# A note from Reverend Phil...

# For lack of guidance a nation falls, but victory is won through many advisers. -Proverbs 11:14

This Proverbs scripture is referring to leadership. Without leadership, the goals and visions of any organization are folly. The best leadership is when it is accomplished through many, rather than just one. Many minds, many outlooks, create many opportunities, and the best one may be chosen. Why is this so important? Because we have been gifted and called to provide the leadership for proclaiming the gospel in this unique place and time. But what does this mean? A definition of leadership:

According to the idea of transformational **leadership**, an effective leader is a person who does the following: Creates an inspiring vision of the future. Motivates and inspires people to engage with that vision. ... Coaches and builds a team, so that it is more effective at achieving the vision.

According to this definition, this church has a history of leadership. From the Clothing Pantry to Second Helpings and the Food Pantry this church has served in leadership to transform our community into caring for those in need before. Now we have entered into a time where we are again called to provide leadership to transform our community into an even greater community caring for those in need.

We are called into leadership around the "Hub Ministry" now also known as "The Circuit." Even though we did not get the start we hoped last May, it is still in the works and could well come to fruition by May next year. This is a deliberate connection of churches through clergy to work together for excellence in worship and congregational care. Pastors will work together in support, encouragement, and accountability in accomplishing the ministries we are called to, and it will deliberately connect our Lay Leadership to begin meeting to share ministry ideas and efforts together. This ministry is something that the conference is fully behind and are very excited about. Manchester has been selected to provide the leadership as the first "Hub" church, to work out the process that will be duplicated in rural churches throughout the conference.

We are called into trying a new and unique way of building a place or worship and connection with people who feel the church is beyond them due to social or economic issues. We are opening the "West Side Gathering" to enter into their neighborhoods to proclaim that we are so excited to be in a Christian fellowship that we are prepared to go to them. This will begin on September 9th. If you feel called to be a part of this ministry get with Pastor Phil of Dave Gaskill. We have also been called to provide leadership in a new ministry called "Rahab's House." This is a ministry that will move families trapped in poverty from surviving to thriving within two years. This will be done by providing housing and utilities at an affordable level for these families while they get the education and job training necessary. It will also be supported by accountability groups who will support life, family, and faith decisions. This ministry is completely unique, but upon proving it's viability will be reproducible in churches throughout our conference and in fact throughout the UMC connection. All that is required is for someone to accept the risk of being first. We have been blessed with a pledge large enough to get this ministry off the ground. We have been assured by many other churches in the area that should we build it, they will help to financially support and manage it. The city of Manchester is even involved in helping to locate the property for it. This is the kind of transformational ministry that we are called to, and this is our opportunity to help change the face of ministry in this generation here, maybe there, perhaps everywhere. How amazing that we are blessed with this ministry of leadership in our time and from this wonderful place of Manchester United Methodist Church.

On July 21st Manchester UMC joined eight other church teams to form the first ever East Central District/North East District mission team. 84 persons from 9 churches traveled to La Grange, Texas to work for those who were hurt by Hurricane Harvey. The temperatures were hot, the humidity was high, but we accomplished much for the glory of Jesus Christ. We had 8 work teams that roofed, drywalled, built decks, water pump sheds, and mold abatement. Every night we closed in worship around the theme of "Revival." On Sunday August 5th our team members from MUMC will provide the leadership for worship and share their experiences from the trip. We invite all to attend and share all that Jesus accomplish with and through these team members.

The committee was excited about the vision so we again took the plan to Single Board where they gave us their blessing to continue.

In the next month or so, we will invite the architect to share this vision with the congregation to give you a chance for input as we move forward. We will then start a capital campaign to move someday closer to today. This is a very exciting time for our church. We look forward to hearing your ideas and concerns as we move forward together.

Mark Reth called the meeting to order at 6:08 p.m. Al Remling led the group in a period of meditation using the VBS theme of "Ship Wrecked—Jesus Rescues." Prayers and praises were raised along with a moment of silence in order to receive the Holy Spirit. Al read the Covenant Prayer in the Wesleyan Tradition.

Bruce, finance, reported year-to-date income through June of \$121,362 compared to budget of \$136,523. Contributions are approximately \$15,000 less this year compared to the same period in 2017.

Charlie, trustee reported that the carpet for the nursery was estimated to be \$1514.05 and will paid in trustees.

Ruth, worship, reported the video will move allowing more seating in the pews. She requested more help on the tech team. Jim Hopkins will be contacted.

Marge, education, reported that approximated 80 children are enrolled in VBS.

Zach, missions, said that 90 people from the combined Northeast and East Central districts will leave on Saturday on their mission to Texas.

Janine, reaching & receiving, are preparing a large sign on the South side of the building and a better sign on the North. The are making decals to put on windows and magnetic cards to invite people to worship.

Mike, SPRC, will be meeting next week to complete job descriptions and contracts. Glynn Nystel is planning to retire, leaving a vacancy on the Janitorial staff. Mike and Bill Scanlan will finish the "New set of eyes" report for conference.

Bill, lay ministry had nothing to report.

Charlie Dighton moved that the Single Board, by recommendation of the building committee recommend the building project be presented to the general congregation for open discussion. Bill Scanlan seconded. Following discussion, the motion was passed unanimously. Charlie Dighton moved that the Single Board, by recommendation of the building committee present the design which has been approved by the single board, to the congregation for further discussion. Mike Ward seconded. After discussion of the design submitted by the architect which shows reconstruction of the Eastern (older) part of the building, the motion was passed unanimously.

Zach Rogers moved that the Single Board recommend to present the "transitional housing" vision to determine if the congregation is willing to continue to be pursued as a viable ministry. Charlie Dighton seconded. After discussion, the motion passed unanimously.

Mike Wade moved that SPRC requested to remove the previously approved pastoral assistant search for youth leadership. Charlie Dighton seconded. After discussion, the motion passed with two abstentions.

Pastor Rogers requested that individuals on the board review pages 70-73 from the book, "Shift", for the next meeting. The next meeting will be 6:00 p.m., August 21, 2018, in Wesley Hall.

The meeting was closed at 8:55 p.m., with the Lord's Prayer and singing the doxology.



# IAUMC Disaster Response Update

Beginning June 7, 2018 the state of lowa has seen unprecedented rain, flash-flooding and tornado activity.

Here are the latest updates:

Northwest Iowa, Rock Valley: A significant part of the community was flooded in early June, they are on the road to recovery. Your prayers are very much appreciated.

**North Central Iowa:** Many communities in Kossuth, Hancock and Cerro Gordo counties experienced heavy rain and flash-flooding. As many as 300 homes and many businesses were affected.

Central lowa: In early July, more than 10 inches of rain fell in a very short amount of time, causing extreme flash-flooding in Urbandale, Ankeny and the Greater Des Moines Area. This resulted in more than 3000 homes flooded and many businesses including several UMC churches and at least one parsonage. Recovery efforts are still underway and volunteers are invited. Volunteers wishing to help with flood recovery should register with the United Way at unitedwaydm.org. Please be prepared to make your own housing arrangements outside of the community. At this time we have not set up volunteer housing and all available space is housing residents. Please contact a neighboring UMC Church and arrange for your own housing.

Central lowa, South Central lowa and Southeast lowa: On July 19, 2018, a record-breaking 27 confirmed tornadoes raced across Central, South Central and Southeast Iowa. The communities of Bondurant, Marshalltown, Pella, Keosauqua, Farmington and many small communities along the path of the storm had damage. Damaged buildings include several churches and a pastor's private home. The most significant damage is in the communities of Marshalltown and Bondurant. Recovery efforts are underway, and volunteers are invited and needed.






