**Church Council Minutes
Wesley Hall
May 17, 2016**

Present: Al Remling, Ben Hucker, Janine Stellick, Barry Eike, Ron Stellick, Bruce Nodurft, John Tyrrell, Ron Gearhart, Linda Gearhart, Rev. Phil, Jean Gross.

Chairperson Al opened the meeting at 6:30 on Tuesday, May 17, 2016 in Wesley Hall. Al read from Psalms 47 for the Call to Worship.

He also cited II Timothy 4:3,4 which states "they will turn their ears away from the truth and turn aside to myths." Many people claim to have a bit more enlightenment than what the dusty Bible has to say, people claiming to improve on God's words. False teaching can be found in many places, even inside the doors of some churches. We must seek God's Word for the Truth.

Prayers and praises were lifted up followed by a prayer for guidance.

Motion was made by John, seconded by Ron to approve the April Minutes as written.

Anyone who cannot access the *Chimes* digitally is reminded there are some printed copies available on the welcome center. A few are mailed each month to people out of town who want to keep in touch.

The Finance Committee will be in charge of the Building Use policy. A deposit will be required for use of our church which is refundable if everything is left as found. There would be possible charges for use of technology or musical instruments.

The worship service DVDs are now archived in the library and are in a binder on the checkout table along with instructions if you want to check any out. The most recent ones will still be in the office area.

The Mission Team is actively looking into a local possibility. When all is in place this will be shared with the congregation.

Finance recommended that Al Remling become our new church treasurer.

Our church treasurer, Al, will be giving monthly financial updates in the *Chimes*. This will include YTD Budget and YTD Actual and showing any shortfall.

Al, who has been serving as a Church Administrator has asked to be removed from that paid position since he is now serving as our volunteer Treasurer and in other areas. Recommendation approved as presented.

Thanks to Al for all your hard work with our financial program. The person who worked with him to get our accounting in order will be helping to audit the books every three months just to make sure all is progressing as planned.

Finance has reviewed the Church Foundation. They will now be doing the duties as outlined for their responsibility.

Your church library has purchased two new chairs for the room. Please stop by and have a look. We also have some new books on order so watch for them soon. Library cleaning day will be May 18.

Church garden cleanup day has been set for June 5 with a rain date of June 12. Meet at 3:00 or earlier if you like and we will have a light supper at 5:00.

Pastor again summarized the Single Board concept versus the Church Council Board. Questions were answered. We will be voting soon during church service. Anyone unable to attend the meeting on May 15 is welcome to view the printed information that was shared with those there. Stop in the office.

Al is requesting that Trustees work at completing a church inventory. Several rooms have been done but many more need to be done. Anyone is welcome to help with this. Al has inventory forms in his office you can use as a guideline. This is something our insurance company has urged us to do in case of catastrophic loss.

The church is in the process of changing our phone and internet provider. Hopefully this will be completed soon and our internet service will be more reliable.

Meeting was adjourned at 7:45 followed by the Lord's prayer and singing of the doxology.

Next meeting will be June 21 at 6:30 in Wesley Hall.

The more help we have the easier it is and the faster the work gets done. Please bring whatever garden tools you have and gloves.

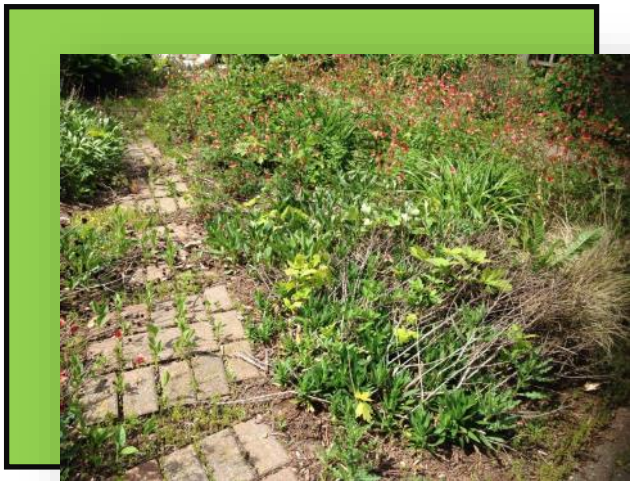
If you are able to dig up a weed or trim a bush, we want you!!

Share the Harvest is a local, seasonal food pantry that concentrates on distributing fruits and vegetables to individuals and families in Delaware County who have limited access to fresh, healthy food. This includes elderly, disabled and people who have limited financial means.

(We do not ask for proof of income.)

We began operation in the summer of 2013 and are looking forward to the start of our 4th season this summer. In the previous three years we have distributed over 26,000 pounds of fresh produce in our community. The produce we distribute comes from two sources – local gardeners who share the surplus from their home gardens and through our membership in the Northeast Iowa Food Bank.

Our mission is to be the Hands and Feet of God in our community. We are guided by the words of Jesus in Matthew 25:40, “That which you do unto the least of these, you do unto me.”

Share the Harvest will operate on Tuesdays this season from June 14 through late September. We are located at “The Watershed” (the kayak rental business) 252 River Street. We will accept produce donations from 4:00 – 5:30 pm and hold the distribution from 6:00 – 7:00 pm.

(First come, first served.)

There are several ways you can support our ministry:

- ~ Donate fresh produce, either from your garden or purchased from the store. If you garden, you might consider planting an extra row or two dedicated to Share the Harvest.
- ~ Volunteer to help on Tuesday afternoons. We promise that if you want to help, there will be a job for you to do that is appropriate for your physical ability and time you have available.
- ~ We always accept monetary donations to defray the cost of supplies.
- ~ Please pray for us as we continue to reach out to people in need in our community.
