VBS is Virtual

A note from Pastor Phil...

"When the Lord takes pleasure in anyone's way, he causes their enemies to make peace with them." -Proverbs 16:7

We have been dealing with a pandemic since March, the racial unrest, protests, riots, and violence since the end of May, and it is now July and it seems as if we have not moved beyond the initial human response and still live in anger, fear and trembling.

We hear passionate voices about it being "their" fault or perhaps "others", each voice passionately blaming others while they seek to be identified as the greater victim. How has all this resulted in any gain for any voice?

We all witnessed the death of George Floyd, and all that I know responded with disgust and outrage. We pray for Mr. Floyd, his family, and that there will be justice for this tragedy. Do I feel more so because of a march, not personally, though I support those who feel the need to live out their outrage in this fashion. But when it comes to property destruction, or violence, or a call for violence against our police? No you have left me behind in your out of control rage.

But pastor, didn't Jesus have a violent response in the temple with the money changers? Yes, but it is not the same... Jesus asserted His Authority in the temple, He was not seeking to usurp another. And no buildings or people were injured in the making of this scripture...But pastor what about the Boston Tea party? Again, not the same. All the tea was thrown into the harbor, I am pretty sure nobody took a grocery cart full of big screen TV's home.

Over and over I hear voices trying to justify behavior that just does not glorify God. These behaviors just seem to create a larger divide in our relationships... What if we choose a different way? What if we tried the simple solution from Proverbs 16:7? What if we lived into the image of Jesus, and trusted the power of the Holy Spirit to lead us into a relationship that edifies our Triune God?

Galatians 5:22-23 teaches us what that would look like.

22 But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, 23 gentleness and self-control. <u>Against such things there is no law.</u>

Pay close attention to verse 23b which is underlined. Against such things there is no law... This is the way to peace.

Starting this Sunday July 5th, 2020, we will begin a short three part series on some of the scriptural examples of God's acceptance of people whom the people of the day would reject. There are many to choose from, we just wanted to focus on a few.

I invite you to come to service, or to watch the video, or listen to the radio to share in this important message so relevant for today. Let us rest together to hear God's Word, so that we can go forth to share this truth with a nation and a world that desperately needs to hear it.

MUMC Single Board June 16, 2020 6:00 p.m. via Zoom

Participants: Pastor Phil, Kathy Dolan, Mark Reth, Bill Scanlan, Mike Wade, Jean Gross, Bruce Nodurft.

Chairman Mark Reth called the meeting to order via Zoom at 6:00 p.m. He opened with a scripture reading from Rev. 1:7, "Look he is coming with the clouds, and every eye will see him, even those who pierced him; and all the peoples of the earth will mourn because of him. So it shall be! Amen." Prayers were lifted up for those especially in need at this time by Pastor Phil.

Finance: Bruce reported that as of the first five months of this year our income has exceeded budgeted expenses by over \$8500. We have been blessed by the tithes and offerings coming in during this difficult period. Brick-by-brick campaign has continued to grow with cash on hand over \$91,000. The PPP loan/grant we received recently has revised their rules for that money and has lengthened the amount of time to disperse it and lowered the criteria to 60% going toward wages from 75%.

Trustees: A recommendation from Trustees that the chicken and corn feed scheduled for this summer be postponed until next summer. Recommendation approved unanimously. The sweet corn that was planted will be sold and some donated with proceeds going towards the expense of planting. Mike Wade and Dennis have repaired the ice maker.

Christian Ed: Vacation Bible School will be virtual this year. Hannah Clemen is preparing materials for families to use with their children at home. Confirmation has finished and they will be confirmed on August 16. We will be celebrating our seniors June 21.

Staff Parish: Mike plans to have a zoom meeting for SPPRC to finalized input for the *Another Set of Eyes* report that is due this summer. This is the last year that this evaluation document will be used.

Pastor Phil reported that there have been about 100 people attending services. He is making changes to worship as follows: The Wednesday night service will be discontinued for the summer. Sunday will have two services starting with the last Sunday in June. The service times will be 8:30 and 10:00. Masks will still be required but that is subject to change. The 8:30 service will be recorded and will have the children's message. There will be no in house church meetings until masks are no longer required.

Meeting adjourned at 6:35 p.m. Next regular meeting will be July 21 at 6:00 p.m. We closed with the Lord's Prayer.

Finally Our Triumphant Return to Church

Dear church family, by now you have received two letters, prior to this one, explaining our plan and process for returning to church as well as which service you have been invited to. This letter is to remind everyone of some rules that must be followed in order for us to worship together in church. We will begin worshiping again together on **Sunday May 31st and Wednesday June 3rd.**

The Following rules must be followed in order for us to return:

-Please only come to the service you were invited to.

-No one can arrive more than fifteen minutes early for their service.

-Everyone must enter through the front doors (North entrance), regardless of where you park.

-Everyone must be wearing a mask before you can enter the building. (With the exception of babies or toddlers) If you need a mask there will be some near the entrance. Please grab the first one on the end don't dig to find a different one because yours has flowers on it. A free will offering box will be available if you'd like to donate for your mask. (We do have some smaller masks for toddlers and little kids if parents would like one.) If you refuse to wear a mask you will not be allowed in the building.

-Everyone must sit where the ushers seat you. It is not likely that you will sit where you always sit. You will be seated in the order you arrive. (Please be patient, this is temporary.) Please sit and wait for service, don't wander around church. We are still asked to practice social distancing. You may use the restroom if necessary. The yellow restrooms, located on the same level as the library and the restroom in Wesley Hall will be open for use.


-All Bibles, Hymnals, Visitor cards, pens and offering envelopes have been removed from the pews in order to make sanitation between services easier. If you need envelopes for offering please get some in the office some time during the week or use your own and have them ready before service. Offering boxes will be available as you exit worship.

-When worship has finished everyone will be excused in the same way in which we do communion. The ushers will dismiss by row. When dismissed please leave immediately. Don't stop to talk with anyone. If you need to talk please call the person or perhaps meet in the park across the street from the church. We need everyone off church grounds as soon as we possibly can in order to prepare for the next service. Everyone must exit through the south doors near the parking lot. (Again regardless of where you parked.)

-Last but not least, please do not stop to talk to pastor. He would love to talk to everyone but he has to continue to social distance as well. He will be in his office and he'll wave as you exit church but his office will be locked. If you need to speak with him please call or email. pastorphil@umcmanchester.com or 563-927-4439.




