

A note from Pastor Phil...

42 They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer. 43 Everyone was filled with awe at the many wonders and signs performed by the apostles. 44 All the believers were together and had everything in common. 45 They sold property and possessions to give to anyone who had need. 46 Every day they continued to meet together in the temple courts. They broke bread in their homes and ate together with glad and sincere hearts, 47 praising God and enjoying the favor of all the people. And the Lord added to their number daily those who were being saved. -Acts 2:42-47

On Pentecost- right after Peter's "Easter Sermon" on the temple steps and the speaking of tongues, we have this scripture from Acts 2:42-47. This is what it looks like to respond to the Easter message of grace in crucifixion and eternity assured in resurrection. The believers came together, broke bread and shared in each other's favor. All the while praising God for what He has done- is doing- and has yet to do. On May 1st The mission Committee will host the inaugural Manchester UMC Luau with smoked pork with all the fixins. There will be a pie auction as well as a silent auction. All proceeds to assist our mission team in helping people from this unique place.

On June 12th we will have a fellowship event at Backbone State Park where we will come together with other churches of the Circuit with fishing, hiking, biking, board and card games, cornhole, youth games and kiddie games. Then we will share in BBQ burgers and hot dogs and finish with a short devotional. This will give us an opportunity to share in fellowship with our church family as well as connect with our circuit church families.

Then on July 27th we will restart our Ice Cream Social- proceeds for mission ministries.

It is time for us to re-engage as a church family and come together for worship in our sanctuary, and to break bread together in fellowship in joy and thanksgiving.

Pastor Phil called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. followed by prayers and concerns. He led us in a devotional about why we do communion and what it represents not only in the Methodist Church but in other denominations as well. Communion represents redemption, peace with God and spiritual joy through the new covenant. Jesus ushered in the Messianic Period. We remember what Jesus has done, is still doing and will continue to do in our lives.

Toby Tutton was introduced as our new Reaching chairperson. Pastor is looking for someone to fill the Receiving slot.

Finance: Bruce reported our actual income for March was \$22,251 and our actual expenses with apportionments were \$21,485. We are ahead of last year's income for the time period of January to March. Our Brick by Brick campaign has had a \$3,325 increase and is now at \$124,220 cash on hand. Bruce presented us some finance recommendations which will be acted on at the May single board meeting.

Trustees: The icemaker is now installed and working. The parsonage water heater needed to be replaced. A new shredder for the Finance office will be purchased by Ruth.

The balcony painting has been completed. A new vacuum has been purchased for our janitor. Dusty Ingalls has been hired to clean the Wesley Hall floor every other week at a rate of \$40 per cleaning.

Missions: Wayne reminded us of the upcoming Luau meal on May 1 at noon with the proceeds going to the summer mission project. There will be a meal, silent auction and live pie auction.

Congregational Care: Sherry gave us an update on the improvements made in the Chapel on the upper level of the east wing. This room has been converted into a Prayer Room to be used for times of prayer as well as a Bible Study area for small groups. New light fixtures will be installed to brighten the room. Prayer request cards will again be available to be put in the prayer box.

The rest of the meeting was spent gathering input for the *Another Set of Eyes* report which is due May 1st to lowa Annual Conference. The purpose of this tool is to strengthen the relationship between Staff/Pastor/Parish to help clergy identify ways that they can change to grow and improve their ministry. The input from Single Board and Pastor Phil will be tabulated and reported to the Conference.

We will be going to one service at 8:30 a.m. starting on June 5. The time chosen is necessary so that the service can be broadcast on the radio that evening. May 7 a group from our church will be going to a live broadcast of the Methodist Global meeting in Indianapolis at the Methodist Church in Fayette. The meeting starts at 10:00 a.m. and goes to 12:00 at which time lunch will be served followed by a time of conversation from 1:00-2:00 p.m. June 12 a Circuit Full Fellowship Event time is being scheduled at Backbone. A shelter has been reserved. Fun events at 2:00, supper at 4:30, devotions at 5:30 and finish by 6:15.

Our next Single Board meeting will be on May 17, 2022 at 6:00 p.m. in Wesley Hall. Meeting adjourned at 8:20 p.m. Respectfully submitted,



DONALD HAROLD RETH ENDOWMENT

In 2001 the Manchester United Methodist Church lost a longtime faithful servant when Don Reth passed away. In 2003, to honor her brother, Bertha Tribuno established the **Donald Harold Reth Endowment** as a tribute to his life and to keep his memory alive in a special way. The sole purpose of the Reth Endowment fund is to generate income for our Christian Education program. Christian Education is the focus because Don's wife Marlene and his daughter Tammy had served as Sunday school teachers and as Sunday school superintendents.

The Reth Endowment is established through the Iowa United Methodist Foundation. On an annual basis, the Foundation informs MUMC of the income available for distribution. The maximum amount made available is 5% of the current fund balance. This year the amount was \$318.00.

When the Reth Endowment was established, Manchester United Methodist Church was asked to annually recognize the establishment and existence of the endowment by placing a letter in the May edition of the <u>Chimes</u>. Don's birthday was May 7th. The publication of this letter fulfills our commitment to do so.

The Donald Harold Reth Endowment is an individually owned fund meaning that it is not owned by MUMC and that the church cannot alter the terms of the agreement between the Foundation and Ms. Tribuno. However, anyone who would like to contribute to the Reth Endowment may do so.

MUMC has also established its own endowment fund. The **Manchester United Methodist Endowment** has been in existence since 2005. This is a church owned fund and we direct the use of the earnings. Since it currently is a rather small fund, it is thought of as "seed money" and all of the income earned thus far has been reinvested in the endowment. The hope is that at some time in the future this fund will grow to a point where the income earned can be withdrawn and used to help meet the needs of MUMC.

As with the Reth Endowment, anyone who desires may make a contribution to the MUMC Endowment. If you would like to make a contribution to an existing endowment, would like to establish your own endowed fund, or have questions regarding endowments, feel free to contact any of the individuals named below.
