MUMC Single Board June 22, 2021 6:10PM Wesley Hall

Mark Reth called the meeting to order.

Finance: Bruce updated the balances for the Remodel and the Wesley Hall floor. Actual expenses Y-T-D with apportionments are \$90,754 and actual income Y-T-D is \$89,349 leaving a deficit of \$1,405. No apportionments have been paid so far for the year. The Brick-by-Brick campaign so far has \$112,945 in the account.

Trustees: A new ice machine has been ordered and will be installed after the floor has been completed. Second Helpings will be sharing in the cost of the ice machine. The survey for the fencing project has been started, but the construction is on hold until lumber prices drop. Charlie also requested names for Trustee membership as there have been several resignations.

Worship: The sound board is being delayed because of a shortage of computer chips.

Christian Ed: West Delaware Community School is requesting help with the Backpack program this year. This will be presented to congregation and then there will be 2 special giving Sundays.

Missions: The Backpack program will be part of the Youth Mission. UMCOR is requesting help with the Chain Saw & Rebuild Team. Chain saw certification will be at ST. Paul's in Cedar Rapids. The tool trailer will be here on Sunday for everyone to check out the contents. Planning a chili cook-off fund raiser on November 13 in Wesley Hall.

Reaching & Receiving: The visitor bags will be ready for services on July 4.

Congregational Care: The possibility of setting up a Little Food Pantry was presented. This would be by the garden.

Staff Parish: There has been a request by members to get the nursery opened for services. In order to staff the nursery, there will be the need for 2 helpers for each service. Request has been made for the possibility paid positions on a contract basis. This will be investigated further.

Pastor Phil closed by reading Psalm 62 and asking each member present to voice their opinion on the reading.

Mission Project: The First 1,000 Days of Life

This year's VBS mission project is a partnership with World Vision to provide alpacas for Ecuador. Due to the soft pads on their hooves, alpacas are wonderful for the fragile, spongy soil of the Andes. These gentle, fleecy creatures provide excellent fertilizer for gardens, which are typically difficult to cultivate in the rugged mountains. To a family in Ecuador, an alpaca means around 10 pounds of fleece a year that can be spun and knit into clothes or sold for a profit for the family. Since alpacas live for around 20 years, that's a lot of fleece! Adding alpacas to a family's farm can be enough to transform a family's circumstances and even that of an entire community, as additional funds pay for education, food, housing, and medical help. A\$10 donation provides an Ecuadorian family with an alpaca that will warm their bodies, nourish their crops, and improve their financial outlook. Our goal is to raise \$250 representing the 25 children we had registered for our virtual VBS last summer.

Disaster Relief Pictured Rocks District

Our neighbors here in Iowa are still working to overcome the natural disaster from the derecho last August. Almost a year later we still have over 500 homes in the Cedar Rapids area that need chainsaw work and repairs. Due to a lack of insurance, or being under insured, many of our neighbors are just not able to overcome this setback without the help of God's people.

The Picture Rocks District Disaster Coordinators are organizing a work blitz week for July 16th through the 21st. We need volunteers for chainsaw work, cleanup, as well as rehabbing damage in homes.

You are invited to participate either as a day worker or we have made arrangements to house overnight volunteers at St. Paul's UMC in Cedar Rapids. (1340 3rd Ave. SE). You can come and go as it fits your schedule. Meals will be provided for overnight volunteers at a cost of \$15 per day, plus a \$10.00 overnight fee for the hosting church, and an additional one time cost of \$10.00 for the T-shirt. (Yes, there will be special T-shirts!)

Overnight Volunteer's will be sleeping on Sunday school room floors so you will be responsible for your own bedding, mattress, ect.

Day Workers will have a one time charge of \$10.00 for the T-shirt and we ask that you bring your own lunches.

All chainsaw cutters must be UMCOR certified. We will be training and certifying for chainsaw cutting on Friday night July 16th and Sunday night July 18th. You need only to attend one training to be certified. Training will be from 6:00 to 8:00 either night at St Paul's UMC in Cedar Rapids, Iowa. (1340 3rd Ave. SE) All chainsaw cutters must provide their own personal chainsaws.

You may bring your own tools, but our disaster trailers are stocked with all the tools you should need as well.

All volunteers must fill out a registration form located on the Manchester UMC website located at <u>www.umcmanchester.com</u> just click into the link from the home page. All registrations need to be turned in at the time of registration as you are checking into the blitz event on your first day. Please provide one original and one copy of each registration. If you are a day worker working more than one day, we only need the registration form turned in the first day you work. All day workers must be checked into St. Paul's UMC by 8:00 AM. The work day on site will be from 9:00 AM to 4:00 PM.

Wesley Hall Floor

Because of the pandemic and the limited use of our church building, it is highly unlikely that many of you have been in Wesley Hall during the past year. If you were to take a look at that floor, you would not be favorably impressed. Neither would any of our guests or prospective members.

Many efforts have been made to clean the tile floor, but those efforts have not been successful. The floor is stained and dirty.

Secondly, some of the tile have broken and needed to be removed. A rug currently hides that area from view.

Therefore, at its regular meeting on Tuesday, April 20, the Single Board authorized the

trustees to move forward with their proposal to replace the floor tile in Wesley Hall and the overflow area. The church has some monies that can be used to finance this project but the Board is asking you, the members of the congregation, to consider a gift towards this project. The estimates received (which are over a year old) exceed \$30,000.

Why so costly? The answer is asbestos. The floor tile contains asbestos and the major expense is the safe removal and disposal of those tiles.

Now, please understand that the work to be undertaken in Wesley Hall, the overflow area, and the kitchen <u>are not</u> part of the remodel project (Brick-by-Brick) approved by you.

Therefore, none of the funds received in the Brick-by-Brick campaign will be appropriated to this new project.

So we are asking you to please give this issue some prayerful consideration and if you feel you can support the Wesley Hall project financially, we would be grateful. Mail or bring your check to the office or place it in the offering plate if you choose. Please note on the memo line that your donation is for the Wesley Hall floor.

Second Helpings and the Clothing Closet were operating at times during the pandemic. The August derecho brought forth needs for many who lived in the path of that storm. Your Church responded by deploying a chain saw team to assist. There are certain to be other events happen where those in our community will be affected by fires, storms or flooding. The need for a Disaster Response Team will be seen and we will be working to create a Delco Circuit team to address those needs.

A recent event demonstrated the need for a "missions" mindset. An older

gentleman in Dundee had a fire in his home that rendered it uninhabitable. Red Cross offered temporary shelter for several days. But there were othered needs. Pastor Phil, on the behalf of our church offered clothing from the Clothing Closet, an additional nights lodging and meal money. This is what God calls us to do, be a blessing to others.
