Chairman Mark Reth called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. Our Call to Worship was from 1 Chronicles 16:8-14. These passages remind us to praise God continually and we will find that we won't take his blessings for granted. God has a plan. The Israelites fit into God's plan and we today do the same. We need to prayerfully and thankfully seek His will for our lives.

Prayers and praises were lifted up followed by a moment of silence and a prayer for guidance from Al.

**Finance:** Bruce gave the financial report through July of this year. Our actual expenses for that time period were \$132,902 and actual income was \$147, 105. We have some large insurance bills that will need to be paid soon.

**Trustees:** Sam Milroy has installed new carpet in the nursery. We will be getting an upgraded defibrillator for the church. A grant has been applied for to help with the purchase of it. We have two new fire extinguishers.

Charlie wanted to clarify that the Rahab House proposal is a community wide mission proposal and if implemented will be solely supported financially by donations from our community including any individuals from our church who wish to support it. The proposed building upgrades as mentioned in the **August Chimes** will be the responsibility of our church family. It was the consensus of those board members present that we should focus on our building needs as a priority at this time.

Worship: The new video camera is in and working well. Tech upgrades continue to be implemented.

**Christian Ed:** 70 Children attended our Vacation Bible School. Sunday School will be back in full swing on September 9 and Bibles will be handed out to our 3rd graders at that time. 7th and 8th graders will be starting confirmation classes. For 7th graders it will be a two year class and 8th graders will be confirmed in May 2019. We are looking forward to a busy and active year.

**Reaching & Receiving:** The new outside banner is up facing the south parking lot. We will have a Family Fun Day at Sherman's Pumpkin Patch on Sunday September 30 starting at 3:00 p.m. *Janine announced this is her last year to find greeters for our church. Anyone interested in doing this beginning next year should contact the office. It doesn't take much time and you get to visit with our church family in the process.* 

Staff Parish: Glen Nystel is retiring as our janitor at the end of August. We are looking at a possible replacement for him.

#### **Action Items:**

Motion by Ruth, seconded by Janine that due to the closeness of the September 30th Fun Day event already planned the Labor Day Event is not supported by Single Board. Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Charlie, seconded by Ruth that due to Pastor Phil's health and the needed time for preparation Single Board recommends to re-evaluate the start date of WOW. The recommendation carried unanimously.

November 11 from 2:00 to 5:00 is Charge Conference at Waterloo. Our budget for next year needs to be completed before that date and brought to the board.

Meeting adjourned with the Lord's Prayer at 8:00 p.m.




























# Disciple Emblem

James the Less was a brother of Jesus. While one does not hear much about him because of his retiring nature, it is known that he preached around Jerusalem, until he was stoned and his body was sawn asunder, hence the stones and saw upon his emblem.

Peter's emblem shows two crossed keys, symbolizing the confession of faith upon which the Church is

founded: "You are the true Christ, the Son of the living God." (Matthew 16:16). Whoever possess this same faith that Peter voiced so clearly and firmly has the keys to enter into the Kingdom of God. The inverted cross symbolizes how, at his crucifixion, Peter requested that his head might be where his Master's feet were nailed to the cross.

The emblem for Matthew, the former tax collector, shows three purses recalling his former manner of livelihood. The battle ax by which he was killed is also represented.

The basket in Philip's emblem refers to the feeding of the multitude about which he was much concerned. The Tau cross and the spear indicate the manner in which he surrendered his life for Him Who is the Bread of Life.

The emblem of Thomas includes a carpenter's square. Tradition recounts how he erected a church in India while carrying on his ministry there. The rocks, arrows, and spear which are also shown tell the story of a painful but brave death.

Andrew brought his brother Peter to Jesus. The fish reveal that he transformed his occupation as fisherman to the larger calling as fisher of men. The cross saltire, now familiarly known as St. Andrew's Cross, is

traditionally the form of the cross upon which he was crucified after preaching the gospel in Greece.

Matthias was chosen by the apostles to take the place of Judas the traitor. Matthias was well-versed in the scriptures, depicted by a Bible in his emblem. After dauntless work as a missionary in Judea, he was beheaded with a scimitar, also shown on the emblem.

The Bible and a flaying knife are signs for Bartholomew. He had firm faith in the Word of God, which he preached freely. He met his martyrdom by being flayed alive.

James the Greater walked much in his preaching and teaching. The stalt, evident on his emblem, was used in his pilgrimages. The scallop shell that may be seen was a simple dish with many uses. King Herod had James put to death with a sword, which appears as crossing the staff. James was so active and so courageous that even at his death, his accuser became a Christian.

A ship with a cross on the sails pictures heroic Jude on missionary expeditions accompanied by his friend Simon. Jude is sometimes known as Thadaeus or Lebaeus

Simon the Zealot was the inspiring companion of Jude. Both were martyred in Persia on a missionary

journey. A relentless fisher of men through the power of the Gospel, Simon is symbolized by a fish on a Bible.

Legend has it that an attempt was made on John's life by placing poison in his chalice. Actually, he was the only one of the twelve to attain a ripe old age and die a natural death. He is known as the beloved disciple who was close to Jesus and who cared for Jesus' mother, Mary.

Parenting is hard work. Being a pre/teen is hard work. Strengthening Families 10-14 is a communication and relationship enhancing program for all families with youth ages 10 to 14. The program, developed by Iowa State, includes parents and children and will help them to learn ways to increase resistance to negative peer pressure, improve teen behavior, social skills, and school performance. Parents work on ways to show love while setting limits. The program meets for six weeks for two hour sessions working with trained facilitator. It is free and a light meal is provided.
