continues to watch for potential sites, and we've toured several places over the past few years, but we continue to wait on God for His will. We also want to have some type of a business or factory, hiring those who have difficulty finding jobs and paying them a decent wage. The profits made from this business will go back to support the ministry.

Matthew 25, Cedar Rapids, Iowa, is also the Manchester United Methodist Church's Mission of the Month for April & May.



In 2006, two brothers began Matthew 25, an independent, local 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization, to help strengthen and elevate neighborhoods on the west side of Cedar Rapids, lowa. When those neighbors needed help recovering from the 2008 flood, Matthew 25 partnered with other organizations to invest more than \$6 million to empower people to rebuild 25 blocks and renew their neighborhoods – Block by Block.

The Block by Block program has been recognized statewide and nationally as a model for disaster recovery and neighborhood revitalization. More than 250 families were able to move back into their homes because of the work of Matthew 25. Using our neighborhood organizational and community development skills, Matthew 25 has grown today into a stable, committed organization that is a leader in finding a neighborhood's potential and building on it. Through volunteers, partners and contributors, our innovative programs help people strengthen their own communities.

#### **Our Mission**

Matthew 25 empowers people to transform neighborhoods.

#### **Our Vision**

Matthew 25 envisions a thriving, connected community where people are valued and talents are multiplied; where neighborhood families have access to safe, affordable housing and healthy food; and where youth are empowered through reading and the creative arts.




# FEATURING Taylor Mason
