A note from Reverend Phil...

35 "Be dressed ready for service and keep your lamps burning, 36 like servants waiting for their master to return from a wedding banquet, so that when he comes and knocks they can immediately open the door for him. 37 It will be good for those servants whose master finds them watching when he comes. Truly I tell you, he will dress himself to serve, will have them recline at the table and will come and wait on them.

(Luke 12:35-37)

Where did the rest of this year go? I am writing this just before Halloween, you will read it just before Thanksgiving, and I am writing about Christmas? But as Christians Christmas is not a single day event... We have the time of Advent which is where we prepare our hearts and minds for the eternal significance of the Holy Nativity. God incarnate is born into this world as a humble and helpless babe. This babe goes on in a relatively short life to change the world and bring hope to all of humanity. All that is required for the Holy Transaction is now on earth, every day rolling closer to the moment of the fulfillment. In death we know redeeming, in resurrection Hope eternally assured.

The Luke scripture quotes Jesus as he tells us of the parable of "Watchfulness." We are the servants that are to keep our master's (Jesus) light burning so that when He comes (not if) we are ready to open the door to Him (grace). And then the Master will serve the servant. (sacrifice for salvation). Every year we enter into Advent as a time of waiting and preparation for the presence of the Master... delivered unto us in a manger in Bethlehem over 2000 years ago. In our observance and preparation we are being lightkeepers for Jesus promised return yet to come!

This year we are going to do another all church study like we did last year for Lent leading up to Easter. Once again we will do a group study around a Max Lucado book this time titled "Because of Bethlehem." All are invited to participate, and we will once again be signing up small groups at different times and locations as we prepare our hearts and minds for His anticipated arrival. Clipboards will be in the Narthex starting November 4, with the first

sermon of the series

beginning November 25th. Whether we are starting new groups, re-gathering Lenten groups, or going with our

current groups, my hope is that we all enter into this time of preparation together. Lord, create in us to be lightkeepers in this place and time, prepared to receive you when you draw near. Amen

I Love Christmas

A remarkable gift in an unremarkable package.

Let the sleigh bells ring. Let the carolers sing. The more mistletoe the merrier. The more trees the better.

I love Christmas. I love it because somewhere someone will ask the Christmas questions: What's the big deal about the baby in the manger? Who was he? What does his birth have to do with me?

With a four week Advent study that we will begin the week of November 25 we explore how the One who made everything chose to make himself nothing for us. He experienced hunger and thirst. He went through the stages of human development. He was taught to walk, stand, and wash his face. He was completely and genuinely human.

We'll have an opportunity to find answers. Like this one: *God knows what it's like to be a human*. When we talk to him about deadlines or long lines or tough times, he understands. He's been there. He's been *here*. Because of Bethlehem, we have a friend in heaven.

And this one: *Christmas begins what Easter celebrates*. The child in the manger became the King on the cross. Because of Bethlehem, we have a Savior in heaven.


This remarkable gift arrived in an unremarkable package. One in Bethlehem more than 2000 years ago. No one expected God to come the way he did. Yet the way he came was every bit as important as the coming itself. The manger is the message.

The Because of Bethlehem Study includes video discussion questions, Bible exploration, and

personal study and reflection materials for in-between sessions. All of these are similar to the study that we participated in earlier this year during Lent. The DVD and study guides will again be available.

MUMC Single Board October 16, 2018 6:00 p.m. Wesley Hall

Single Board was called to order by Al Remling at 6:00p.m. We opened with singing of the song "Standing in the Need of Prayer". It was followed by a meditation on James 5:16 "When a believing person prays great thing happen." We all are confronted with crises in our lives and the first step in any situation is turning to God in prayer. He wants to hear from us His children.

Prayers and praises were lifted up followed by a moment of silence and prayer from Mark Reth, chairperson.

Team Reports

Finance reported that year to date actual expenses through September were \$170,092 and year to date actual income was \$184,514. Everyone received a preliminary copy of the projected budget for 2019. The board will give final approval at the November meeting.

Trustees reported that the new defibrillator has been installed and paid for. We are anticipating grant monies will cover some or all of the cost. Only **cardboard** can be recycled in the one church dumpster with everything else going into the other dumpster for now. The building renovation presentation went well with approximately 50 people attending the informational meeting and walk-through after church on October 14.

Education would like to see some improvements to their classrooms on the upper level of the east wing. Storage cabinets and room painting was suggested as a start. The education team needs to meet with Trustees to discuss ideas.

Reaching and Receiving is in the process of ordering more mugs for visitors.

Staff Parish: Mike shared about the interview for a Youth Coordinator. Zach Rogers was the only applicant. He has many years of experience in a youth program and would bring energy to our youth program. This position would entail about 50 hours a month at a salary of \$500/mo. This money is already in our budget so will not entail an increase. He will be on a six month contract with an evaluation after that period of time. An updated job description was shared with the board.

There were no action items presented.

Zach Rogers said he is stepping down from chairperson of Missions due to his new responsibilities.

Pastor Phil shared thoughts from our study book *Shift* which focused on the theology of discipleship and moving from membership into discipleship. A disciple is a follower of Jesus Christ which includes: 1) being a part of the body of Christ; 2) becoming more like Jesus; and 3) joining Jesus in ministry. Our church family is part of Jesus' flock, the 99, but we are to be a disciple to the one who is not.

November 11 will be charge conference and our next regular meeting is November 20 at 6:00 p.m. in Wesley Hall.

We adjourned the meeting at 6:00 p.m. with the Lord's Prayer and singing of the Doxology.

Operation Christmas Child is a worldwide children's project of Samaritan's Purse that uses simple gift-filled shoeboxes containing school supplies, toys, hygiene items and notes of encouragement to let hurting children know God loves them and they are not forgotten.

Operation Christmas Child Shoebox Tips

Please use one of the red and green GO boxes or a regular size cardboard shoebox.

They are a standard size that packs easily into the shipping cartons at the relay center. While plastic boxes seem practical, many times they break and end up in the "shoebox hospital" at the processing center.

Boy or Girl

Determine the gender and age category: 2-4 years, 5-9 years, or 10-14 years. Attach the appropriate label (from the OCC pamphlet) on the box lid. Once the box is full, put a rubber-band around the box.

Gifts

Please focus on the practical! This one box will be shared with all members of the child's home, neighbors, friends, etc. The one washcloth you include may be used by 10 people living with the child! The simple items you take for granted each day could make all the difference in this child's life! Below are some ideas to get you started.

Non-liquid Hygiene items (These items will be shared by everyone living with the child. That could be 10-20 people!)

- -Toothbrush
- -Mild bar soap (leave in packaging & put in a plastic baggie; Ivory is a great choice because it floats)
- -Comb
- -Washcloth
- -Stick deodorant
- -Non-liquid lip balm
- -Adhesive bandages
- -Nail clippers & file

School Supplies (The school supplies you send could mean the difference in whether or not the child gets to attend school.)

- -Pens
- -Pencils (sharpen beforehand if possible) & sharpener
- -Crayons or markers
- -Paper (Steno notebooks fit well in shoeboxes)
- -Solar calculator
- -Coloring or picture books
- -Glue sticks

Clothing/Accessories

- -Shirts (plain colors)
- -Pants
- -Shorts
- -Shoes
- -Socks
- -Underwear
- -Hats/mittens
- -Hair bows
- -Jewelry

Other

- -Flashlights & batteries (This could be lifesaving for children escaping war or domestic violence)
- -Sunglasses
- -Tools (no saws or pocketknives)
- -Duct tape
- -Sewing kit/fabric
- -Cups, bowls, empty water bottle
- -Fishing kit

Toys/WOW item (Focus on the practical but still include a few fun items)

- -Balls (even a deflated soccer ball with a hand pump)
- -Slinky
- -Stuffed animal
- -Small cars
- -Yo-yos
- -Jump ropes
- -Harmonicas -Puzzles
- -Binoculars

DO NOT INCLUDE:

- -Used/damaged items
- -War-related items (toy guns, knives, military figures, or any action figure holding a weapon)
- -Candy, chocolate or any type of food (could melt or spoil)
- -Toothpaste
- -Liquids/lotions (containers can break ruining other items in the box)
- -Medications/vitamins
- -Breakable items (snow globes, glass containers, etc.)
- -Aerosol cans


