A note from Reverend Phil...

"Restore to me the joy of your salvation and grant me a willing spirit, to sustain me". (Psalm 51:12)

Christmas to Easter seems to be such a busy time around the church. Extra worship services to plan, many new folks around church, and some folks who are missing someone in the midst of the holidays for the first time. It seemed that I was always running full steam ahead, and just trying to hang on. But I knew my wonderful bride had planned a vacation for just after Easter, and I admit that I was really looking forward to it, so I just had to make it there. It was only after I was gone a couple days exploring on an island when I began to let go of all that was going on and just relaxed. I was just sitting on the beach, feeling a cool ocean breeze competing with a warm island sun, and looking over an amazing white sand, that I set aside what just a couple of days ago seemed like trials and instead began to count my blessings.

I arrived in July 2015; it has only been 16 months since I came to Manchester UMC. In this time together we have overhauled our financial situation from one of perceived scarcity to abundance. We have increased the numbers in worship, and added a new service on Wednesdays. We have moved from not even meeting a youth group to a regular program run by wonderful volunteers. The Worship Design Team who helps make worship something special with many avenues for us to come into the presence of the Divine. There is new community outreach with many new nonprofit groups meeting in our church building, and even a couple of small free libraries for the kids. We have overhauled our leadership model to a single board model, as we work to invite and encourage more God sized dreams from the congregation. We have started new small groups, a men's group, and are ready to begin raised bed gardening to grow produce for our neighbors. We have fixed a roof, an organ, bought a house, paid for fascia, and completed the House of David. We have also paid our apportionments in full two years in a row, and are up to date to do the same this year. It's no wonder I am tired, y'all are hard to keep up with!

It was good to get away, to see the forest in the trees. It brought to mind Psalm 51:12... "Restore and sustain me Lord, for I am willing"! What a wonderful blessing to be a part of this generation of Manchester UMC!

MUMC Single Board Meeting April 18, 2017 6:00 p.m. Wesley Hall

Present: Toby Tutton, Bill Scanlan, Susan Hermann, Janine Stellick, Linda Curtis, Bruce Nodurft, Benjamin Hucker, Allen Remling, Charlie Dighton, Jean Gross.

Chairperson Al Remling called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. He led us in the call to worship which was from Psalm 1:1-3. He reminded us that John Wesley calls us to trust in God as Psalms 3:5 reflects that our lives are under God's protective care.

Prayers and praises were lifted up followed by a moment of silence and a prayer for guidance led by Al.

Bruce Nodurft noted that John Tyrrell has asked him to take over as Finance Chair; Bruce has accepted and asked for our patience as he assumes that position. We appreciate Bruce's fine recordkeeping.

Bruce asked for feedback on a timeline for apportionment payments. We have been sending that in quarterly and they have recently been sent in for the first quarter.

Congregational care announced that three families have been able to take advantage of items from our storage unit including furniture and medical equipment. The team hopes to set up a schedule for visitation of shut-ins soon to help pastor out as he cannot always find time to get this done.

Missions has received a grant from the Iowa Conference for some raised bed gardens on church property for community usage. They are hoping our church family will step up and help with this endeavor as needed.

Lay leader Bill Scanlan asked for ideas from our Single Board ministry teams of items they would like to see accomplished as we move forward in ministry. A Church Fair is being planned as a time for our congregation to take advantage of volunteering to help in a ministry area where they have an interest.

The board as a group reviewed the Forward and Introduction to the book *Shift* that was assigned for this meeting. This book is by an author Pastor Phil has met and is about helping congregations back into the game of effective ministry. We will be reviewing pages 13-28 for our next meeting.

There being no items needing action, or approval, the meeting was adjourned at 7:30 with the Lord's Prayer and singing of the Doxology. Our next regular meeting will be May 16, 2017 at 6:00 in Wesley Hall.

Congregational Cares

The Congregational Cares team at MUMC is committed in "supporting and promoting physical, emotional, mental and spiritual health for the congregation and community". Due to the generous efforts of numerous individuals, our county is blessed to have Second Helpings, The Clothes Closet, Share The Harvest, Sippers, Ministerial Aid, Food Pantry, Community Food Pantry. In that same spirit we have initiated the following;

-HEALTH CLINIC-held 2nd and 3rd Sunday of the month, except holidays, from completion of services to 11:15 am in the Nursery. Medical personnel are available to answer questions, assess any health concerns including vital assessments (e.g. blood pressure checks), refer to community resources while including the spiritual perspective.

-MEDICAL SUPPLY/HOUSEHOLD ITEM-Consider this an extension of our wonderful Clothes Closet but for medical supply and household items; our intent is to recycle good conditioned shower chairs, silverware, etc. We have an off-church site (through a gracious benefactor) where these items are housed. Contact the church office, Bill Scanlon, or Susan Hermann to direct you to these items.

We also were involved in assisting with the Valentine's Meal that was held at the church in February. We are planning more events for a social time along with the program, Griefshare, which is a Biblically-based 13-week study on grieving. We also have plans for home visits, phone tree, card ministry from congregation members to congregation/community members to encourage and support one another. Plans are also being discussed for a monthly "cooking class" including canning, bread-making, and making cheese, along with garden produce.

Please prayerfully consider these ministries in our effort to meet the needs of our congregation and community. We welcome your service, ideas, and identifying needs not yet met.



ENDOWMENT UPDATES

In 2001 the Manchester United Methodist Church lost a longtime faithful servant when Don Reth passed away. In 2003, to honor her brother, Bertha Tribuno established the *Donald Harold Reth Endowment* as a tribute to his life and to keep his memory alive in a special way. The sole purpose of the Reth Endowment fund is to generate income for our Christian Education program. Christian Education is the focus because Don's wife Marlene and his daughter Tammy had served as Sunday school teachers and as Sunday school superintendents.

The Reth Endowment is established through the Iowa United Methodist Foundation. On an annual basis, the Foundation informs MUMC of the income available for distribution. The maximum amount made available is 5% of the current fund balance. Just recently, MUMC was made aware of the funds available for 2017 and has responded by asking the Foundation to release the available funds.

When the Reth Endowment was established, Manchester United Methodist Church was asked to annually recognize the establishment and existence of the endowment by placing a letter in the May edition of the <u>Chimes</u>. Don's birthday was May 7th. The publication of this letter fulfills our commitment to do so.

The Donald Harold Reth Endowment is an individually owned fund meaning that it is not owned by MUMC and that the church cannot alter the terms of the agreement between the Foundation and Ms. Tribuno. However, anyone who would like to contribute to the Reth Endowment may and is encouraged to do so.

MUMC has also established an endowment fund. Not surprisingly, it is called the **Manchester United Methodist Endowment.** It has been in existence since 2005. This is a church-owned fund and we direct the use of the earnings. Since it currently is a rather small fund, it is thought of as "seed money" and all of the income earned thus far has been reinvested in the endowment. The hope is that at some time in the future this fund will grow to a point where the income earned can be withdrawn and used to meet the needs of MUMC.

As with the Reth Endowment, anyone who desires may make a contribution to the MUMC Endowment. Most recently, a contribution was made by Dr. Kenneth Burrows honoring his wife Betty. We are very appreciative of that gift. If you would like to make a contribution to an existing endowment, would like to establish your own endowed fund, or have questions regarding endowments, feel free to contact any of the individuals named below.
