## A note from Pastor Phil...

42 They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer. 43 Everyone was filled with awe at the many wonders and signs performed by the apostles. 44 All the believers were together and had everything in common. 45 They sold property and possessions to give to anyone who had need. 46 Every day they continued to meet together in the temple courts. They broke bread in their homes and ate together with glad and sincere hearts, 47 praising God and enjoying the favor of all the people. And the Lord added to their number daily those who were being saved. (Acts 2:42-47)

This is what the church is supposed to look like. This is who we are! Or at least this is who we used to be. I think this is who we want to be... Last Sunday in our third week after returning to live worship we had a total of 70-ish worshippers. Our lowest number since our return. By no means is this a judgment, just an observation. Our lowest number coincides with an increase in our community of positive COVID tests. We also have many who are just done with this pandemic and want to come back to normal with normal music and an absence of a mask ... To return to being the church described in Acts 2. But our Safety Team is not ready for that just yet. So here we are, how do we continue to be devoted to biblical teaching and maturity? We have worship on line and now available live... But it is not the same with social distancing and masks. We have fellowship by phone, but this does not seem enough.

I would like to invite the church to write and come in and film short devotionals, how are you experiencing God's presence in these unique times? Then call Kat in the office and we will arrange to film these and put them on our Facebook page.

I would like to invite the church to continue with bible study in small groups. We are able to meet in person at church in Wesley Hall, perhaps we can arrange to meet together in small groups to focus on fellowship and faith maturity.

There is no doubt that we will need to be more dedicated and deliberate than ever to continue to be the church in these difficult times. But as I have said before, this is just a season of our lives, we will get through it. I just think we need to be deliberate about getting through it together. The world is watching and counting on us to glorify the Kingdom, even in these unsettled times.

**Chairman** Mark Reth called the meeting to order at 6:00p.m. Social distancing and masks were observed. He opened the meeting with a response reading from Psalm 119: 105-112. This scripture is a reminder to us that God's word is there to guide and direct our way and to shed light on our path. Our hearts need to be set on keeping God's decrees. Prayers and praises were lifted up followed by a moment of silence and prayer for guidance.

**Finance:** Bruce reported that we have a balance in our budget of \$4677.00 after seven months of contributions and all bills paid, including apportionments in escrow and the PPP loan which has not yet been forgiven. The application for the PPP loan forgiveness has not yet been applied for. The Brick by Brick campaign increased by \$2300 in July bringing a cash in hand total of \$96,645.

**Trustees:** A voucher for the input costs of the sweet corn will be sent to Travis Hough. Hopefully we will be able to have the Chicken and Corn Feed next year. The kitchen still needs to be brought up to code for insurance purposes. The exhaust system needs to be upgraded.

**Worship:** The board gave affirmation for a gratuity to be given to Michael and Nicholas Stocks for all of their extra help with technology for the past several months. They will be given a gift card to Chuong Garden.

**Missions:** Our chain saw team has been helping in the Cedar Rapids area with clean up after the devastating storm last week.

**Reaching & Receiving:** Janine said it has been hard to find greeters for both services due to several not attending at this time. A sign will be placed outside the back door reminding people to use only the front door for entry.

**Congregational Care:** Phone calls are continuing and it is good to be able to keep in touch with those we haven't been able to see. Many people appreciate a call.

**Staff Parish:** We will be needing to look for people to man the office when Kat is on maternity leave. She will work from home as much as possible.

<u>Action Item:</u> Motion by Charlie Dighton, seconded by Ruth Voshell for up to \$500 from mission be spent on safety items and small equipment for the chainsaw trailer. Delhi church has worked to make storage areas in the trailer. Motion carried.

**Pastor Phil** gave a shout out to the chancel ladies who have been working very hard to enhance our chancel area to make it attractive and meaning ful for our taped and live services. Much time and effort is put forth each week to prepare for worship. Pastor also mention that 2021 apportionments will be substantially less than this year due to drastic budget cuts at the conference level. We need to be thinking about budget needs for 2021 soon.

Meeting adjourned at 7:30 p.m. followed by the Lord's Prayer. Our Next meeting is scheduled for September 15, 2020 in Wesley Hall at 6:00p.m.

2020 marks the 10<sup>th</sup> year Manchester United Methodist Church will serve as an Operation Christmas Child Drop-Off Location and back in January, we set God-sized goals to pack 1,010 shoeboxes at our packing party and collect another 1,010 shoeboxes at our Drop-Off Location for a total of 2,020 boxes collected in 2020. Since January, Covid-19 has changed our world, and I started to doubt we could reach these goals. However, Ephesians 3:20-21 reminds me that while our world has changed, God has not. God still has the power to use each of us to do immeasurably more than we could even ask or imagine. My question to each of you is, how is God calling YOU to support Operation Christmas Child in 2020?

#### What can you do to help us reach this goal?

Volunteer to contact area churches or community groups as we recruit new donors.

Donate or volunteer to help us fundraise for the \$9,090 needed to ship our shoeboxes. (We are still in need of \$7,205 to reach our goal.)

Volunteer to help count and organize packing party donations.

Start packing your shoeboxes NOW rather than waiting until November.

Pray for these local efforts to pack shoeboxes as well as for the children who will receive these gifts.

We will not have a one-day packing party this year. Instead we will pack boxes as donations come in. Packing party donations may be dropped off in the church office during regular office hours.

#### **Current Packing Party needs:**

School supplies: 730 boxes crayons/colored pencils, pencil sharpeners, and scissors

Hygiene items: 760 bars soap & washcloths; combs/brushes

Clothing: underwear, shoes, and socks for boys and girls (all sizes)

WOW items: toys, stuffed animals, soccer balls & pumps, tools, etc.

#### Live Worship Service

After meeting with the safety team we feel that it is a good time to return to Live worship. We understand if you still feel it too soon to return. We will also continue to closely monitor any rise in COVID cases. If there is a rise in our area the safety team will make a quick decision as to weather or not we close again and everyone will be notified through Facebook, the church website and a letter as soon as possible.

#### The Following rules must be followed in order for us to return:

- -Please only come to the service you were invited to.
- -No one can arrive more than fifteen minutes early for their service.
- -Everyone must enter through the front doors (North entrance), regardless of where you park.
- -Everyone must be wearing a mask before you can enter the building. (With the exception of babies or toddlers) If you need a mask there will be some near the entrance. Please grab the first one on the end don't dig to find a different one because yours has flowers on it. A free will offering box will be available if you'd like to donate for your mask. (We do have some smaller masks for toddlers and little kids if parents would like one.) If you refuse to wear a mask you will not be allowed in the building.
- -Everyone must sit where the ushers seat you. It is not likely that you will sit where you always sit. You will be seated in the order you arrive. (Please be patient, this is temporary.) Please sit and wait for service, don't wander around church. We are still asked to practice social distancing. You may use the restroom if necessary. The yellow restrooms, located on the same level as the library and the restroom in Wesley Hall will be open for use.
- -All Bibles, Hymnals, Visitor cards, pens and offering envelopes have been removed from the pews in order to make sanitation between services easier. If you need envelopes for offering please get some in the office some time during the week or use your own and have them ready before service. Offering boxes will be available as you exit worship.
- -When worship has finished everyone will be excused in the same way in which we do communion. The ushers will dismiss by row. When dismissed please leave immediately. Don't stop to talk with anyone. If you need to talk please call the person or perhaps meet in the park across the street from the church. We need everyone off church grounds as soon as we possibly can in order to prepare for the next service.

Everyone must exit through the south doors near the parking lot. (Again regardless of where you parked.)

-Last but not least, please do not stop to talk to pastor. He would love to talk to everyone but he has to continue to social distance as well. He will be in his office and he'll wave as you exit church but his office will be locked. If you need to speak with him please call or email. pastorphil@umcmanchester.com or 563-927-4439.




