#### MUMC Single Board July 21, 2020 6:15 p.m. via Zoom

**Participants:** Pastor Phil, Mark Reth, Jean Gross, Pam Vap, Ruth Voshell, Bruce Nodurft, Bill Scanlan, Mike Wade, Janine Stellick.

**Chairman** Mark Reth called the meeting to order at 6:15 p.m.. He opened with scripture from I John 4:18. "There is no fear in love. But perfect love drives out fear, because fear has to do with punishment. The one who fears is not made perfect in love." Mark shared this scripture has to do what is going on in our world. God does not want us to live an unproductive life surrounded by fear.

Pastor Phil share a few words on the turmoil in our country and the frustration being shared by many. It is time to trust in God. Prayers and praises were lifted up for those in our midst needing God's special attention at this time.

**Finance:** Bruce shared that our YTD end of June income is \$119,852 and our YTD end of June expenses are \$96,166 without payment towards apportionments since January. We will still have a surplus if/when those apportionments are paid. The Iowa Conference has dropped the 20% surcharge on apportionments for next year so our apportionment share will be decreased for next year. SCRIP has presented a check for \$1500 to go towards our budget. The Brick by Brick campaign has a total of \$93,345 cash on hand.

**Trustees:** Mike Wade has been working on our ice machine which continues to not be working properly. It has been disconnected for now since it is not being used and he is checking into further maintenance that needs to be completed before we use it again. The sweet corn planted for our chicken and corn feed should be ready soon. People are interested in buying some and someone will check to see when that will be ready.

**Congregational Care:** A member of our faith community is having major health issues and needs some support during this difficult time. The board gave a unanimous vote of affirmation to proceed with fact-finding on behalf of this individual so that future decisions can be made as to how to proceed and be supportive.

**Staff Parish: Mike** shared Dennis will be on vacation from August 2-8 and some cleaning help will probably be needed especially if church services continue on August 2nd. There are funds available for \$10/hr. to be paid for this extra help.

Pastor Phil told the board that the Safety Team will meet soon to re-evaluate when in-house services can begin again. The target date is August 2nd but that is subject to change. Meeting adjourned at 7:15 p.m. Pastor closed in prayer. Next meeting is scheduled for Aug. 18.

## August 16th Return to Church

After meeting with the safety team we feel that it is a good time to return to Live worship. We understand if you still feel it too soon to return. We will also continue to closely monitor any rise in COVID cases. If there is a rise in our area the safety team will make a quick decision as to weather or not we close again and everyone will be notified through Facebook, the church website and a letter as soon as possible.

The Following rules must be followed in order for us to return:

-Please only come to the service you were invited to.

-No one can arrive more than fifteen minutes early for their service.

-Everyone must enter through the front doors (North entrance), regardless of where you park.

-Everyone must be wearing a mask before you can enter the building. (With the exception of babies or toddlers) If you need a mask there will be some near the entrance. Please grab the first one on the end don't dig to find a different one because yours has flowers on it. A free will offering box will be available if you'd like to donate for your mask. (We do have some smaller masks for toddlers and little kids if parents would like one.) If you refuse to wear a mask you will not be allowed in the building.

-Everyone must sit where the ushers seat you. It is not likely that you will sit where you always sit. You will be seated in the order you arrive. (Please be patient, this is temporary.) Please sit and wait for service, don't wander around church. We are still asked to practice social distancing. You may use the restroom if necessary. The yellow restrooms, located on the same level as the library and the restroom in Wesley Hall will be open for use.

-All Bibles, Hymnals, Visitor cards, pens and offering envelopes have been removed from the pews in order to make sanitation between services easier. If you need envelopes for offering please get some in the office some time during the week or use your own and have them ready before service. Offering boxes will be available as you exit worship.

-When worship has finished everyone will be excused in the same way in which we do communion. The ushers will dismiss by row. When dismissed please leave immediately. Don't stop to talk with anyone. If you need to talk please call the person or perhaps meet in the park across the street from the church. We need everyone off church grounds as soon as we possibly can in order to prepare for the next service.

Everyone must exit through the south doors near the parking lot. (Again regardless of where you parked.)

-Last but not least, please do not stop to talk to pastor. He would love to talk to everyone but he has to continue to social distance as well. He will be in his office and he'll wave as you exit church but his office will be locked. If you need to speak with him please call or email. pastorphil@umcmanchester.com or 563-927-4439.

Have you heard? 2020 marks the 10<sup>th</sup> year Manchester United Methodist Church will serve as an Operation Christmas Child Drop-Off Location. While Covid-19 has slowed down our efforts the past few months, we still have a God-sized goal to pack 1,010 shoebox gifts at our November packing party and collect a total of 2,020 boxes at this year's Drop-Off. Can you picture it? 2,020 children receiving a shoebox gift and hearing perhaps for the first time about a Savior who loves them beyond measure.

#### What can you do to help us reach this goal?

Volunteer to contact area churches or community groups as we recruit new donors.

- Volunteer to help us fundraise for the \$9,090 needed to ship our shoeboxes. (We are still in need of \$7,705 to reach our goal.)
- Volunteer to coordinate bulk purchasing of the hygiene items, school supplies, etc. needed for the packing party.

Volunteer to help count and organize packing party donations.

Start packing shoeboxes NOW rather than waiting until November.

Pray for these local efforts to pack shoeboxes as well as for the children who will receive these gifts.

#### **Current Packing Party needs:**

School supplies: pens, crayons, pencil sharpeners, erasers, scissors, glue sticks, and pencil pouch or slider case; (We have enough pencils.)

Hygiene items: bar soap, washcloths, soap containers, toothbrush containers, combs/brushes, and stick deodorant; (Remember no toothpaste is allowed.)

Clothing: underwear, shoes, and socks for boys and girls (all sizes)

Packing party donations may be dropped off in the church office during regular office hours.


