1 How good and pleasant it is when God's people live together in unity! 2 It is like precious oil poured on the head, running down on the beard, running down on Aaron's beard, down on the collar of his robe. 3 It is as if the dew of Hermon were falling on Mount Zion. For there the Lord bestows his blessing, even life forevermore. ~Psalm 133

How often do we refer to our church as "our family?" I know I do it consistently every Sunday as we prepare to pray for our joys and concerns. We do this because many times our actual family are there in the congregation. Parents, grandparents, aunts, uncles, cousins, whatever are literally there with you. But also so many others that the only connection we might have is our church. But this connection is so intimate and deep, we are a family together. And since we are like family, we need to act like a family together.

Every year in October we begin the work to prepare a budget for our church so that we can do the work of discipleship in this unique time, in this unique place, as God's unique people. Our church budget is then approved by a charge conference for the next calendar year. Some organizations build their budgets based on what they want, and then pass down the expense to those who will fund their wants... Governments often work this way. But in a family everyone sits down together to see what they can contribute, and then limit their budget to that which they are capable of accomplishing. A family must "live within its means."

Most churches accomplish this with a "Stewardship Drive" most often through means of outside support and or curriculum which is costly and can feel burdensome or even high pressured or manipulating to many. I know that I promised myself that if I was ever the lead pastor I was not going to do it this way. Here at Manchester UMC we have a different approach.

In the expectation of adults behaving as adults, we accomplish our goals through an "Estimate of Generosity." We will hand out the "Estimate of Generosity" cards in service on October 14, 2018. We ask that you prayerfully consider How God has blessed you in your life, and how is God calling you to respond by sharing this blessing with the church to work towards our Kingdom vision within our community. There is a place for your name, but that is only so we can check it off our roster, the pledge number is recorded without a name, and cards are destroyed when we are finished... the amount of your pledge is between you and Our Savior... We just need to have a final number that we will work with to pay the bills, maintain the building, meet payroll, and live into our Kingdom Vision of making Disciples for Jesus Christ. We ask that every family fill out an "Estimate of Generosity," even if it will be the same as the previous year. It is important that we all participate in this to insure accuracy as well as Kingdom commitment. Single Board was called to order by Al Remling at 6:00 p.m. Our Call to Worship was from Ephesians 1:13 which focuses on the Holy Spirit which God puts as His special ownership on us. #### **Team Reports**

**Finance** reported that year to date actual expenses through August were \$152,482 and year to date actual income was \$162,804.

**Trustees** reported that a new defibrillator will be purchased for the church. Much of the expense for this should be available through a grant. There will be an energy audit performed of our building soon. They are looking at a change in our church/parsonage insurance coverage that more closely matches the actual value of our property. There will be a presentation of the building remodel possibilities after church on **October 14**.

**Christian Ed.** reported that the third graders were presented with Bibles at the September 16th service. We are in need of a VBS coordinator for next year. Please notify the church if you are interested or would like to help make this a continued success.

**Reaching and Receiving** reminded everyone of the Fun Day planned at Sherman's pumpkin patch on Sunday September 30 from 3-6 p.m. Anyone who would like to help us with bingo at the GNH once a month is asked to let Janine Stellick know. We will be hosting the GNH birthday party for October. A cake has been ordered and we have someone for entertainment.

**Staff Parish** will be meeting this Thursday at 6:30 in the library. We will be discussing staff reviews, janitorial options and staff raises for next year. Mike shared a Safe Sanctuary Policy that we will be considering with a few minor revisions.

#### Action Items

Recommendation from Finance to fund 2019 apportionments for a total of \$35,882. Recommendation approved unanimously.

Recommendation from Finance to fund Youth for Christ for 2019 at \$300/mo. level plus allowing them continued office space in our building. Recommendation carried with one nay vote.

Budget numbers are needed to set the 2019 budget. Those with budgeted items need to look closely at their current numbers so we can have a more realistic budget figure for next year. Some budgeted amounts have not been spent to date. It is hoped to have some definite figures available before charge conference in November.

Our next meeting will be Tuesday, October 16, 2018 at 6:00 p.m. in Wesley Hall.

Meeting adjourned at 8:00 p.m. with the Lord's Prayer and singing of the Doxology.

### **Operation Christmas Child Shoebox Tips**

#### Please use one of the red and green GO boxes or a regular size cardboard shoebox.

They are a standard size that packs easily into the shipping cartons at the relay center. While plastic boxes seem practical, many times they break and end up in the "shoebox hospital" at the processing center.

#### Boy or Girl

Determine the gender and age category: 2-4 years, 5-9 years, or 10-14 years. Attach the appropriate label (from the OCC pamphlet) on the box lid. Once the box is full, put a rubber-band around the box.

#### Gifts

*Please focus on the practical!* This one box will be shared with all members of the child's home, neighbors, friends, etc. The one washcloth you include may be used by 10 people living with the child! The simple items you take for granted each day could make all the difference in this child's life! Below are some ideas to get you started.

#### Other Non-liquid Hygiene items (These items will be shared by -Flashlights & batteries (This could be lifesaving for everyone living with the child. That could be 10-20 people!) children escaping war or domestic violence) -Toothbrush -Sunglasses -Mild bar soap (leave in packaging & put in a plastic -Tools (no saws or pocketknives) baggie; Ivory is a great choice because it floats) -Duct tape -Comb -Sewing kit/fabric -Washcloth -Cups, bowls, empty water bottle -Stick deodorant -Fishing kit -Non-liquid lip balm Toys/WOW item (Focus on the practical but still include a few -Adhesive bandages fun items) -Nail clippers & file -Balls (even a deflated soccer ball with a hand pump) School Supplies (The school supplies you send could mean the -Slinky difference in whether or not the child gets to attend school.) -Stuffed animal -Pens -Small cars -Pencils (sharpen beforehand if possible) & sharpener -Yo-yos -Cravons or markers -Jump ropes -Paper (Steno notebooks fit well in shoeboxes) -Harmonicas -Solar calculator -Puzzles -Coloring or picture books -Binoculars -Glue sticks **DO NOT INCLUDE: Clothing/Accessories** -Used/damaged items -Shirts (plain colors) -War-related items (toy guns, knives, military figures, or -Pants any action figure holding a weapon) -Shorts -Candy, chocolate or any type of food (could melt or spoil) -Shoes -Toothpaste -Socks -Liquids/lotions (containers can break ruining other items -Underwear in the box) -Hats/mittens -Medications/vitamins -Hair bows -Breakable items (snow globes, glass containers, etc.) -Jewelry -Aerosol cans
