devote more time to volunteering at church, or more time in a small group bible study. These can all be just as edifying as giving up a bad habit, by choosing a new



MUMC Single Board January 16, 2018 Wesley Hall 6:00 p.m.

Chair Mark Reth called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.. Our call to worship was from Psalm 119:105-112 which reminds us that the Bible can be our light to show us the way ahead so we won't stumble as we walk. We need to study the Bible so we can see our way clear to stay on the right path.

Prayers and praises were lifted up followed by a moment of silence and a prayer for guidance from our chair.

<u>Finance:</u> Bruce gave the board the final budget report for 2017. Our actual budgeted amount for 2017 was \$270,073 (including apportionments) however, our actual expenses with apportionments amounted to \$238,174 leaving us with a surplus of \$31,899. Adjustments for certain budget items have been made for 2018 where there was a shortfall in those areas. All bills have been paid.

<u>Trustees:</u> Charlie led us in an extended discussion on the condition of our building and the great need for updating many areas that are showing their age. The subject of security also was discussed with there being so many entrances. We need a general conversation with the congregation as well as the board for a way forward. We need to be in prayer and seek God's guidance.

Worship: Michael Stocks is looking for a new camera for the sanctuary.

<u>Christian Ed.</u> Vacation Bible School is set for July 16-20 and will be added to the calendar. Lenten study materials will come from their budget.

Missions: Our congregation has given approximately \$1600 towards Sydney Litterer's mission work.

<u>Reaching and Receiving:</u> Janine reminded everyone about the bowling party on February 11 from 3-5. There will be information in the February Chimes. Also the men will be serving the pancake breakfast that morning after worship.

<u>Lay Ministry:</u> Bill has organized a leadership team and they will be charting a path forward.

There were no action items reported.

Following pastor comments the meeting was adjourned at 8:15. Our next meeting will be on February 20, 2018, at 6:00 p.m. in Wesley Hall. We closed with the Lord's Prayer and singing of the doxology.

GOD'S GREATEST GIFTS EVER GIVEN TO US

Every gift from God reveals his love, but no gift reveals his love more than the gifts of the cross. These gifts came not wrapped in paper but in passion. They were not placed around a tree but around a cross. They were not covered with ribbons but sprinkled with the blood that Christ shed on our behalf.

In the six-session video Bible study, *He Chose the Nails*, Max Lucado explores the many gifts that Christ provided to us at his crucifixion. These include not only the gift of the cross but also the gift of the thorns that pierced his brow. The nails that tore his flesh. The seamless robe that he removed for us. The empty tomb where he forever defeated sin and death.

The hill of the cross is rich with the gifts of God's grace. These were gifts he didn't have to give. The only required act for our salvation was the shedding of blood, yet God did so much more. So, as we unwrap these gifts, we need to pause and listen for his voice. As we do, perhaps we will hear him whisper, "I did it just for you."

Your MUMC scrip team is pleased to tell everyone that we had a very successful 2017! The year's total sales were \$156,219.90. That's a lot of gift cards! Our total profit for the year was \$5936.60, or about 4% of the total sales. On January 14 the team presented two checks during the worship service. As has been done twice yearly for several years, one was for \$2500 for the general budget. The other was from our Fareway profits, and this check was in the amount of \$1711.35. Fareway stipulates that their profits go to education. This can be children, youth, adults, Sunday School, Vacation Bible School - anything that is educational. So the more Fareway gift cards we sell, the more money goes to our educational programming.

As you can see, a total of \$6711.35 was given for 2017, with our profits for that year being \$5936.60. 2016 was a similar situation – we gave back more than we actually earned. For 2018 we will either have to reduce the amount we turn over to the church – or sell more gift cards. This is up to YOU – the congregation. We welcome new customers!! Just talk to anyone on the scrip team or stop at the table and ask for a paper with info on how our gift card program works – we'll be very happy to help you get started.

Another facet of our program is AOP. This stands for amount of purchase and is a percentage given by several local businesses without the use of physical gift cards. (Participating merchants include Gateway Appliances, Honey Creek Furniture, Corcoran Furniture, Lake Design and Decor, Georgen Auto, Boubin Tire, Edgewood Building Supply, and Schroeder's Cash Supply). The 2017 profits from AOP were \$326.38. When you're purchasing at those places, just tell them you want to use MUMC scrip and they'll take if from there. Most of them have a sign near their checkout saying the participate in our scrip program..

If you haven't yet tried scrip gift cards, please consider it and help your church at the same time. They work like any gift card that you buy at stores. At Fareway and many other places, you simply swipe the card - no checks to write, no cash to mess with, and you don't have to be concerned about your credit card being compromised. Your remaining balance is on your receipt and stays on your card for the next use. It can't get much easier, and with every purchase you help MUMC. If you've been using scrip for groceries and / or gas, please consider branching out. We have cards for many local and area restaurants and stores.

We welcome Terry Larson to our team, and we thank Roger Mueller for his years of service to scrip! Your 2017 - 2018 scrip team is Carol Dighton, Kathy Evarts, Linda Gearhart, Alice Kluesner, Terry Larson, Erin Learn, Chris Mundy, and Vicki Spellerberg.

Scrip is available for purchase every Sunday in the narthex before and after worship as well as Wednesdays before WOW. If you have special needs outside of those times, call Chris Mundy at 920-5865.


