

A note from Pastor Phil...

But when the kindness and love of God our Savior appeared, he saved us, not because of righteous things we had done, but because of his mercy. He saved us through the washing of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit, whom he poured out on us generously through Jesus Christ our Savior, so that, having been justified by his grace, we might become heirs having the hope of eternal life. - Titus 3:4-7

Paul wrote this letter to his disciple Titus somewhere around 63 AD shortly after Paul was released from his first imprisonment in Rome. Titus had traveled to Crete to assist Paul in establishing churches there, and Paul is writing a letter of pastoral instruction and encouragement. The focus of the letter is to encourage young Titus to stand firm against false teaching and to encourage right living through the careful attention to theological truth.

I want to focus on the scripture above from chapter 4 verses 4-7... Hear these words... When Jesus appeared (resurrection) we had the assurance of our salvation... Not because of what we had done- but because of Christ's mercy... Through the free gift of grace we are washed eternally clean through the Holy Spirit- which has been lavished upon us generously. And we can stand boldly before God in judgment justified as we have been clothed in the righteousness of the Savior. We are eternal Children of God! This is Good News! What more can we hope for? In our human condition, unfortunately, we will find a way... A way that shall lead us to false teaching.

You see, in our human condition we all fall short of our own salvational righteousness. The ridiculously Good News of grace! But in grace we are called to "Right Living" and this is where we stumble. Yes, Lord, I sin- but I have a very good reason! In fact, for me my sin should not be sin at all! And thus we begin to negotiate our grace with the Savior. But what are we negotiating? The bill has been paid, what more do we want? We want that the bill was never actually necessary. In doing so, what we are really saying is that we want the Divine to look/act/respond more like us. I guess my question would be why? In my life I know love- but it is a love that is less than pure... Why would I not want to experience a greater perfect love? I know peace in my life- times without outward conflict... But why would I not want to experience the perfect peace of being at peace with God? Why do I seek to diminish the most wonderful eternal gift, so that it might look like what I desire? When I know God's desires for me are so much more than I could possibly fathom. I am justified (made acceptable) to God by grace! Why is grace not enough? We must humble ourselves and allow God to speak into our lives trusting in God's way being that which we shall know life in the full. As I look out in our world today-pandemic-fear-isolation-virtue signaling- and the threat of war, I pause and wonder should we really try and overwrite God's will with our own?

Lord, may Your grace be enough for me. Prepare me as a vessel of your truth and peace so that others will come to know You through my witness and believe. This, Lord, shall be the greatest life I could possibly know, and will be more than enough for me. Amen.

MUMC Single Board January 18, 2022 6:00 p.m. (Via Zoom)

Present: Mark Reth, Jean Gross, Ruth Voshell, Bruce Nodurft, Bill Scanlan, Mike Wade, Charlie Dighton, Kathy Dolan, Wayne Birkenholz.

Mark Reth called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. He opened with a devotion from Colossians 4:1, "Masters, provide for your slaves with what is right and fair, because you know that you also have a Master in heaven." We need to remember that no matter whom we work for, and no matter who works for us, the One we ultimately should want to please is our Father in heaven. We are accountable to Him.

Finance: Bruce reported that the end of year giving for December amounted to over \$32,000. With all the expenses for 2021 paid and apportionment monies in reserve there is a surplus of \$11,200. Thanks is extended to our church family for their generous giving this past year. The Brick-by-Brick campaign gained \$5,725 in December. There is \$119,845 in that fund to date. The deed and title to the Al Remling house should be in our hands hopefully by February 1st. The trust will pay the insurance premium on the house for February. The abstract has been updated and is in the F&M bank box for the church. There will be a Church Conference at 11:45 a.m. on January 23rd to vote on accepting the Remling house as a gift and to allow the Single Board to make the decisions on what to do with the asset. Bruce has been keeping the memorial records for our church for the past 25 years, acknowledging those who have shared memorial monies with us. On

December 30, 2021 we received a check in the amount of \$10,000 from the trust of Maylo Dittmer who passed in 1988. These monies had a previous designation that has disbanded and therefore this amount was then designated to us if/when that should happen. The Dittmer's were very active members in our church many years ago.

Trustees: Charlie reported that the elevator has been repaired. Trustees are looking for someone to maintain the new Wesley Hall flooring on a regular basis. Two of the boilers have had the same part needing repair and that work has been done. Three new A/C units will be ordered for Wesley Hall. It may take up to a year for them to be delivered due to a backlog in orders.

Missions: Wayne reported an additional generous donation has been made to Heifer Project and will be sent.

Lay Ministry: Bill is looking for people who would like to bring people to church if they are in need of a ride and are willing to help them stay connected to our church body.

Mark spoke briefly on a survey being asked for by the conference. We need more information before consideration. Someone should be coming go our March board meeting from the Iowa Conference Board of Congregational Excellence to share information with us before we proceed.

Next meeting will be February 15 at 6:00pm in Wesley Hall.

New Year...New Type of Script!

The scrip team is pleased to announce we have a new option: online ordering using a phone app called RaiseRight. By using this you can get any gift cards offered as e-scrip by our company, Great Lakes Scrip, via your phone app rather than having to wait until you are at church on Sunday to buy or order cards. It's very easy to use, you can buy what you need then use it on the spot, and every time you make a purchase your church earns money!

How to get started with RaiseRight:

Go to the App Store and download the RaiseRight app Follow the prompts:

- set up your name, password and security questions
- you will need MUMC's enrollment code to be sure the profits go to us: 54B4C6C54875
- after you receive a text with the verification code, enter that code
- link your form of payment; bank account and / or credit card

- local banks aren't listed, so click "Don't see your bank?" then put in the name and routing and account numbers


- you will have to wait a day or less to receive two small deposits and debits
- after that is done, go to "Complete setup"

The prompts are easy to follow and it will take just a few minutes to set up (aside from waiting for the bank info to go through).

How to use RaiseRight:

You will see various options for browsing the gift card options. If you know what you want, just use "What are you looking for?" at the top.

When you choose the business, you will see that they offer both eGift cards and physical cards, or perhaps just



one of those. <u>ONLY</u> those that show "eGift Card" are available to use in the app! If they only offer the physical gift card you will need to buy those through our scrip program at church. (Dairy Queen is an example of this).

To make the purchase, put your choice(s) in the cart, checkout when ready, select your payment options, then "Place Order". There is a 15ϕ fee for each debit transaction or a 2.6% fee for credit card use.

Go to your Wallet and in a few minutes you will see the scrip you just added (along with previous purchases). It's ready to use! You'll also see how much your purchase contributed to the church - a nice reminder of why to use MUMC scrip!

What if I don't have a smart phone or don't want to use an app?

Don't worry - we will continue to sell physical gitt cards at church. Some businesses either aren't part of ShopWithScrip, our national company, orare only local so we will continue to have those. Fareway is an example of this - physical cards will continue to be the only option.

What if I need help getting RaiseRight set up?

We can help with that! Give Kat in the office a call and she'll put you in touch with help.
