### A note from Reverend Phil...

And hope does not put us to shame, because God's love has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit, who has been given to us.- Romans 5:5

God has poured His love out upon us, not because of something we have done, not because of who we are, but because of who God is. Love did not begin within the human condition, but is a free gift from God who is the author of love. 1 John 4:19 tells us that we love only because God first loved us.

How we experience this love is through the Holy Spirit, a part of the Triune God which shares this journey of life with us. It is through the vessel of the Holy Spirit that God love is poured into our hearts, to make it

possible for us to love God and neighbor. As United Methodist, it seems that we focus so much more on God and Christ Jesus than we do on the eternal presence of the Holy Spirit anymore. This was not always the case as even in logo of the cross and flame, the flame represents the Holy Spirit. I wonder why our attention has seemed to turn away in the last few decades.

Beginning June 17th we will begin our new preaching series dedicated to our study of the active participation of the Holy Spirit in our biblical past, contemporary present, and humanity's eternal future. This would be a great time to invite your friends, family, and neighbors to join us in worship in a study that is relevant into our daily lives lived together in faith. Like on the day of Pentecost where thousands came to know salvation, but I'm not greedy... Let's shoot for one hundred new faithful! Amen

So Christ himself gave the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the pastors and teachers, to equip his people for works of service, so that the body of Christ may be built up until we all reach unity in the faith and in the knowledge of the Son of God and become mature, attaining to the whole measure of the fullness of Christ.- Ephesians 4:11-13

What did the Apostle Paul mean when he referred to "The Body of Christ?" Paul is speaking of the church. The church has many necessary parts, all important, all need to be accomplished so that the church can be built up and mature, experiencing and knowing Jesus Christ in all of His fullness. And the church is not the building, the church is God's faithful people, both individually and in community. What does this look like for us as a church? We have many moving parts to this machine, some professional like clergy and administration, but the vast majority of this machine is laity volunteers which is how it should be. Clothing Pantry, InGathering, Prayer Shawls and Crosses, 2nd Helpings, Raised Gardens, Finance, Worship Team, Set Design, Liturgists and others who participate in worship leadership, Missions, Education, VBS, Script, Choir, and so many more. But is this all? Have we covered enough bases that we have obtained our full measure?

In the past this church has had several Lay Speakers, and some are still involved with sharing the gospel at Good Neighbor Home and other places. We could still use more though, as we explore possibilities of future ministry within the church. There is also a relatively new place to serve which is called Local Lay Minister. This involves a greater commitment with three years of training. Local Lay Ministers serve in many different places based upon their gifts. Our own Dave Gaskill is in his second year of training and we already actively use him in our congregational care visit ministry. This was an area where Pastor was getting pulled very thin, but with Dave's help, has become one of our stronger ministries of the church in pastoral care and prayer. Dave has a heart for people and prayer, and also a counseling background. That coupled with his training has made Dave a wonderful addition to strengthen and support our congregational care ministry. As our church ministries grow, we will have an even greater need for servants willing to make this commitment for the cause of Christ in our community. I urge all to consider if their call in ministry might include a call for pastoral support in Lay Speaking or Lay Minister. This is what the church looks like when we are being "Churchy!"

Temporary Chair Al Remling called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. Our Call to Worship was from Proverbs 16:1-3 in which we are reminded that our motives for doing something are weighed by the Lord and we need to commit to the Lord whatever we do. He will establish our plans because He works out everything according to His will. God is infinite but we are finite. Finance: Year-to-date actual expenses are \$75,626 and YTD actual income is \$81,477.

**Trustees:** The building committee met with the architect and two proposals are being studied at this time. They are looking for feedback on cost estimates of these proposals.

**Worship:** We now have a new camera as well as a recorder. The recorder will have YouTube capabilities. This equipment is waiting for installment. The cables in the sanctuary will be enclosed soon.

**Christian Ed:** Sunday School is winding down for the summer and VBS registrations will be available on the welcome center as well as on-line.

**Missions:** The missions team is looking for someone to chair and co-chair the ice cream social. A date needs to be finalized. The garden boxes will be returned soon to the new parking area.

**Reaching and Receiving:** Janine shared some ideas from the book *Becoming a Welcoming Church* by Thom S. Rainer. Several of those ideas are being looked at more closely for our congregation to put into practice. We need someone willing to chair a float for the fair parade. This will be referred to our Lay Leaders.

**Staff Parish:** Staff Parish has a team of various aged volunteers looking into a Youth Director Position which would be a lay person and not clergy. The confidentiality form has been signed by all members of S/PPRC. Mike Wade will soon be assuming the chairmanship of this team.

**Action Item:** The recommendation from Missions to have our Ice Cream Social on Wednesday, August 1st was approved unanimously and will be added to the church calendar.

Pastor Phil shared comments from the book Shift we have been studying as a board. His focus was on Membership to Discipleship.

Our next meeting will be Tuesday, June 19, at 6:00 p.m. in Wesley Hall.

Meeting was adjourned at 7:30 and closed with the Lord's Prayer and the Doxology.



Pray for the health and safety of all our students and volunteers.


Pray that kids' hearts and minds will be opened to God's love and power in their lives as they learn Jesus is always there to rescue them.
