# A note from Pastor Phil...

## Then, because so many people were coming and going that they did not even have a chance to eat, he said to them, "Come with me by yourselves to a quiet place and get some rest." - Mark 6:31

August is an unusual time in the life of the church. So far this summer we have had a Garden of Hope planted, a Luau, a week of Paint By neighbor, Garden of Hope harvest, Vacation bible School, a new Small Food Pantry placed by the garden, and an Ice Cream Social. Meanwhile our regular ministries of the Clothing Closet, 2nd Helpings, Quilters and Sewers, Garden Team, Youth Group, Contemporary Band and everyone involved in worship on Sunday and WOW continued without interruption. We have hosted Boy Scout Troops, 4-H clubs, County Food Bank, and Book Clubs. There is probably more but y'all get the point. What makes August unusual is that the fair is over, mission projects complete, VBS concluded and many of these things begin to wind down as we prepare to enter into our "normal" time the Sunday after Labor Day when Sunday School, Choir, OCC, and other small groups get back together to proclaim the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

So August is as close as we are going to get to a time of rest! In our scripture today Jesus had sent out the 12 Disciples on their first evangelical missions to speak of eternity in repentance and grace, and to perform miracles and signs so that people will know and believe. The Disciples went forth and they too had a busy summer. Now the Disciples return filled with wonder and awe, but also fatigued from their work. Jesus invites them, Come with me to a quiet place and get some rest... Is this just physical rest? No, Jesus is inviting them to a time of spiritual rest as well. What's the difference? In physical rest we must give ourselves over to setting aside the demands on our bodies and be prepared to close our eyes and give ourselves over to slumber. In spiritual rest we must set aside all the distractions and demands on our lives, read and contemplate scripture, and close our eyes in prayer... And give ourselves over to the Holy Spirit to refill us, to mold and make us into a greater image of the Savior. A better servant for God's people, better prepared to inform others of the miracles, wonders, and signs of our Redeemer so that they may know and believe.

Jesus leaves us this example and invitation "come with Me to a quiet place to rest." Come to worship prepared to rest in the presence of our Savior in Worship, open your bible and engage with the Holy Spirit in scripture, let us bow our heads, and fold our hands in prayer. Come and find our rest and open our hearts and minds to the work of the Spirit, drawing near to the nature and character of our Savior. Amen

#### MUMC Single Board July 19, 2022 6:00 p.m. - Wesley Hall

**Present:** Charlie Dighton, Wayne Birkenholz, Ruth Voshell, Bruce Nodurft, Shirley Davis, Bill Scanlan, Lori Snyder, Janine Stellick, Kathy Dolan, Sherry Goranson, Pastor Phil, Mark Reth, Jean Gross.

Chair Mark Reth called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. The devotional he gave was from Luke 2:10-11. These two verses from the Christmas story according to Luke remind us that God brings us tidings of great joy which will be for all people, just as our church is decorated for this week's Bible School where we welcome all children to come and celebrate the wonderful things God has in store for us. Prayers and praises were lifted up followed by a prayer for guidance by Pastor Phil.

**Finance:** Bruce shared the financial report for June which has shown an improvement over last month's report. YTD actual expenses amount to \$125,881 with apportionments and actual income is \$129,041 leaving a slight surplus. Giving for this year is considerably ahead of last year. Brick by Brick campaign currently has a balance of \$122,795 after some expenses were paid toward upgrading the bathrooms. Bruce reminded everyone to be sure and fill out a green slip and submit any bills you would like compensation for.

**Trustees:** Charlie said the Wesley Hall bathroom roof leak should be repaired. Chair lifts in lieu of an elevator for the east wing are being seriously considered by the trustees. They would be considerably cheaper to install. They have an estimate of \$40,000 for something that could work for those unable to use the steps either up or down. The plan is to eventually move the offices to the east wing lower level and make the current pastor's office a family restroom. **Worship:** Ruth reported that there have been many views of the recent live feeds of two funerals. **Missions:** Wayne reminded us that next week July 27 is the ice cream social.

Action Item: Charlie Dighton moved, seconded by Bill Scanlan to schedule on Sunday, September 18, at 2:00 in the afternoon a concert in the sanctuary followed by dessert in Wesley Hall. All proceeds from the concert will go toward OCC shipping expenses for the packing party. This concert will be advertised locally. Duane Philgreen will head the venue. Motion approved.

**Receiving:** Lori Snyder was welcomed as our new team leader for the Receiving Team. Toby Tutton previously accepted the Reaching Team leadership position.

**Congregational Care:** Sherry reported that their team recently met. Willow Tree angels have been given to the two Tutton families that recently lost loved ones. September 15 will be a luncheon birthday celebration and entertainment for all church members who are 80 years of age or older. Information will be shared in August. **Staff/Parish:** We welcomed Shirley Davis as our new chairperson.

Action Item: A motion was made by Kathy Dolan, seconded by Wayne Birkenholz to hire two contracted employees for the nursery on Sundays for two hours at a rate of \$10/hour for each person. Sadie Stocks has been one

of our nursery attendants and she will help find someone old enough to work with her. Background checks are required as usual. Motion carried unanimously.

Action item: It was motioned by Ruth Voshell, seconded by Charlie Dighton to require anyone wishing to get married in our church use our wedding coordinator which will alleviate unforeseen issues. Motion carried. We are currently looking for someone interested in the coordinator position. Ruth Voshell will look at updating fees charged for weddings to include use of technology.

Pastor Phil discussed creating a new brief but to the point vision statement to replace our current one which is several years old. This new statement needs to be simple and practical. He would also like to schedule another Ministry Fair to get more people involved in the ministries of our church.

Our next meeting is scheduled for August 16, 2022 at 6:00 p.m. in Wesley Hall. Meeting adjourned at 8:00 p.m. followed by the Lord's Prayer and Doxology.

Some time back, the Missions Team decided to create a food pantry to offer food and other products to those in need within our community. The June Mission of the Month was intended to help raise awareness and provide funds for this project. Mission accomplished!

Canned Goods (vegetables, fruit, meats such as tuna, chicken and ham, ready-to-eat meals, etc.) Dry/Boxed Goods (cake mixes, dehydrated milk, dehydrated potatoes, cereals, oat meal, pancake mixes, various pastas, etc.)

Household/Hygiene Items (laundry/dish detergent, soap, deodorant, tooth brushes/paste, cleaning supplies, can opener, etc.)
