A note from Reverend Phil...

As water reflects the face, so one's life reflects the heart. (Proverbs 27:19)

By my estimation we worshipped around 275(ish) on Christmas Eve this year. That is just a little more than 5% of the population of Manchester... That's really pretty impressive! Just from this church alone, Five percent of the population gathered in worship to celebrate the birth of the Christ Child. All heard the story of a girl, a boy, and a Child in a manger called Emmanuel (God with us) and His name is Jesus (God saves us.) In our town there are many other churches, a couple with greater attendance, some with less. By my count I think there are at least eight other churches in town... I think it is fair to say that all of us together in worship would probably total approximately 40% of the population. Think about that, almost half of the population of Manchester worshipped the Birth of our Savior on Christmas Eve. Is Christ not glorified by this?

But then this makes the reverse also true... About 60% of our community did not worship the birth of our Savior Jesus Christ on Christmas Eve. Sure, some traveled out of town to be with family, some are not able to attend service in the sanctuary due to health, But by and large most who did not attend remained away because they do not find value in worship, or acceptance in church. They do not find encouragement in Emmanuel (God with us) and they do not experience hope in Jesus (God saves us.) How could this be possible? Because Christmas is a time of year, a portion of our time when we do focus on another... And then it is over, waiting to be repeated next year, it's already on the calendar for December 25, 2019.

If only we could maintain a Christmas attitude all year? If only we could welcome friends and neighbors in worship together, if only we could live to see the joy in another before ourselves all the time. If only we as Christians lived as if the Christmas miracle of God entering into the human condition so that humanity could be redeemed by the work of Godself were true, every day, every moment, every heartbeat. If we would share the Gospel story with everyone, all the time... If we truly allowed Jesus to be the Lord of our hearts in mercy, the Lord of our hands in service, and the Lord of our voices in justice. What if this 60% were to come face to face with God's face, Would they know value in worship? Would they know joy in Emmanuel? Would they know hope in Jesus? This is our responsibility in this unique time and from this unique place... To come and see what God is doing in worship, to find our rest in God's Word, to be molded into the image of Jesus, and then to go forth and tell of God's grace, peace, joy, and love to all. For when we humbly allow God to mold us into Christ, then those who need to know where hope resides will experience Jesus in us... This is the way of God's plan to redeem the world. And you are a part.

MUMC Single Board December 18, 2018 6:00 p.m. Wesley Hall

Present: Charlie Dighton, Marge Wolter, Ruth Voshell, Bruce Nodurft, Al Remling, Pastor Phil, Jean Gross, Janine Stellick, Mark Reth.

Single Board was called to order by Al Remling at 6:00 p.m. Mark Reth led us in the gathering devotion which was from Luke 2:8-11. This text relates how the angels appeared to the shepherds and told them of the good news of Jesus birth. Jesus came for the most lowly among us as a savior for the world.

Prayers and praises were lifted up followed by a moment of silence and a prayer for guidance by Pastor Phil.

Team Reports:

Finance: Bruce gave us the November Finance Report which shows that Y-T-D expenses with apportionments is \$210,291 and Y-T-D actual income is \$222,974.

Trustees: Charlie informed the board that the church's insurance will now be covered locally which will save us \$600.00 next year in premiums. Our previous carrier was from out of state. The children's art room has been measured for some type of new floor covering and Charlie will work at covering those windows with plastic for the winter. The windows in that room have not been replaced since the church was built. Gary Evarts is making the new platform for the sound booth and Manchester Cabinetry is working on the cabinet upgrades to accommodate the additional equipment being currently used. On January 13 at 10:30 the District Superintendent will be here to conduct a Church Conference at which time we will vote on the building upgrade proposal. There will be a time for further discussion before the voting.

Christian Ed: There are about nine groups that have completed the Advent study . Hannah Clemen will shadow Stephanie Stocks as our new VBS coordinator.

Reaching and Receiving: Shirt sales are done for now and we hope to have another opportunity to purchase them in the spring. Family Fun Day has been scheduled for the Rec. Center on Sunday February 10 from 3-6 p.m.

Action Items:

Staff Parish: A recommendation came from Staff Parish to change our custodial position from a contract position to an employee beginning on January 1, 2019. Finance will make the necessary adjustments and there will be no affect on the budgeted amount for that position. One board unanimously approved the recommendation as presented.

Motion made by Bruce Nodurft and seconded by Charlie Dighton that there be a 70% threshold for the passage of the building project to proceed. Motion carried unanimously by the board.

Pastor Phil suggested all the board members re-read the "Shift" book again and begin to think about how we can change our community and the world with the gifts and talents we have been given. Our goal should be to "dream God-sized dreams." One board suggested we use the book as a focus during worship to bring others along. Our church is making a difference but we can all do more to further God's kingdom.

Our next meeting will be on Tuesday, January 15, 2019 at 6:00 in Wesley Hall.

Meeting adjourned at 8:30 with the Lord's Prayer and Doxology.




January 13 Charge Conference for Building Project Come and Vote!


Church Fun Day at the REC CENTER
