A note from Reverend Phil...

Everyone knows the story of Jesus meeting the Samaritan woman at the well. He reveals Himself as the Messiah, and she runs into town proclaiming the grace she has come to know from the Son of God. What few people pay attention to is the scripture that follows along right after this powerful story of God's acceptance and grace.

The Disciples return with food, and though surprised, did not question Jesus about why would He speak to a Samaritan woman but instead they offered Jesus some lunch. Jesus declines the food saying his needs have been satisfied by a source they do not understand. The Disciples wonder if the woman had given him something to eat, but Jesus tells them:

"My food," said Jesus, "is to do the will of him who sent me and to finish his work. Don't you have a saying, 'It's still four months until harvest'? I tell you, open your eyes and look at the fields! They are ripe for harvest." (John 4:34-35)

Jesus' needs have been met by doing God's work. What does this mean, how does it work? It reminds me of a story when I led a mission team to Mississippi after hurricane Katrina in 2006. One of our work teams was working on a roof that was half blown off and covered in tarps. The homeowner was an elderly widow. When the team arrived she advised Mark, our team leader, that she would be making lunch for the team every day they worked there. Mark advised they had packed their own lunches, and the home owner replied; "My roof may leak but my stove still works and this is something I can do!" So the team was treated with a hot lunch and never got their lunches out of the cooler. On the bus ride home, they passed a park where many displaced people from the storm had created something like a shanty town out of boxes and tarps. Mark stopped the bus, and the team ran out and treated those who were truly hurting with a sack lunch. Mark said he could not believe how happy, and hungry these people were. This team worked on this house for three days, and every day they packed a lunch, the home owner made them a meal, and they stopped at the park to share in their good fortune. Except by day two, many of the other teams had thrown their lunches into Marks cooler as well, to be handed out to those in need. Even after that house was done, the bus stopped every day to hand out lunches "left over" from the worksites.

God has a way of meeting our needs when we are obedient in our service to Him. Like loaves and fishes, God took the offering of service and turned into a meal that met the needs of many. "Open your eyes and look at the fields! They are ripe for harvest."

This month we will take 5 days to devote to working on a neighbor's house through an effort called "The House of David." Our service will not be limited to what we accomplish on the work site, but also in prayers for safety, food preparation in the evenings, and also financial support. We will make a life-transforming difference for one of our neighbors, and God will also make a life-transforming change in us as well. Let us take advantage of this opportunity to put as much energy as possible into this blessing from God. Amen!





Mission Project



The last two weeks of July and early August are the **best** time to buy **school supplies**. Look for free after rebate offers from Menards plus deep discounts at retailers like Staples, Office Max, Wal-Mart, Office Depot, etc. Don't forget to order SCRIP cards for these businesses before you do your shopping.

School supplies needed include:

We on the scrip team have had several occasions to learn that people often are not aware of all the options we have. One example: a member recently commented that she buys a lot from amazon.com and Barnes & Noble, and wasn't aware that both of those are available (and they're easy to use)! Another has been buying Fareway and gas cards for local use, but didn't realize she could also get restaurants and stores in nearby cities. So here are some reminders of just some of the gift cards available.

Local eateries. By using MUMC gift cards to dine at these places you help not only our church but also area businesses, so please give them your support! Cards we can get include Burger King, Casey's Pizza, Chuong Garden, Dairy Queen, Fireside, Hardee's, Pin Oak, Pizza Hut, Pizza Ranch, and Subway.

Gas. For local options, we have Kwik Star and Casey's, and we can order BP. At all three of these places your gift card can be used at the pump and you don't even need to go indoors! Just put the card in the same slot that takes credit cards. Some receipts will show the remaining balance; others will just show the amount you spent. It's easy as can be! Of course if you hear the Casey's donuts or the KwikStar cappuccino calling you, you can go inside and use your card to buy those items as well. Anything sold at the convenience store can be purchased with your MUMC gift card - it's not limited to gas.

Did you know that MUMC's scrip program has added an average of \$6100 to the church budget for each of the past four years? Be part of the group that makes that happen - buy gift cards at church!!


