# A note from Reverend Phil...

We have much happening in February this year. We are just starting our Nehemiah series which will teach and encourage us as God's children in prayer, patience, obedience, and leadership. This is one of my favorite books in the bible. In addition, Worship planning team is getting ready for Lent which starts the first Wednesday of March! Hard to believe it is almost upon us.

The most important thing happening in the United Methodist Church is the special called conference happening February 23-26 to discuss the future of the denomination over "sexuality." I would like to be very clear, it has much less to do with sexuality than it does biblical authority. As a UMC clergy, I have been anxiously awaiting this conference to set aside this noise so that as a church we can return to the call of building disciples for Jesus Christ. But what could this mean for us as a local church? For the most part I would say it would mean nothing to us as a church family. Why do I say this?

**First-** As a local church family we have already well established who we are, and how we live into our faith journey together. There is nothing happening that at this point that would force us to change that. We already are a loving and accepting people who understand that all are sinful and everyone needs a Savior. The sanctuary is where we come to work it out with God together in a community dedicated to Word and Spirit.

**Second-** The Word of God is unchanging, no matter what is decided. God's nature and character are timeless, what is true shall always remain true no matter the changing worldly culture.

**Third-** Because of our polity, anything that is done can be undone with the next convening General Conference, which is scheduled in 2020. (usually only held every four years, the one in 2019 is a special called General Conference to discuss only sexuality.)

Because this sexuality debate is so polarized and contentious there is a real possibility that our future together as a denomination may be in jeopardy. But as far as we as a church family, we can choose not to enter the fray, just be who we are, and move forward preaching Jesus Christ and our hope assured in resurrection. If a plan is chosen which would jeopardize this reality, then we can discuss our options.

Included at the bottom of this article is a website you can visit that will explain in brief the three most popular options that are being considered. This document is not fairly balanced as it leans to affirm the bishop's "One Church Plan" model... But they wrote it so it is not surprising. It does do a decent job of explaining the three plans in a shorter version. I will make myself available for questions if you have any, just call the church or stop in my office. The thing to remember is that in whatever forms these plans are presented, by the time amendments are made and language is changed, the final approved plan will probably be something different than anything proposed.



#### Manchester United Methodist Church Charge Conference December 13, 2019

Northeast Iowa District Superintendent Paul Wilcox called the Manchester United Methodist Church Charge Conference to order on December 13, 2019 at 10:15 in the church sanctuary. He led us in a prayer for guidance of the charge conference.

A motion was made by Charlie Dighton, seconded by Pastor Phil to nominate Jean Gross as the charge conference secretary. There being no other nominations, Jean was voted unanimously as secretary.

Our District Superintendent reminded those present that only members of our church are eligible to vote at a charge conference. Charlie Dighton brought forth the recommendation from Trustees that this charge conference vote is on proceeding further with the building Option #2 approved by the building committee and the church board. This being a recommendation from committee, no second was necessary before a charge conference vote. If this body votes to proceed it will also have to be approved by the District Building Committee, probably within a month.

Charlie emphasized the process undertaken up to this point involving the formation of a building renovations committee made up of Trustees and others of all ages. Josh Demmer a local architect was approved by the church board to come up with various plans to accomplish what was needed. The renovations team then chose one plan they felt was the best overall and presented it to the church board who in turn voted to share with the church family and then proceed to a church charge conference for a vote. A 70% threshold was voted on by one board for passage by charge conference.

Pastor Phil read a letter from Mark Reth our One Board Chair who was unable to be with us explaining his views and the process that has brought us together for this all-important vote. We need to keep in mind that we are renovating for the future of our church building and for those who do and will worship here. The past year was spent in studying and planning and was not entered into lightly by all involved.

The floor was opened for discussion:

Tom Fetter questioned whether possible decisions being made soon by the General Conference regarding the way forward for the Methodist Church is something to be concerned about. Pastor assured him our church will continue forward as we have been regardless of that outcome.

There was a question as to how such a project would be funded and Bruce Nodurft our Finance Chair spoke on behalf of the financial health of our church.

- -- The past two years we have under spent our budget by \$32,000 and \$15,000 respectively.
- -- Conference expectations for any building project are as follows:
  - 1) One third of the expected costs need to be fund raised first.
  - 2) One third of the expected costs need to be pledged, payable within three to five years once the project starts.
- 3) One third of the expected costs will be a 15-year loan possibly from the Iowa Methodist Foundation at the going interest rate at the time of the Ioan (currently 6.5% but fluctuates monthly).

A question arose as to what will happen if the building renovations vote fails. We were assured many of our building issues will not go away and the problems with asbestos, plumbing, and handicap accessibility among others will still be with us.

A question was raised as to what type of giving unit expectations will there be to help finance this proposal. No one has actually looked at that figure but it is hoped that those who already support our church as they are able will continue to do so in this endeavor as well.

Ballots were given to everyone eligible and we voted.

Pastor Phil moved to adjourn the charge conference at 11:00 a.m. seconded by Mike Zellner. Those who wanted to wait for the outcome were invited upstairs to fellowship time while the DS and others counted the votes.

Outcome of the voting as reported: Out of a total of 99 votes, 83 voted for and 16 voted against giving an 83.8% majority for those in favor. The recommendation from the renovations committee is passed by the charge conference.
