

A note from Reverend Phil...

At the end of our Nehemiah series the people gathered together within the resurrected walls of Jerusalem to hear the words of scripture read allowed, and they wept and mourned. They were stricken with conscious over the distance they have fallen away from God, and have become comfortable in their human condition. Nehemiah tells them do not weep and mourn, because this is a new beginning... Repent and celebrate that we are once again God's people. Celebrate and feast, and invite those who do not have enough to join you... Today there is enough for all!

On Wednesday March 6th is Ash Wednesday. This is a day where we come together as a people to acknowledge how we too have become comfortable in our human condition. This is the time we acknowledge that our human condition is not eternal, from dust we came and to dust shall we return. Then in a sign of penitence and mourning we wear the sign of the cross in shame and mourning. This is the beginning of our time of preparation and prayer for the celebration of Easter morning... He Is Risen! Each Sunday we will experience in worship the "Last Seven Words of Christ" from the cross in our book study by Ralph F. Wilson. We will stand before the cross and experience;

"Father, Forgive Them."
"This Day You Will Be With me in Paradise."
"Woman, Behold Your Son."
"My God, My God, Why Have You Forsaken me?"
"I Thirst."
"It Is Finished."
And finally "Father, Into Your Hands I commit My Spirit."

On this Journey we will seek His face in the midst of betrayal, attempts to hide, to cry crucify, and be stunned on the death of what we desired, only to be in awe of God's redeeming grace which is what we truly need.

This year I would compel to take this complete journey together, beginning with Ash Wednesday where our Worship Design Team has planned a special service, and in committing to faithful worship attendance every Sunday if possible and the special worship services of maundy Thursday and Good Friday. Let us also be committed to participating in one of the many available small groups. Let this Lenten season be one remembered when we made a priority out of our faith journey, out of our commitment to one another, and one where we experienced redeeming grace in Jesus crucified, and our hope assured in resurrection.



MUMC Single Board February 19, 2019 6:00 p.m. Church Library

Present: Janine Stellick, Marge Wolter, Ruth Voshell, Bruce Nodurft, Barry Eike, Mike Wade, Charlie Dighton, Al Remling.

One Board was called to order by Al Remling at 6:00 p.m. in the church library. Al led the board with a gathering devotion focused on wisdom and understanding. Prayers and praises were lifted up followed by a moment of silence and a prayer for guidance.

Team Reports:

Finance: Bruce noted that green slips need to be presented for credit card purchases before those bills can be paid. There are no exceptions to this requirement. Actual income for January was \$19,047 and actual expenses were \$16,927 with apportionments. Bruce included an endowment report also.

Trustees: Charlie said Delco has been contacted to do the church front entrance plumbing repairs. He also said the sun porch windows at the parsonage will be replaced in the spring. \$2000.00 has been budgeted for this with additional funds needed. Trustee projects that have or will be addressed include the following: Repair of outside church sign and replacement of bulbs therein; boiler system inspection passage; bathroom in Wesley Hall repaired; furnace malfunction in the parsonage; future snow removal for sidewalks and parking lots and approval for updating the choir area platform.

Worship Design: Ruth submitted a report on behalf of this team. There is currently no budgeted amount for worship design. There needs to be monies available for copyright licensing of audio/visual materials. There is budget item for general music copyright licensing and audio/visual comes under the general heading of music. It is hoped this budget item can be used for AV copyright as well as there have been some AV expenses recently. The worship committee is asking to buy new banners for the sanctuary. There will need to be an action item to accommodate this need (see below). Gary Evarts has been given approval from trustees to redo the choir area for approximately \$700.00 with work to begin shortly. Michael Stocks has devised a way to broadcast services to Wesley Hall if the need arises.

Missions: Barry Eike has consented to be our mission chairperson. He brought to our attention a Habitat for Humanity house being built in Marshalltown April 23-27. Any help is welcomed for this worthwhile project.

Reaching and Receiving: The church fun day was rescheduled to March 3rd at the Rec. Center from 3:00-6:00 p.m. It is hoped the weather will be cooperative.

Staff Parish: Mike and a couple other people will be looking into our church closing policy and bringing recommendations back to one board.

Action Items:

Motion by Ruth Voshell seconded by Charlie Dighton to add a budget line item for Worship Design and decreasing Kitchen Supplies budget by \$800.00. Motion carried. Kitchen supplies are supposed to be charged to the Women's Ministry which is on the 02 balance sheet and is funded by the charges for funeral dinners.

The next Single Board meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, March 19, 2019 in Wesley Hall at 6:00 p.m. Meeting was adjourned at 8:02 p.m. followed by the Lord's Prayer and singing of the doxology.
