#### A note from Youth Director Zach Rogers...

Dear Church,

Pastor Phil asked me to write this letter to you all to let you know what is going on with the youth ministry at our church. Youth Council met last year and agreed to join up with Delhi for our Wednesday night programming. It was determined that Wednesday night was a time and that we were going to attack and try to grow.

Last year on Wednesday night we were joining our church and adults in the sanctuary. We would split off for fellowship and small group after worship. As a whole we were maintaining our current church kids well. We were averaging 7 kids a night. Through a lot of prayer we made a decision that would hopefully reach more kids.

This year with Delhi we are going back and forth monthly. We started in Manchester and are currently in Delhi. We will be back in Manchester starting in November. Program schedule is 5:45-6:30 meal, 6:30-7:00 Worship, 7:00-7:30 small group split sr. high and mid high, and 7:30-8:00 fellowship and games. For our worship time we have a live band lead by Stephen Drury and Laura Seibert. Our message is brought to us from or Education Chair Paul Lymon.

During the small group time I take the Sr. High and Michaela Mesch, the Youth Director at Delhi, takes the Mid High. When we are in Delhi we switch. This was done to allow Michaela and I to build and grow our relationships with each kid.

In my eyes we have seen great success so far this year. We are averaging 12 kids a week, and have seen a total of 20 different youth in 7 weeks. We branded our group "**The Forge**" based out of scripture. Proverbs 27: 17 says, "As iron sharpens iron so, one man sharpens another". Our goal is to spread the word of Jesus to all youth who stop by. We are trying to equip our core kids with the ability to speak about Jesus to anyone. Growing in faith together with contemporary peers should allow them to grow in their view of Jesus. Each and every student young and old has their own version of what Jesus looks like. We hope that each youth can take little bits of Jesus from each person to grow a larger understanding of just how much Jesus loves them.

#### MUMC Single Board October 15, 2019 6:00 p.m. Wesley Hall

**Present:** Janine Stellick, Mike Wade, Mark Reth, Phil Rogers, Bruce Nodurft, Barry Eike, Ruth Voshell, Bill Scanlan, Paul Lyman, Charlie Dighton, Al Remling, Jean Gross.

Co-chair Al Remling called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. in Wesley Hall. Janine Stellick led the board with a devotion from Matthew 18:2-4 and Mark 10:15. These verses remind us that we will not enter God's kingdom unless we become like little children. We need to humble ourselves before God. She also read an excerpt from a book by Ann Kiemel.

Prayers and praises were lifted up followed by a moment of silence and prayer for guidance by Al.

#### **Team Reports:**

#### Finance:

Bruce presented the latest financial report. Actual expenses January through September were \$177,069 with apportionments paid and actual income was \$179,754. A report of donations or pledges to the Brick by Brick campaign was given. The 2020 budget needs to be approved at the November meeting and budget requests are needed immediately. A report of the endowments invested with the Iowa United Methodist Foundation was given.

#### Trustees:

Charlie reported that the two outlets not working in the kitchen have been repaired. The front entrance ceiling will be fixed soon. Due to plumbing issues there will be no heat there and in the back hallway as last winter. Additional heating for the organ pipes was discussed. A bid from Cole Beckman for sidewalk snow removal and treatment at the rate of \$120 per event was accepted. If no treatment for ice is needed the rate will be \$80 per event. Charlie presented the estimates for the room shuffle of Pastor's Office and Kat's office. The bids totaled \$8912.78. It was decided to share this information with the church body before a final decision is made.

#### **Christian Ed:**

Paul Lyman was welcomed as our new chair of Christian Ed. He has been helping with youth and is anxious to get more involved in other activities.

#### Missions:

Barry announced we have a new Glove Box Ministry. A box will be available in the narthex for donations of gloves, mittens or hats for school children. Project Angel Tree is getting ready for this year's gift giving. Angel Tree request forms will be available starting November 3rd. The Angel Tree with requests will be up by November 23 in the narthex and gifts need to be returned by December 8 for December 14 delivery.

#### Reaching and Receiving:

Janine reported that due to the bad weather we have not been able to have our Fun Time at Sherman's Pumpkin Patch. It is hoped that we may have some nice fall weather to still do that but if not we want to look at doing a Fun Night at the church with games, cards, etc. for families and anyone else who would like to come.

#### Staff Parish:

Mike reported that SPPRC will be meeting Thursday night to finalized budget items for salaries for next year.

#### **Lav Ministry**

Bill is working with the lay leader volunteers who will be helping to support team leaders.

#### **Action Items:**

A recommendation from the Finance Team for the year 2020 to budget \$34,226 for apportionments. Recommendation from Finance to remove Youth For Christ donations for 2020. Recommendation approved. We will still provide office space for YFC as needed.

It was moved by Charlie Dighton, seconded by Paul Lyman to approve the new Vision and Mission statements as follows:

Vision: To Know Jesus and Make Jesus Known

Mission: In community to discover, renew and share Jesus Christ through our words, actions and deeds.

Motion carried.

We wished Pastor Phil well during his renewal period away from the church.

Our next meeting will be November 19 in Wesley Hall at 6:00 p.m.

Meeting adjourned at 8:45.

We closed with the Lord's Prayer and singing of the Doxology.

#### 'Brick by Brick' Remodel Campaign

Dear members and friends of Manchester United Methodist Church:

In the early 1960's, the members of the Manchester United Methodist Church committed themselves to the idea of demolishing their current church building and replacing it with a new structure. That new building was dedicated in 1965. It has served us well over the past fifty-four years. The building has remained basically the same with very few structural modifications.

As any property or home owner knows, as time goes by, problems begin to arise. Some minor, others more serious. Such is the case with our current church building. Because of the age of our building and the problems needing to be addressed, a building committee made up of members of the congregation and led by the chairman of the trustees was created. Their purpose was to study these concerns and recommend to the Single Board possible solutions.

After several months of brain storming, dreaming, and discussing ideas with an architect, the building committee brought three proposals to the Single Board for their initial review. After several months of consideration and study, the Board unanimously endorsed and approved one specific proposal, and gave the building committee the authority to make a presentation to the church membership.

After several weeks of publicizing the event, a charge conference was convened in January. The charge conference was led by our District Superintendent. The proposed remodeling project was presented to the congregation and after a period of questions and answers, the issue was put to a vote. The voting members were informed that they would cast their vote in secret and that the Single Board had mandated at least a 70% approval of the proposal. The proposal was approved by an 85% majority.

Before MUMC could move forward with a capital campaign, the remodel project now needed to be approved by a district building committee. It took some time for this to happen, but that committee finally came to Manchester in late April. They met with our trustee chairman, toured the facility, and discussed the remodeling project with him. Being satisfied with the information they were presented, the district committee gave their approval.

So the next step in the process is to raise the necessary funds to meet the construction costs of these approved modifications. The current estimate totals \$532,000. Enclosed with this letter is a form for your consideration regarding how much financial support you are willing to provide now and/or in the future for the remodeling effort. When each of us became members of this congregation, we vowed to support it with our time, service, talents, and finances. Just as those members did in the early 1960s, let us now honor our commitment to provide an improved facility for future years.



#### **Operation Christmas Child Shoebox Tips**

#### Please use one of the red and green GO boxes or a regular size cardboard shoebox.

They are a standard size that packs easily into the shipping cartons at the relay center. While plastic boxes seem practical, many times they break and end up in the "shoebox hospital" at the processing center.

#### **Boy or Girl**

Determine the gender and age category: 2-4 years, 5-9 years, or 10-14 years. Attach the appropriate label (from the OCC pamphlet) on the box lid. Once the box is full, put a rubber-band around the box.

#### Gifts

Please focus on the practical! This one box will be shared with all members of the child's home, neighbors, friends, etc. The one washcloth you include may be used by 10 people living with the child! The simple items you and I take for granted each day could make all the difference in this child's life! Below are some ideas to get you started.

**Non-liquid Hygiene items** (These items will be shared by everyone living with the child. That could be 10-20 people!)

- -Toothbrush
- -Mild bar soap (leave in packaging & put in a plastic baggie; Ivory is a great choice because it floats)
- -Comb
- -Washcloth
- -Stick deodorant
- -Non-liquid lip balm
- -Adhesive bandages
- -Nail clippers & file

School Supplies (The school supplies you send could mean the difference in whether or not the child gets to attend school.)

- -Pens
- -Pencils (sharpen beforehand if possible) & sharpener
- -Crayons or markers
- -Paper (Steno notebooks fit well in shoeboxes)
- -Solar calculator
- -Coloring or picture books
- -Glue sticks

#### Clothing/Accessories

- -Shirts (plain colors)
- -Pants
- -Shorts
- -Shoes
- -Socks
- -Underwear
- -Hats/mittens
- -Hair bows
- -Jewelry

#### Other

- -Flashlights & batteries (This could be lifesaving for children escaping war or domestic violence)
- -Sunglasses
- -Tools (no saws or pocketknives)
- -Duct tape
- -Sewing kit/fabric
- -Cups, bowls, empty water bottle
- -Fishing kit

Toys/WOW item (Focus on the practical but still include a few fun items)

- -Balls (even a deflated soccer ball with a hand pump)
- -Slinkv
- -Stuffed animal
- -Small cars
- -Yo-yos
- -Jump ropes
- -Harmonicas
- -Puzzles
- -Binoculars

#### DO NOT INCLUDE:

- -Used/damaged items
- -War-related items (toy guns, knives, military figures, or any action figure holding a weapon)
- -Candy, chocolate or any type of food (could melt or spoil)
- -Toothpaste
- -Liquids/lotions (containers can break ruining other items in the box)
- -Medications/vitamins
- -Breakable items (snow globes, glass containers, etc.)
- -Aerosol cans



Why do we spend four weeks of Advent pretending that Jesus has not been born when we know full well that he has? *Awaiting the Already* is a 5-session study that addresses that question. During this study, you'll discover what parts of the Christmas story come from which Gospel and uncover the tension between the past and the future in your own life.

Suitable for either individual or group use, the five sessions include four sessions for each week of Advent and one for Christmas. Each chapter provides questions for reflection or discussion, a brief prayer, and a focus for the upcoming week.
