A note from Pastor Phil...

Chimes March 2021

Now Jesus was going up to Jerusalem. On the way, he took the Twelve aside and said to them, "We are going up to Jerusalem, and the Son of Man will be delivered over to the chief priests and the teachers of the law. They will condemn him to death and will hand him over to the Gentiles to be mocked and flogged and crucified. On the third day he will be raised to life!" - Matthew 20:17-19

Mom always said there would be days like this...

A word of warning to young parents is to never leave a spare piece of lumber lying around.

When I was growing up in southern Arizona, we would ride our bikes everywhere year-round. One of our favorite boyhood activities was to find a board, some bricks, line up trash cans and build a ramp. The neighborhood hero was always the one who could jump the most trash cans with their bike. For head protection we turned our ball caps around. We trusted in our natural survival instincts over the laws of gravity, what's the worst that could happen? If my mother caught us in our driveway she would come out and say, "that's enough, somebody is going to get hurt!" Then we would pick up our ramp and move to the next house until that mom got after us. Eventually, someone would inevitably miscalculate the (mass X motion= Distance) and there would be an epic collision. Then we would tear down the ramp, get our wounded friend home, and hide the board so we could start again the next day. For some reason we would never learn, nor would we live as if our mother's prophecy had any validity.

In our scripture above Jesus informs us the way of God's redemption for humanity. It would seem to be rather straightforward and easy to understand. Yet, from the gospel stories do we not witness Jesus betrayed, denied, and abandoned? On the third day, didn't everybody seem surprised to see Jesus again? Why did the disciples continue to live as if Jesus' prophecy lacked validity?

How has the grace received by Jesus' crucifixion and our hope in eternity assured in resurrection transformed our lives? Do we live into a witness of thanksgiving? Do we experience heart rending repentance when we fail? Knowing that Jesus' sacrifice is for all of humanity do we love deeper, forgive more, and share our abundance with our neighbors? Do we share our witness so that others may hear and believe? Do we do this consistently? Do we live every day and share in every relationship a witness that Jesus' sacrifice for us has validity?

I invite all who are connected to this church family to make a priority of worship and sharing in our Lenten bible study this season, either live or online. Then we shall walk this journey together supporting, encouraging, and holding one another accountable so that we will proclaim our faith and thanksgiving in God's plan of redeeming creation. Amen

MUMC Single Board February 16, 2021 6:00 p.m. via Zoom

Present: Ruth Voshell, Pastor Phill, Bruce Nodurft, Mark Reth, Janine Stellick, Jean Gross, Wayne Birkenholz, Pam Vap, Mike Wade, Bill Scanlan, Kathy Dolan, Charles Dighton.

Chairman Mark Reth opened the meeting with three scripture verses: "For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God." Romans 3:23; "For the wages of sin is death, but the gracious gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord." Romans 6:23 and "You see that a person is justified by works and not by faith alone." James 2:4. The main point of these scriptures is that it is impossible for us to earn or work our way to Heaven. It is only by God's grace through faith in Jesus Christ, but we must put our faith into actions.

Prayers and praises were lifted up followed by a prayer for guidance by Pastor Phil.

Finance:

1. To fulfill our budget needs we need approximately \$21,000/mo and \$2500/mo for apportionments. The first four Sundays in January generated \$15,093 income with expenses of \$13,343 without apportionments.

2. Donna Tenhoff memorials so far have generated \$315 for the Brick by Brick Campaign. The Brick by Brick fund has \$106,655 in the bank at this time with additional monies from January.

3. SCRIP has given checks in the amount of \$1500 for the general fund and \$1470.75 for the education fund from Fareway SCRIP sales designated for education.

4. Application has been made for the yearly education monies from the Donald Reth Endowment Fund.

5. We will be looking at a different lease agreement for our copy machine usage that doesn't charge for under usage. Trustees will address this.

Trustees: The north entrance to the church has a leak and that door is closed off for now.

Worship: Matt German has been consulted regarding the sound board and steps necessary to have live worship online. The Worship budget has the \$400-600 for live streaming. The sound board is 15 years old and is needing to be updated. The cost to do this will be \$2000 for parts plus labor. The speakers and amplifiers seem to be in good condition at this time. Bruce notified the board that there is designated memorial dollars specifically for this purpose available to cover the expected cost. **Christian Ed.:** The Lenten study and/or devotional is *Embracing the Uncertain* and is available from Kat in the office. A free will offering is helpful as the cost of the books is \$10 each. Ash Wednesday starts this week, February 17. There will be a service at the church that evening.

Missions: Wayne reported that the Delaware County Circuit met recently to look at mission opportunities that can be done together with the involved churches. Ideas are welcome.

Reaching and Receiving: Janine is looking at gift bags for those visitors to our church as the mugs are about gone and gift bags would be less expensive to maintain. We will need updated church information for the bags as well as other items. She has a small supply of wooden crosses to include in the bags and would welcome ideas.

Congregational Care: Pam said the Safety Committee met recently and the decision was made to maintain masking for the 8:30 service but masking will not be required at the 10:00 service. All doors of the church can be used for coming and going. A letter is going out to the congregation regarding this change. The Valentine Dinner was cooked by Susan and Becca Hermann and delivered with help to about 25 people who signed up.

Our next meeting will be Tuesday, March 16, 2021 at 6:04 p.m. Meeting adjourned at 7:25 with Pastor Phil giving a closing prayer. Respectfully submitted,

Our church Safety Team met this afternoon to review our Covid Protocols for the church building and programs. I am pleased to announce that the Safety Team feels comfortable in updating some of our restrictions as we mover ever closer to our new...old...normal. These are the changes we will begin on February 21st, 2021.

- The door restrictions have been removed, you may now enter and exit at whatever door is most convenient for you and all bathrooms are open for use.
- The 8:30 service will continue requiring masks, but the 10:00 service is now mask optional.

Social Distancing will continue in the sanctuary for both services.

We will continue to maintain no fellowship or meals in the church building and ask that the congregation does not meet to chat in the halls as we would still like to maintain our social distancing as much as possible.

Small groups, bible studies, and Sunday school classes are welcome to meet. Social distancing will still be required, but mask requirements will be up to the individual classes. It is up to all small group leaders, teachers, participants, and or parents to decide if they are ready to return to these faith development opportunities.
