A note from Pastor Phil...

I usually wake up on Sunday morning excited. It's a day of worship with all my church family. We will share in God's Word, we will sing God's praise, and we will share together the joys and sorrows in our lives. But this last Sunday I awoke less than motivated. In fact I was perhaps even a bit overwhelmed by all the news of the day. We are in the third year of a pandemic and people are still afraid. A sovereign free nation has been invaded by a war mongering neighbor that has destabilized our sense of security. How will I tell the story of farmers, teachers, and bankers leaving their families in hopeful safety as they take to the streets with borrowed guns from a government under siege. Can we empathize? Lord, from where do we find our good news?

MUMC Single Board February 15, 2022 6:00 p.m. Wesley Hall

Present: Ruth Voshell, Sherry Goranson, Wayne Birkenholz, Charlie Dighton, Kathy Dolan, Bruce Nodurft, Pastor Phil, Mark Reth, Mike Wade, Jean Gross.

Mark Reth opened the meeting with a devotion and reading of Matthew 6:5-8. He reminded us that when we pray we should go to a private room and pray quietly to God rather than "babbling" in front of others or on the street corner desiring only to be seen. Our Father in heaven knows what we need even before we ask.

Prayers and praises were lifted up followed by a prayer for guidance from Pastor Phil. Mark excused himself at this point and Kathy Dolan proceeded to conduct the meeting.

Finance: Bruce gave the Financial Report that showed our actual income for January was \$19,948 and the actual expenses were \$20,887 including apportionments. Giving for January of this year was up almost \$5000 from last year. Brick by Brick has cash on hand of \$120,370 at this point which is a \$525 increase. All expenses have been paid for Wesley Hall and the new carpeting. Charge Conference held January 23, 2022 unanimously approved the gift from the Al Remling trust and gave Single Board permission to disperse of that property and contents. A total of \$26,401.92 is presently in the 03 account created for proceeds from his trust. All papers have been signed with the church lawyer and are in the church's lock box at F&M Bank. All utilities have been changed also. There will be a check coming from the Don Reth Endowment fund which will go to Christian Education.

Action Item: Recommendation coming from Finance to give Single Board the permission to liquidate the holdings of Al Remling's property i.e. contents of the house and garage. Approved unanimously.

Trustees: The new ice maker will be installed within a month. A gift of \$1000 has come from Second Helpings to help pay for the upkeep of the new Wesley Hall floor. Someone will be hired to wet mop it weekly and materials have been ordered for that to happen. We need to consider having it buffed as needed also. There is a buffer in the basement. The insurance on Al's house has been switched to Dolan Insurance. There was discussion as to where the rubber mats from the kitchen went during the flooring project as they need to be returned or replaced.

Missions: Wayne spoke again briefly about the Paint by Neighbor mission project being planned for this summer. Look for more information as this develops. May 1st there will be a luau after second service in Wesley Hall with the proceeds to go to Wesley Hall maintenance. Our church has been contacted by Seeds of Hope to take part in their mission. Delaware county has two fields that are being used at the present time. All help and expenses will be paid or donated locally. 100% of the proceeds from this goes to international missions to help in undeveloped countries. Several churches in our area participate in this project and we hope to be added to that number.

SP/PRC Mike spoke briefly about someone possibly coming in March or later to speak to Single Board from the Iowa Conference Board of Congregational Excellence. Mike will be in charge of that discussion as chair of SP/PRC and a board member.

Congregational Care: Sherry shared a report from this team. The health clinic is going well and 20 people were served carry outs for a Valentine Dinner. Two willow tree angels were given to two families who recently lost a loved one. Several cards of blessing were sent to those in need.

Pastor Phil: Pastor had several items for us to think about before the March meeting. 1) Who do we hire to mop Wesley Hall? There is a person interested in doing this. 2) What do we do about the nursery? We are having no success getting nursery attendants and someone needs to be hired. The same person(s) cannot continue to do it every time one is needed. 3) The Single Board needs to have a policy for how to handle unrestricted gifts left to the church. We have received several larger gifts in the last

month or so. We need to have a policy for when this happens. He would like to suggest that we tithe (10%) of what is received. Beyond that how do we break it down. More discussion will be needed and we are open to suggestions.

Pastor has applied for a couple of grants which have been or will be received that will pay for a used boom on a trailer for the Disaster Team. All their equipment is stored at the Delaware County Shop building at Delaware. A grant was also applied for to help with the expenses of the vegetable gardens.

Our next meeting will be on Tuesday, March 15, 2022 at 6:00 p.m. in Wesley Hall. Meeting adjourned at 8:20 p.m. followed by the Lord's Prayer and singing of the Doxology.



Al Remling's House and More

On Sunday, January 23, charge conference approved two recommendations regarding Al Remling's gift to the church—his house, garage, and all the contents thereof. The first recommendation approved was to accept this gift. The second recommendation to empower Single Board to determine the fate of this gift was also approved.

On Friday, January 29, papers were signed and recorded at the court house giving the church legal possession of Al's property located at 709 East Butler Street here in Manchester.

On Tuesday, February 15, Single Board approved a motion from finance to liquidate the contents of Al's house and garage. No action was taken as to the future of the property. Current thoughts are to put some of the contents of the house for sale in an auction, and others to be included in a garage sale. Other items will simply be discarded or given away. Regardless of how they will be disposed of, there are many, many items to be dealt with. It will be an enormous task. Please watch for announcements regarding opportunities for you to help in bringing items from upstairs down to the main level, bringing items up from the basement, sorting items, etc. Your assistance will be greatly appreciated.

Scrip Committee Donation

At the early church service on Sunday, February 20, the scrip committee presented two checks to the church. These were profits from the sale of scrip. The amount of the first check was \$1,265.25. This was the profit from the sale of Fareway scrip. Since Fareway mandates that profits from their scrip be used for Christian education, this money has been credited to our Education Fund. The second check for \$2,500.00 was profit from the sale of the other various types of scrip that were sold. This money was deposited in the General Fund.

On behalf of the entire congregation, I wish to thank all of the members of the scrip committee for these donations and also for their service to this worthwhile project. I also would like to thank all the members of the congregation who support the program by purchasing scrip.
