Hello fellow in home campers!

Now that Governor Reynolds appears to have listed restrictions on church worship services, that means we can get back to normal worship in the sanctuary together right? No, not just yet. Governor Reynolds has some constitutional challenges about how she may restrict worship, and it is up to church leaders to decide on best practices. Bishop Haller has made the suggestion that we not plan to do live worship until June 1st. The inter-religious council advised something like, not now- maybe later... Yesterday our Manchester UMC church leadership shared through email all our thoughts. Then at our DELCO Circuit meeting the pastors shared our ideas and those of our individual church leadership teams. And all seem to agree on one thing, none of us can say for certain what the future holds, and when is it best to resume live worship in the sanctuary. But one thing we do know for sure, we will never know if we were too cautious, but we will know with potentially tragic results if we were not cautious enough. This is a time when we look to scripture like the Philippians passage above. I want life to go back to normal, but further caution is warranted for the safety of all.

The staff here at MUMC has already begun to plan for our "Triumphant Re-entry" into live worship. I am tired of preaching to an empty room, and not seeing my church family. But when we do return, it will not be like before COVID, nor will it be a new normal, but entering into a new season. Please be patient as we work together to maximize our worship experience and our concern for safety for all.

As we make our plans we do know that when we return in this transitional season, all will need to wear masks... So if you are a mask maker, please get with Kat in the office as we will need to prepare some extras for those who don't have one or will forget. We will need extra door greeters to help with instructions... Please get with Kat if you feel called to help with this vital ministry in this season. We will need extra ushers as they will be needed at all four services, please get with kat if you feel you may assist in this area during this season. We will need a crew from each worship service to volunteer to wipe down pews and bathroom fixtures after each worship, Please let Kat know in the office if you can assist after your worship time.

We can see a ray of sunlight in the dark, we are approaching a new season, let us be encouraged! And let us prepare the way for all of those people who are seeking to find hope after this scary time... Peace

MUMC Single Board April 21, 2020 5:45 p.m. via Zoom

Participants: Paul Lyman, Pastor Phil, Ruth Voshel, Jean Gross, Mark Reth, Barry Eike, Kathy Dolan, Janine Stellick, Bruce Nodurft, Mike Wade.

Chair Mark Reth opened the meeting at 5:45 giving participants time to log in. He introduced Kathy Dolan as our new Vice-Chair. Welcome Kathy! It was noted that there has been positive feedback from viewers of the on-line services. It is obvious that much time and effort is put into each service, especially during Holy Week. Hopefully we can be back together in mid-May with smaller gatherings.

Prayers and praises were lifted up.

Finance: Bruce noted that the church finances were good through the first quarter; however since the quarantine there has been a decrease due to lack of corporate worship. Several have made an effort to mail or bring their gifts to the church office and for that we are grateful. The Brick by Brick campaign continues to grow. As of now there is \$88,000 in cash for the campaign from the pledged amounts. Apportionment giving is on hold for now.

Trustees: The ice machine is working again. Dennis is working hard to sanitize twice a day those areas of the church being used.

Worship: It was noted again the appreciation being put into worship services and all those involved, including music people and the tech team of Michael and Nicholas Stocks.

Education: Paul will be meeting with Zach when he is available to discuss future plans. The Sunday School teachers are discussing some possible fun things for the kids to do at home.

Missions: At this time there is nothing to report however when we are together again we will make a decision for May missions.

Mike Wade brought up the subject of the small business loan/grants being offered by the Federal Government. Bruce has a copy of the form from online. After input from all members participating it was decided to look into this possibility. Ruth can help with the information needed to complete the form. This money goes quickly so it was decided to be proactive and see what our options are. The money is paid as a grant if it is used for salaries and a one per cent loan if needed to pay ongoing expenses.

Pastor Phil told us that the Iowa Conference is recommending gatherings of no more than 50 when we are able to have corporate worship again. At this time he is recommending three services on Sunday and one on Wednesday. A letter is going out to the congregation this week with the times so they each can choose which service they would prefer to join and every effort will be made to accommodate those wishes keeping in mind the 50 person limit. He is hopeful this can begin some time in May. Pastor is also aware that some may not feel comfortable coming to corporate worship right away. Mark would like to have a clean up team after each service if possible.

Our next regular meeting is scheduled for May 19 hopefully in Wesley Hall. Meeting adjourned at 6:50 p.m. followed by the Lord's Prayer.

Canceling worship services beyond Palm Sunday is very much a possibility. So at a minimum, there will not be services for at least the next three Sundays. No worship services equate to no offerings or incoming contributions. I wish the same could be said about expenses. However, we all know that will not be the case. Even though the consensus among the Single Board members is not to spend any money unless absolutely necessary, the church will still have routine weekly and monthly bills that will need to be paid. The church is very much like your household when it comes to expenses—the bills continue to come. The church does currently have a small reserve that it can fall back on for a short period of time, but it would be a significant help (and reduce the stress the finance chairman is feeling) if you could continue to maintain your current financial support of the church.

If you are out running an errand, would you consider stopping by the church and leaving your contribution at the office or putting it in the mailbox marked 'Finance'? Could you possibly mail your contribution to the church (413 East Butler Street)? Have you ever thought of setting up an automatic routine contribution to the church through your financial institution? In circumstances like we currently are experiencing, an automatic contribution would be a reliable contribution the church could count on.

We realize that it's possible that you may be feeling a strain on your finances because of a layoff, shortened work hours, the downturn in the stock market, the uncertainty of the future, etc., and are not able to continue your financial support at this time. We understand. However, if it is within your means to continue your weekly/monthly contributions, would you please consider doing so?
