A note from Pastor Phil...

5 Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; 6 in all your ways submit to him and he will make your paths straight.

-Proverbs 3:5-6

Recorded in 1st Kings chapter 1 King David shortly before his death chose his son Solomon as the heir to the throne of Israel. Then in 1 Kings chapter 3 God offers King Solomon anything he wants... Could be a long life, great wealth, anything... Solomon asks for wisdom to discern right from wrong and to govern God's people well. God was so pleased with Solomon's request that God blessed him with not only wisdom but many blessings and the people of God thrived under Solomon's authority. Solomon shared some of this timeless wisdom with us recorded in the Book of Proverbs.

We live in a time now that seems to call our attention away from "trusting" God and instead to trust in our own judgment and moral compass... Surely we have evolved to a maturity superior to our Creator, right?

We still find ourselves immersed in the human condition of greed, lust, pride, and selfishness... If only all our moral compasses pointed the same way! Solomon's wisdom tells us " *Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding.*" But where do we find God's intent for our lives? In God's Word- scripture... MUMC Single Board August 16, 2022 6:00 p.m. - Wesley Hall

Present: Sherry Goranson, Wayne Birkenholz, Charlie Dighton, Bruce Nodurft, Shirley Davis, Mark Reth, Pastor Phil, Jean Gross, Lori Snyder, Bill Scanlan.

Chair Mark Reth called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.. The devotional he presented was from Psalm 8. This Psalm reminds us of how we fit into this world and where we can make a difference. The name of our Lord is majestic in all the earth! Prayers and praises were lifted up followed by a prayer for guidance from Pastor Phil.

Finance: Y-T-D actual income is \$150,459 and Y-T-D actual expenses are \$133,088 excluding apportionments. With apportionment payments the actual expenses for the year are \$149,125. Brick by Brick has a total of \$123,670 in that account including July receipts. Finance has decided to not have a pledge campaign this fall due to low response rates from previously. Instead Bruce will address the congregation on August 28 with financial needs for next budget year. Our staff has not received raises for a few years plus there is concern about the large increases in utility bills and how that will affect our budget for next year.

Trustees: Action Item: Recommendation from Trustees to use the leftover funds from Wesley Hall flooring to pay for the three new A/C units in Wesley Hall. Motion carried.

Action Item: Recommendation from Trustees to find a chairperson for the Brick-by-Brick construction as it moves forward. Motion approved. Two chair lifts will be purchased for the east wing in lieu of an elevator which will save a lot of money.

Worship: After much discussion, it was decided to forego Christmas Day services since it falls on a Sunday. There will be three services Christmas Eve.

Missions: The ice cream social netted about \$2,000 for missions which will go to OCC shipping expenses for our shoebox packing party.

Action Item: Recommendations from Trustees, Missions and Finance to purchase the House of David home, repair as needed and use it as a Rahab House. After much discussion, recommendations were carried unanimously. Missions has scheduled a Soup Supper for Saturday, November 12 as a fundraiser for mission projects.

Reaching: Lori is working on revamping the welcome bags and church information which need updating. She would like to consider a new church shirt design and asked the board to bring any previous shirts to look at for ideas.

Congregational Care: Sherry reminded us or the upcoming birthday luncheon for those 80 and over in our congregation which is scheduled for September 15 at noon in Wesley Hall. She also said no one has attended her Health Clinics on designated Sundays and wondered how to proceed.

Staff Parish: : Shirley is continuing to contact people who have served on this team for a time to meet and get things organized. She has previous materials Mike Wade shared with her. We need some new younger people willing to serve on Staff Parish. There is still a need for hiring one more childcare person on Sunday mornings.

Pastor Phil reminded us Charge Conference will be at our church on October 9th at 2:00 p.m.and will encompass the circuit churches (21). Room will need to be found so each group can have meeting space. Pastor also said Dennis can work a few more hours each week. A team of church members has been assembled to check areas of the church which may need attention from the janitorial staff. If anyone sees something in the church that does need attention, it is asked that you please let the pastor know so he can work with staff to address the issue.

Our next meeting will be on September 20, 2022 at 6:00 p.m. in Wesley Hall. We closed at 8:30 with the Lord's Prayer and singing of the Doxology.

Operation Christmas Child Shoebox Tips

Please use one of the red and green GO boxes or a regular size cardboard shoebox.

They are a standard size that packs easily into the shipping cartons at the processing center. While plastic boxes seem practical, many times they break and end up in the "shoebox hospital" at the processing center.

Boy or Girl

Determine the gender and age category: 2-4 years, 5-9 years, or 10-14 years. Attach the appropriate label (from the OCC pamphlet) on the box lid. Once the box is full, put a rubber-band around the box.

Gifts

Please focus on the practical! This one box will be shared with all members of the child's home, neighbors, friends, etc. The one washcloth you include may be used by 10 people living with the child! The simple items you take for granted each day could make all the difference in this child's life! Below are some ideas to get you started.

Non-liquid Hygiene items (These items will be shared by everyone living with the child. That could be 10-20 people!)

Toothbrush

Mild bar soap (leave in packaging & put in a plastic

baggie; Ivory is a great choice because it floats)

Comb

Washcloth

Stick deodorant

Non-liquid lip balm

Adhesive bandages

Nail clippers & file

School Supplies (These could mean the difference in whether or not the child gets to attend school.)

Pens

Pencils (sharpen beforehand if possible) & sharpener

Crayons or markers

Paper (Steno notebooks fit well in shoeboxes)

Solar calculator

Scissors

Glue sticks

Clothing/Accessories

Shirts (plain colors)

Pants

Shorts

Shoes

Socks

Underwear

Hats/mittens

Hair bows

Jewelry

Other

Flashlights & batteries (This could be lifesaving for children escaping war or domestic violence)

Sunglasses

Tools (no saws or pocketknives)

Duct tape

Sewing kit/fabric

Cups, bowls, empty water bottle

Fishing kit

Toys/WOW item (Focus on the practical but still include a few fun items)

Balls (even a deflated soccer ball with a hand pump)

Stuffed animal

Small cars

Yo-yos

Jump ropes

Harmonicas

Puzzles

Binoculars

DO NOT INCLUDE:

Used/damaged items

War-related items (toy guns, knives, military figures, or any action figure holding a weapon)

Candy, chocolate or any type of food (could melt or spoil)

Toothpaste (won't get through cutoms)

Liquids/lotions (containers can break ruining other items in the box)

Medications/vitamins

Breakable items (snow globes, glass containers, etc.)

Aerosol cans

Food Pantry

Some time back, the Missions Team decided to create a food pantry to offer food and other products to those in need within our community. The June Mission of the Month was intended to help raise awareness and provide funds for this project. Mission accomplished!

The Food Pantry is now in place and ready for use. The words on the door spell out our intent. "If You Need Some, Take Some; If You Have Some, Give Some." This project was announced to our community on the July 22nd "Guest of the Day" appearance on KMCH radio.

The pantry is located near the Garden of Hope right beside the old garage in the gravel parking lot. And because it is outside in the elements, we will need to limit items placed in the pantry to non-perishable items. Below is a brief listing of appropriate items.

Canned Goods (vegetables, fruit, meats such as tuna, chicken and ham, ready-to-eat meals, etc.)

Dry/Boxed Goods (cake mixes, dehydrated milk, dehydrated potatoes, cereals, oat meal, pancake mixes, various pastas, etc.)

Household/Hygiene Items (laundry/dish detergent, soap, deodorant, tooth brushes/paste, cleaning supplies, can opener, etc.)
