Single Board was called to order by chairperson Mark Reth at 6:00 p.m. Mark shared with us a responsive reading from 2 Peter 1:1-2 and Romans 1:17. He reminded us that the righteousness of God is revealed in the gospel. "The righteous will live by faith." Living by faith can be synonymous with trust, confidence, conviction, hope and expectation among others. The life and example Jesus showed us inspires us as followers of him to live by faith.

Prayers and praises were lifted up followed by a moment of silence and a word of prayer from Mark.

#### **Team Reports**

**Finance:** Bruce gave us the October Finance Report which shows that Y-T-D expenses with apportionments were \$190,250 and Y-T -D actual income was \$205,092.

**Trustees:** Charlie said that a date and time needs to be set with our District Superintendent to have a Church Conference and vote on the proposed remodel/updates to our building. He has had positive feedback on this proposal. Church approval will be only the first step in the process.

**Christian Ed:** Marge reported that the elementary Sunday School teachers would like some new curtains for the art room as well as some winterizing of the windows in that room. The flooring is in need of replacement also. There was discussion of better ways to utilize the area where the theater room presently is located. Ideas were discussed with no decisions being made.

**Missions:** Zach mentioned that the Eike's are in charge of the Angel Tree project this year. Operation Christmas Child just finished their collections and set a record for the number of shoeboxes sent from our church and the area.

**Reaching and Receiving:** Janine will be looking at a date for a family fun night at the Rec. Center in January or February. She reminded us of the new shirts with the church logo are available for order online or through the office. Samples are available.

**Staff Parish:** Mike said that the evaluations of Kat and Dennis will be done in the near future. Trustees will be included in Dennis' evaluation.

**Youth Ministry:** Zach reported that about 10 youth are coming on Wednesday nights with about three students on Sundays. Becca Hermann is helping when she can on Sundays.

#### Action Item:

Bruce brought forward the 2019 budget and explained the budgeting process in detail for next year. Pledges came in at an amount almost equal to the proposed budget.

Charlie Dighton motioned that the 2019 budget be accepted as presented by Finance. Motion unanimously approved as presented.

Single Board will meet on December 18, 2018 in Wesley Hall at 6:04 p.m.

Meeting adjourned at 8:00 p.m.



### Our Community Garden

Zach Rogers had a mission idea of giving away produce from a vegetable garden. The "seed" was planted at last years Charge Conference. The Conference decided to award a grant to our church for materials, soil, compost, seed and plants to begin our garden. We used a different method of gardening called "Square Foot" gardening which allows us to grow more produce in less space. The lumber was purchased, boxes were built on pallets (so we could move our garden) and a nutrient-rich mix of soil was created to support growth of more food in a smaller space. The special mix was designed also for easy weeding. Our Mission Garden has two objectives:

1. To provide fresh veggies and flavorful herbs for our Second Helpings Ministry on Monday evenings at the church.

This intense gardening effort, plus the prayer that Phil blessed our garden with, helped feed the hungry, at Second Helpings, with a bountiful harvest, and wonderful new friendships. Also, while we tended the garden, many a friendly conversation happened over the beets, green beans, tomatoes, peppers and onions! A garden is a good place to interact with folks passing by....to speak about the Lords love for all and His generous abundance to us. Many prayers were requested by our new friends, and all left the garden with fresh flavorful produce for their family.

2. The second objective of our garden was to provide our congregation and the community with fresh veggies and herbs for healthy cooking.

So many enjoyed helping out in different ways to make our garden a success....and we were so glad to see several people walk through the garden for pleasure and for some fresh veg on Sundays after church service. That's what our church family is for...supporting each other!

Our beautiful garden grew day and night and so did relationships of the families and folks that stopped by. We also had community members donate their extra produce and placed it on our Garden table to share with others. Most of the food that we put on the Garden Giveaway Table was gone when we returned....very little went to waste.


