#### A note from Reverend Phil...

Now you are the body of Christ, and each one of you is a part of it. And God has placed in the church first all the apostles, second prophets, third teachers, then miracles, then gifts of healing, of helping, of <u>guidance</u>, and of different kinds of tongues. (1 Corinthians 12:27-28)

In the last two and a half years Manchester United Methodist Church has been the recipients of many blessings. Our worship attendance has increased substantially, our finances greatly improved, and we have been blessed to start many new ministries, small groups, and even a Wednesday night worship. All this while continuing to strengthen our core ministries. That we have been blessed is without argument, but how do we respond to these blessings? We have offered to share in our blessings with other United Methodist Churches through leadership (guidance) in our sphere of influence. The Bishop and Cabinet have given us the opportunity to do so. Now we need to decide if this is the direction God wills for us to live out our ministry in creating Disciples for Jesus Christ. In a nutshell, this is what has been proposed;

That we align ourselves with Delhi UMC and Buck Creek UMC to recreate our culture there. We accomplish this by sharing our pastoral leadership, creating a partnership in ministry, and working together in mission where it make sense, while maintaining our induvial histories and character. I will become lead pastor of all three churches, and we will hire an associate with Delhi/Buck Creek. We will work together to launch a new contemporary worship on Wednesday night to reach out to our whole community. Congregational care will be shared by both pastors. All three churches will share in the cost of the new associate pastor position.

Rev. Bill Poland of the Bishop's Cabinet has called a special Church Conference on Sunday April 15, 2018 at 10:30 AM in our Sanctuary. We will vote at this time if we feel called to respond to a ministry of leadership by aligning Manchester UMC with Delhi UMC and Buck Creek UMC.

This is a time of prayerful discernment, has Jesus opened a new door in ministry in this place and time to make Disciples? If You have any questions please contact myself or any member of our SPRC Team.

MUMC Single Board March 20, 2018 Wesley Hall 6:00 p.m.

**Present:** Janine Stellick, Bruce Nodurft, Charlie Dighton, Randy Waterman, Ruth Voshell, Marge Wolter, Zach Rogers, Pastor Phil, Mark Reth, Al Remling, Jean Gross, Susan Hermann.

Chair Mark Reth called the meeting to order at 6:04 p.m. Our Call to Worship was from John 3:3-6, 14-17. Jesus is teaching Nicodemus about God's kingdom coming to the whole world, not just the Jews and that Nicodemus wouldn't be a part of it unless he was personally born again. The kingdom is personal and its entrance requirements are repentance and spiritual rebirth.

Prayers and praises were lifted up followed by a moment of silence and a prayer for guidance from Mark.

<u>Finance</u> reported that actual income year to date is \$39,664 and actual expenses are \$36,693 (including apportionments) giving us a small surplus for January and February. Bruce will compare the giving to what we had for the same time last year.

Trustees reported that the garage will be taken down by summer if no one is interested in moving it. Trustees also recommended that Demmer Architecture be hired for a building needs proposal which includes many changes to our existing structure to better utilize and update several areas including bathrooms. The expected charges of \$2,500 for this proposal will include a schedule and work plan, design meeting with the building committee, design 2-3 planning options to accomplish the church goals and objectives, prepare construction costs for each design option and prepare colored plans to present to the congregation which will show the design options. The recommendation was unanimously approved by the board.

<u>Christian Ed.</u> reported that help is needed for a church wide garage sale the last weekend in April. Proceeds from this sale will go towards camperships and OCC shipping expenses.

Missions reported that the focus will be Ingathering for April and July.

Congregational Care reported on their activities including Grief Share, the Christmas dinner, health clinics and visits.

#### **Action Items:**

Finance presented their recommendation that \$35,000 be withdrawn from the General Budget and placed in three CD's at F&M Bank at a special rate of 1.7% for 18 months will no penalty for early withdrawl. Two signatures will be required including the Board and Finance Chairs. Interest will be returned to the general fund. The recommendation carried unanimously. Our current interest bearing checking account pays a rate of 0.15% so with the surpluses we have in some general budget areas it was decided to make better use of some of that money until or when it is needed.

Pastor shared about his meetings with our church and the Delhi/Buck Creek churches in regard to staffing needs. Delhi is receptive to what is being presented. Our Conference Representative will need to call Church Conferences at each of these churches and two weeks notice are needed previous to those conferences. Then votes need to be taken before we can proceed with staffing an associate to serve both churches. S/PPRC people from both churches will need to work out many details. This process is moving slower than we had hoped but we are moving forward as quickly as we can.

Pastor briefly shared our assigned reading from *Shift* which focused on membership. We need to shift our focus from number of members to number of people who worship with us and consider us their church home. Many younger people are not into "joining" something but are willing to be a part of a congregation. Commitment is more important than being a member on the rolls.

Meeting adjourned at 7:45 with the Lord's Prayer followed by singing of the Doxology. Our next meeting will be April 17, 2018 in Wesley Hall.

# VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL

The warmer temps have all of us thinking of summer, so let's begin planning Vacation Bible School! This year's theme is *Shipwrecked: Rescued By Jesus!* The kids are in for an adventure filled week, but it won't be possible without YOUR help!

This year's VBS will be July 16-20 from 9:00-11:45 a.m., and we are in need of a co-director, preschool leaders, station leaders, crew leaders, and decoration leaders. Descriptions of these positions are below. If you are interested in helping with any aspect of VBS, please contact Stephanie Stocks at 927-3351 or <a href="mastocks@iowatelecom.net">mstocks@iowatelecom.net</a> or contact the church office.

VBS CO-DIRECTOR: Assist in organizing all aspects of VBS including recruiting and training volunteers, ordering supplies, advertising, collecting registrations, etc. After all, two heads are better than one! (Plus this really is Stephanie's last year as director, so we would like to have someone in place to take over next year.)

**PRESCHOOL TIDE POOL LEADERS** (Adults): Rather than have our 3 & 4-year-olds rotate through the stations with the older kids, they have their own class. We need two or three adults to lead this class. Crew leaders will help organize these kids and assist the leaders.

**STATION LEADERS** (Adults): Students (who are grouped in crews) move through various stations that are staffed by an adult leader and feature a different Bible-learning activity. You are the "teacher" for your station. Crews are at your station for approximately 20 minutes. Stations include:

**Castaway Sing & Play/Sail Away Sendoff:** This energetic individual opens and closes the morning with all the kids in the sanctuary. They introduce the Bible Point and Bible Memory Buddy each day. They help lead the praise songs, discuss God Sightings, and give hints about what the daily Bible story will be. They may use drama experiences and engaging object lessons to help kids apply what they've learned throughout the day.

Bible Discovery: This individual helps the kids experience the daily Bible story in a hands-on way.

**Imagination Station:** This individual leads the kids through science experiments using fun gizmos that connect to the day's Bible story.

**KidVid Cinema:** This individual plays the daily video segment in our theater and helps the kids practice using a Bible by finding and reading each day's key Bible verse. God sightings and the week's mission project are also discussed.

Tropical Treats: This individual prepares and serves the daily snack while reinforcing the daily Bible verse.

**Ship Rec Games:** This enthusiastic individual leads the crews through a variety of games that connect with the daily Bible Point or Bible story. There are always a variety of games for the leader to choose from to best suit the kids at our VBS.

**CREW LEADERS** (HS Students or Adults): These individuals are assigned to a group of approximately 6 kids. They lead their crew through each station assisting the station leaders as needed.

**SONG LEADERS** (MS/HS Students or Adults): These energetic individuals learn the songs and actions and lead the kids in singing during opening and closing.

**DECORATION LEADERS:** Creative individuals with great vision and ingenuity are needed to turn the Narthex and sanctuary into a busy and imaginative workshop.

With approximately 75 kids attending VBS each summer, we need at least 12 crew leaders in addition to at least 6 station leaders and 2-3 preschool teachers to make VBS a success. We also need creative people to help decorate the church, people to man the registration table, assistants for the station leaders, and much more. Please consider how you can use your talents and gifts to benefit the children who attend this year's VBS!
