

### A note from Pastor Phil...

12 "On that same night I will pass through Egypt and strike down every firstborn of both people and animals, and I will bring judgment on all the gods of Egypt. I am the Lord. 13 The blood will be a sign for you on the houses where you are, and when I see the blood, I will pass over you. No destructive plague will touch you when I strike Egypt. - Exodus 12:12-13

All this social distancing and quarantine makes us feel as if we are living in the ancient days during the plagues of the old testament when Moses was trying to convince Pharaoh to "let my people go." Each of these plagues would have caused more anxiety and fear in God's people. Though they may have been safe, seeing all this happen around them would have been intimidating, knowing you are in the presence of an all powerful God. After the second to last plague of total darkness for three days, Pharaoh was ready to release the Israelites, but they had to leave their livestock behind. This was not acceptable- who can negotiate with God? So God through Moses prepared for the last plague, the death of the first born.

Exodus 12:12-13 above reveals the instructions God gave to His people. They are told to sacrifice the purest lamb, and to paint both sides of the doorposts with the blood of the sacrifice. Then God said *"When I see the blood, I will pass over you. No destructive plague will touch you." How comforting would this promise be today? This set the example for the Passover Meal, which Jesus celebrated with the disciples in the upper room, though we know it as the last supper. This is important because it is the beginning of the end of the passion story of Jesus ministry here on earth.* 

How we wish we could set aside our anxiety with a sacrifice right now. All we see on TV is bad news about this epidemic. Where is God today to take away our fear?

Just as the Passover Meal leads to the events of Jesus crucified, it also leads to our everlasting grace and eternal life. There need not ever be another sacrifice because the sacrifice that fateful night on Calgary's Hill was the one time perfect sacrifice for all time. When God's Self offered up his Divine life for our broken ones. This blood is more than on the door post, it literally covers all of our iniquity so that we can stand boldly before God acceptable for eternity. There will be another side to this, and I pray we all come together in worship and thanksgiving after. But no matter what, our victory over death is secure as long as God is on the throne.

The meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m. Pastor Phil shared scripture from Psalm 46:

"God is our refuge and strength, and ever-present help in trouble. Therefore we will not fear, though the earth give away and the mountains fall into the heart of the sea, though its waters roar and foam and the mountains quake with their surging. As a follow up from the Special Meeting Pastor Phil updated the board with the following information: Financial goals are put on hold for now until summer, i.e. Brick-by-Brick, House of David. With the lack of corporate worship the impact on the budget monies is unknown at this time. For our April board meeting all board members are being asked to e-mail to Kat the day before the meeting their items that may need attention to shorten our meeting time. There will be no corporate worship through April 5 (Palm Sunday) as of now. That could change. The Circuit pastors will rotate recording the sermons and they will be downloaded to our website and will be available by 7 a.m. on Sundays. It will also be available on Facebook.

### Finance:

Bruce: The income year to date is \$38,232 and year to date actual expenses are \$33,326. There is to be no unnecessary spending at this time. Bruce will include an article in the Chimes that will gently remind us that our monthly bills still need to be paid and our giving will still be necessary. There will be reminders on our Website also. The House of David project will have to be put off until August.

### Trustees:

Charlie said that only necessary repairs will be made at this time. Our janitor is making a good effort to sanitize certain areas of our building that are still in use.

#### **Missions:**

Barry mentioned that Mission of the Month will be postponed until summer and any monies given towards missions will be stockpiled and used for future mission projects.

#### **Reaching and Receiving:**

Janine said no more mugs will be ordered for visitors but a small gift bag with information and other items will be given out instead.

#### **Congregational Care:**

Pam mentioned upcoming events scheduled depending on what is happening in our community include A May Day coffee. Those people wanting to be involved in visiting others should have some type of training according to Pastor Phil.


