Mission of the Month...

A note from Pastor Phil...

Now that I, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also should wash one another's feet. I have set you an example that you should do as I have done for you. (John 13:14-15)

Is it just me or does it seem that Easter is coming early this year? It seems we just celebrated the joy of the birth of Christ, and now in the season of Lent we are called to remember the cost of grace and the consequences of our sin.

We all have a picture fixed in our mind of that scene at the foot of the cross on Mt. Golgotha... This is a hero's moment when Jesus trades our stained righteousness to offer us the purity of his very own righteousness... At this moment we are made clean, redeemed before the Throne of God!

But is this the only superhero moment? What about the feeding of 5000? What about the healing of the leper? What about walking on water? These would also qualify as a superhero moment as well. This summer we will once again reach out into our community to reveal God's love and hope in a House of David work project. Our love and service will surround Katie Mitchell this year. Katie is a member of MUMC and is know in the community. She purchased a home next door to her mother Robin Stone several years ago. Mom and daughter had plans to slowly work on the house together as a project. Last fall Robin was diagnosed with a very rare and inoperable cancer that aggressively took Robin from us too soon. Katie's Father had passed away two years before. Now Katie is a young woman who has lost both parents, and lives on disability. Many projects were started but not completed, others should have been done that are yet to be started. House of David is a unique community ministry where we rise up in the name of our Savior and love and care for our own. Katie now lives with limited fixed income and is alone... She now only has her faith, her church, and her community to count on going forward. This is what the House of David is all about. Al Saunders will once again serve as our building contractor.

We need to surround Katie in prayer for working to overcome within her "new normal" in the absence of her mom.

We have set a budget of \$10,000.00 to purchase the materials necessary to complete our target projects to make her home safer and more livable.

We need volunteers to work the sight offering God their hands in service.

We need volunteers willing to support the work team by providing lunch each workday.

We need to communicate this into our community so that Katie will feel

accepted and supported by all in her hometown.

House of David will take place from June 8th through the 13th.

Please pray on how you can support this vital ministry of our community and church.

MUMC Single Board February 18, 2020 6:00 p.m. Wesley Hall

Present: Pam Vap, Charlie Dighton, Mike Wade, Rev. Phil Rogers, Dave Gaskill, Barry Eike, Ruth Voshell, Janine Stellick, Jean Gross, Mark Reth, Susan Hermann.

Mark Reth called the meeting order at 6:00 p.m. in Wesley Hall. He opened the meeting with scripture from Isaiah 55:10, 11. God's word is like the snow and rain that replenish the earth and it will not return empty but will accomplish the purpose for which it was intended. Prayers and praises were lifted up followed by a moment of silence and a prayer for guidance from Mark.

Dave Gaskill gave a brief presentation on W+2 and how spiritual growth is part of the formula for church growth. As new people come, feel welcomed and at home, it is hoped that they will want to grow spiritually and become involved in the life of the church. Many opportunities abound for everyone. W+2 equates to someone who worships with us and is also involved in two other areas of church life such as Bible study and Missions. Some in our midst may be a W+6, meaning they are very involved in several areas. Maybe it is time to let some of those people step back a bit and give others an opportunity to step up a bit.

Action item

Motion by Barry Eike seconded by Charlie Dighton to empower a W+2 Team to move forward with the spiritual growth formula as presented. Motion carried.

Finance: Actual expenses for January were \$18,034 and actual income was \$23,624 leaving a surplus for the month. A team is being formed to help with the Brick-by-Brick campaign with the task of growing this fund.

Trustees: Charlie Dighton reported on several projects completed now or in the near future. The north entrance to the church has been repaired. An additional heat source may have to be added to the area. The new organ contract has been signed in the amount of \$900 for the year. The remaining replacement windows in the parsonage will be completed in the next couple of weeks. The kitchen will have a sprinkler system added as well as new vent filters per our insurance carrier suggestions. Charlie is looking for someone with grant writing experience to help with possible funding of certain projects in our building.

Action Item:

Motion by Ruth Voshell, seconded by Janine Stellick to have a Chicken and Corn Feed in the City Park during the Motocross races on August 1st to benefit Trustee projects. Motion approved. Clarence Slife will be in charge of planning.

Worship:

Ruth mentioned that the Decorating Team will be helping with Worship Design and attending the meetings. April 8, Wednesday of Holy Week, the group **Jews for Jesus** will give a presentation in our sanctuary at 7 p.m. The community is invited to attend this also.

Christian Ed:

The Lenten study entitled *What Makes a Hero* will begin soon. The cost of the books is \$4.00. See Kat in the office or Al to get a copy. Sign up in the narthex for a group that works for you.

Missions:

Barry mentioned again about the bowling party to be held in March to benefit our March Mission which is the Eastern Iowa Mentoring Program. He is trying to get a team from our church to participate or to sponsor a person for the \$50 fee. August 12 is the date set for our ice cream social.

Reaching and Receiving:

Janine reminded us of the church Fun Day at the Rec Center coming up this weekend, March 23 from 3-6 p.m. There are greeter sign-up sheets at the welcome desk. She would like to know of people willing to give rides to appointments.

Congregational Care:

Pam Vap reported on the outcome of the committee meeting from February 17. Eleven people have indicated an interest in helping with their mission which is to expand connectivity with the congregation to meet needs that may be overlooked or potential for enhancement. They have identified three areas of possibilities: 1) Special Occasion Meals/Healthy Cooking; 2)Congregation Visits; 3) Miscellaneous needs as they arise. Susan Hermann reminded us of the Blood Drive scheduled for March 26.

Action Item:

Motion by Barry Eike, seconded by Susan Hermann, to set the dates of June 9-13 for a House of David project pending funding. Motion carried with one abstention.

Pictures for a new Church Directory are scheduled for May 20-23 with LifeTouch.

Our next meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, March 17 at 6:00 in Wesley Hall.

Meeting adjourned at 8:05 with the Lord's Prayer and singing of the Doxology.

MANCHESTER UNITED METHODIST CHURCH CLOSURE POLICY

Effective October 1, 2019

School Day Closure Policy (Monday – Thursday)

All non-church member activities are to be cancelled when an inclement weather-related school closure is enacted.

All scheduled church member activities are cancelled unless the church leader for the activity deems it safe and contacts attendees that the activity will be held.

Church staff may perform duties on site if they determine that the site is safe to enter. The office will remain officially closed for visitor purposes.

If church staff cannot enter or leave the building safely, they can work from home or another site approved by senior pastor.

If an off-site location is used to perform work duties, the church phone messaging system must be accessible, and messages left must be addressed every hour. In addition, access to the church email system must be accessible at the site chosen to perform work duties and email messages must be checked hourly.

Hourly staff also have the option to claim a vacation day for church closure days.

Friday Saturday/Nights/Evenings/After School Hour Policy

Church Board Meetings are to be cancelled if deemed necessary by assigned Chairperson, if access to the building is a concern. Chairperson can contact by email and/or phone.

Other events, both church member and nonmembers holding meetings/events are to be advised as to whether to hold event by the assigned responsible party for the event. Be it advised that there are no sidewalk or entrance maintenance activities conducted after office hours Monday – Thursday or on Fridays and Saturdays. Method of notification of closure is the responsibility of the responsible party for the event.

SUNDAY SERVICE CANCEL POLICY

Church service to be cancelled when deemed not to be safe to travel and/or church property cannot be made safe for egress. The decision to cancel service should be made by Senior Pastor and/or Trustee Members. Decision to cancel service is to be made by 7:30 AM.

Methods to notify members:

Facebook - To be posted by AA or member of Tech Committee.

Phone message system to be updated with notice of closure by AA, Senior Pastor or another designee.

Text messages to board members.

Contact other members that have access to Facebook and texts.

KMCH Radio to be notified by Senior Pastor or person identified by Senior Pastor.

If travel and egress on church property is in question for an individual, it is recommended not travel to church, even if service is held.

It is recommended that if inclement weather is a concern, to use one of the methods above to determine if church will be closed for Sunday Service.

OFFICE CLOSURE POLICY

The office shall be closed for visitors at times when the church has been closed for weather or staffing reasons.

If all office staff are absent during a normal working day the office is considered closed.

A sign should be made visible at the north and south doors to inform visitors that the office is closed and list methods to contact office staff, such as email and phone numbers in case of emergencies.
