MUMC Single Board February 20, 2018 Wesley Hall 6:00 p.m.

Chair Mark Reth called the meeting to order at 6:05 p.m. Our Call to Worship was from Psalm 111:1-5 reminding us that "great are the works of the Lord", We know that our God is gracious and compassionate and his covenant with His people endures forever. Mark read an excerpt from the Upper Room to reinforce this message.

Prayers and praises were lifted up followed by a moment of silence and a prayer for guidance.

<u>Finance</u> reported that year-to-date actual expenses amounted to \$17,480 (including apportionments) and year-to-date actual income was \$22,050. Giving us a surplus for the month of January.

<u>Trustees</u> reported that the nursery will be getting new carpet soon. The board authorized trustees to contact a local architect to inquire about the cost of services to assess our current and/or future building changes that need to be made. We need a rough estimate of what the cost of those services will entail. Mark offered to help Charlie look into this and knows someone local who could possibly help us.

<u>Christian Ed.</u> The Lenten Bible studies have begun and more study books have been received. A garage sale is scheduled at our church for April 27 & 28 with the proceeds to go toward OCC shoebox postage expenses.

Missions received a request from OCC to have the packing party on November 10 from 9-12 and use of Wesley Hall from Nov. 7-9 for set up for the event. These dates are on the calendar. There will be a brunch on November 3rd after church with the proceeds to go towards OCC shipping. Alice Kluesner will be in charge of Ingathering items and Barry and Sarah Eike will chair our Angel Tree project this year.

Reaching and Receiving celebrated the success of the bowling party and the pancake breakfast served by our young men. They would like to have more breakfasts maybe on a quarterly basis. We will be meeting in March to discuss further activities we could do as a church family such as a game night at the church. March 10 our men will be serving the Men's Lenten breakfast hosted that Saturday by our church.

Congregational Care postponed the Valentine's dinner due to the weather. It will be rescheduled for a later date.

<u>Staff Parish</u> presented their sick leave plan for our staff (non-contracted only) which will include 1 1/2 hours per week worked accruing to 156 hours for personal and family-related health issues and non-payable upon termination. We also approved sub pay of \$10.00/hr for any long term absence.

Pastor presented us with an outreach ministry possibility in our community starting this fall. He will have a proposal for us at our next meeting.

There were no action items reported.

Meeting adjourned at 8:30.

Our next Single Board meeting will be Tuesday, March 20, 2018 in Wesley Hall.

We closed with the Lord's Prayer and singing of the doxology.

GOD'S GREATEST GIFTS EVER GIVEN TO US

Every gift from God reveals his love, but no gift reveals his love more than the gifts of the cross. These gifts came not wrapped in paper but in passion. They were not placed around a tree but around a cross. They were not covered with ribbons but sprinkled with the blood that Christ shed on our behalf.

In the six-session video Bible study, *He Chose the Nails*, Max Lucado explores the many gifts that Christ provided to us at his crucifixion. These include not only the gift of the cross but also the gift of the thorns that pierced his brow. The nails that tore his flesh. The seamless robe that he removed for us. The empty tomb where he forever defeated sin and death.

The hill of the cross is rich with the gifts of God's grace. These were gifts he didn't have to give. The only required act for our salvation was the shedding of blood, yet God did so much more. So, as we unwrap these gifts, we need to pause and listen for his voice. As we do, perhaps we will hear him whisper, "I did it just for you."


