#### A note from Reverend Phil...

Don't let anyone look down on you because you are young, but set an example for the believers in speech, in conduct, in love, in faith and in purity. (1 Timothy 4:12)

Here we are in this midst of another school year. Schedules are full, life is hectic, and families rush to meet all the demands that society expects. Is it really possible that one day they will look back at this time as the "good ol' days?" In the midst of all this scheduling we find the church, seeking to make more demands of your time. I recognize this not only as a former youth pastor, but also as a parent. So, everything comes down to priorities. How do you set priorities? Education, income potential, growing career fields? Recently in a Washington Post article we found that 62% of recent college graduates were working in jobs that did not require a college degree, and only 27% are working in their fields of study. This is a troubling statistic, how then do we best serve our children? How do we ensure their futures? It seems like this is something new, but no, I think every generation has had to seek their own answers to these questions. But what is our responsibility as the church? To join in this journey and walk with our families as they seek to find balance in a situation that seems to have more demands than time.

What is our Kingdom commitment? To make disciples for Jesus Christ, this remains constant through the changing times. How can we best accomplish this? By developing multiple doorways through which our youth can enter as they seek balance in their schedules. Right now we have Sunday Worship, and then Sunday School for our youth age kids from grades 7-12 in the community room. Pastor Phil is currently leading the youth through the Epistle Romans. On Wednesday we have WOW with a meal at 5:15, with a 6:00 Worship, and then a 6:30 small group and game time wrapping up about 7:30.

This December Pastor Phil and Mike are going to lead a group of teens in a work day of painting, monitor installation, and game assembly to convert the Community Room into a full-blown youth space. Then on December 31<sup>st</sup>, we are going to inaugurate it with our first New Year's Lock-in with food, games, movies, and fellowship. This space will be shared with the scout troops in the church, and we want it to a be warm and welcoming place for adolescents.

So, what more can we do? First, we need some more youth advisors to help lead the group. We really would like to have a female leader presence on Wednesdays and in Sunday School. Second, We need to support our families to know when and where our youth a meeting, so that they can find the times when they can make it all work. Third, we need to pray for our youth in the midst of all this business that they will not be overwhelmed, and that they know they are supported and cared for by their family church.

If you feel called to work with our youth, please let Pastor Phil know!



#### MUMC Single Board October 17, 2017 Wesley Hall 6:00 p.m.

Chair Mark Reth called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. in Wesley Hall. He led us in the Call to Worship which he chose from Psalm 18:30-32. W reminded that only God is perfect and flawless. Many famous people throughout history are known only for their deeds but even they had many flaws. He cited Winston Churchill and President Lincoln as examples. Only God is perfect and people are human in every way.

Prayers and praises were lifted up followed by a moment of silence and prayer for guidance led by Mark.

#### **Team Reports:**

**Finance** reported that as of the end of September actual expenses are \$25,211 <u>less</u> than income. For the year our expenses remain less than what was budgeted for that time period. UMCOR is being sent \$4,207 which includes 10% of September giving plus any other designated monies. All budget requests are due now as the budget will be worked on next week. This has to be completed before charge conference in November.

**Trustees:** The house behind the church should be down by the end of the month. Dennis and Charlie worked at leveling the sidewalks to the east of the church. There is a slight roof leak in the west hallway with all the rain. The heater in the west hall needs repair before it can be used.

**Worship:** The new technology equipment has all been installed in the sanctuary. Mike is working on an issue with the camera used during the children's sermon.

**Missions:** Zach reported that 76 flood buckets were sent from here to UMCOR. the Ingathering in November will be receiving 50 school bags made by the sewing ladies plus a check for \$915 for the purchase of supplies for those bags. Zach is looking for someone to be in charge of Angel Tree gifts for this year.

**Staff Parish** reported that at their last meeting they recommended pay increases for staff and sent that information to Al for the budget.

#### **Action Items:**

Motion by Randy Waterman seconded by Marge Wolter: If the need arises we will pay up to \$300 towards Dennis's out of pocket expenses for the stitches needed for a cut he received while changing a door lock at the church. This does not set a precedent for any future payments and a bill needs to be submitted to Al for verification. Motion carried unanimously.

Pastor briefly discussed "Incarnational Hospitality" which refers to the personal engagement by regular participants in the congregation in building relationships with those we know outside the church in order to be Christ to the unchurched. "Make a Friend, Be a Friend, Bring a Friend to Church".

E-mails of the completed budget will be sent to each One Board Member next week for approval or changes. Due to many conflicts it was decided to not meet before Charge Conference November 19 in Cedar Falls unless necessary.

We closed with the Lord's Prayer and singing of the doxology.




Sunday School for MUMC kids is off to a great start! Preschool - 3rd graders are

#### **Operation Christmas Child Shoebox Tips**

#### Please use one of the red and green GO boxes or a regular size cardboard shoebox.

They are a standard size that packs easily into the shipping cartons at the relay center. While plastic boxes seem practical, many times they break and end up in the "shoebox hospital" at the processing center.

#### **Boy or Girl**

Determine the gender and age category: 2-4 years, 5-9 years, or 10-14 years. Attach the appropriate label (from the OCC pamphlet) on the box lid. Once the box is full, put a rubber-band around the box.

#### Gifts

**Please focus on the practical!** This one box will be shared with all members of the child's home, neighbors, friends, etc. The one washcloth you include may be used by 10 people living with the child! The simple items you take for granted each day could make all the difference in this child's life! Below are some ideas to get you started.

**Non-liquid Hygiene items** (These items will be shared by everyone living with the child. That could be 10-20 people!)

- Toothbrush
- Mild bar soap (leave in packaging & put in a plastic baggie; Ivory is a great choice because it floats)
- Comb
- Washcloth
- Stick deodorant
- Non-liquid lip balm
- Adhesive bandages
- Nail clippers & file

**School Supplies** (The school supplies you send could mean the difference in whether or not the child gets to attend school.)

- Pens
- Pencils (sharpen beforehand if possible) & sharpener
- Crayons or markers
- Paper (Steno notebooks fit well in shoeboxes)
- Solar calculator
- Coloring or picture books
- Glue sticks

#### Clothing/Accessories

- Shirts (plain colors)
- Pants/Shorts
- Shoes/Socks
- Underwear
- Hats/mittens
- Hair bows/Jewelry

#### Other

- Flashlights & batteries (This could be lifesaving for children escaping war or domestic violence)
- Sunglasses
- Tools (no saws or pocketknives)
- Duct tape
- Sewing kit/fabric
- Cups, bowls, empty water bottle
- Fishing kit

**Toys/WOW item** (Focus on the practical but still include a few fun items)

- Balls (even a deflated soccer ball with a hand pump)
- Slinky/Yo-yos
- Stuffed animal
- Small cars/Jump ropes
- Harmonicas
- Puzzles/Binoculars

#### DO NOT INCLUDE:

- Used/damaged items
- War-related items (toy guns, knives, military figures, or any action figure holding a weapon)
- Candy, chocolate or any type of food (could melt or spoil)
- Toothpaste
- Liquids/lotions (containers can break ruining other items in the box)
- Medications/vitamins
- Breakable items (snow globes, glass containers, etc.)

#### **Include \$9 Donation**

This covers the shipping cost to ensure your gift reaches the right child. 



