#### A note from Pastor Phil...

#### Better to live on a corner of the roof than share a house with a quarrelsome wife. - Proverbs 21:9

I have waited patiently for a long time to be able to use this proverb in a devotional or sermon! What King Solomon is saying is that if you have reached a place where disagreement abounds even if there is affection present, get out of the situation before all affection is lost.

This makes me think of the situation we are facing in the UMC right now. There are two sides that have finally reached "irreconcilable differences." This is not a new thing in the Methodist tradition, nor is it even unique in the world of church. John Wesley fathered one church, but today There are seven World Methodist Council denominations in the United States: the African Methodist Episcopal Church; the African Methodist Episcopal Zion Church; the Christian Methodist Episcopal Church; the Church of the Nazarene; the Free Methodist Church; the Wesleyan Church; and the United Methodist Church. How did that happen? At some point there was a revival movement, it did not engage the whole church, and two were formed from one. Usually not a pleasant experience, but when it is concluded may God be glorified in two distinct voices rather than only one.

The United Methodist Church has reached such a place... After 54 years there will be another Methodist expression to choose from. What is important now is for Manchester Methodist Church to define ourselves around the things of biblical authority, covenants, mission, and polity. (How we define ourselves and covenant to live together as a people.) Then it will be up to us to decide if the future trajectory of the UMC fits with who we are and wish to be. To this end we will have three more "Town Hall" meetings.

On November 9 District Superintendents Moody Colorado and Doug Cue, and Ministry Director Bill Poland will come from the Iowa Conference Cabinet to speak about what it means to remain in the future UMC. There will be a meal prepared in Wesley Hall for a free will offering at 5:30, with a time of presentation and questions from 6:15 to 7:30.

On November 16th Grandview pastor Tom Shinkle will come to speak about why now is a time to disaffiliate from the UMC. There will be a meal in Wesley Hall at 5:30 with a free will offering with a presentation and questions from 6:15-7:30.

On Sunday November 20th there will be a time of video presentation from the two points of view with a time for questions to follow.

Single Board is requesting a charge conference with the District Superintendent the first week of December, though we do not have total control of that date. It will be announced as soon as it is known.

It is important that all members be well informed about what has been happening that has brought the church to this place, and what is the best way forward for the future of our church, from this place, going forward. We plan to place videos of the meetings onto the church website.

#### MUMC Single Board October 18, 2022 6:00 p.m. - Wesley Hall

**Present:** Wayne Birkenholz, Kathy Dolan, Charlie Dighton, Ruth Voshell, Bruce Nodurft, Shirley Davis, Lori Snyder, Bill Scanlan, Jean Gross, Pastor Phil.

Kathy opened the meeting followed by a moment of silence and a prayer for guidance from Pastor Phil. **Finance:** Bruce notified the board that the unfunded pension liability for us is \$73,432 but could change at a later date. This amount is more than initially thought. All bills have been paid in regard to the Al Remling bequest and there is a balance of about \$134,000 in that fund. There are many items yet to be sold at auction from the final clean out of the house. We have no date for when that will occur. Rahab House has been paid for and the abstract is in the church lock box. We briefly went through the 2023 Budget which reflects requests from board members and SPPRC. Actual Income YTD is \$192,860 and Actual Expenses are \$187,502 including apportionments. Income for this year is ahead of last year's giving. The Brick-by-Brick Campaign has \$125,920 on hand with \$825 received in September.

**Worship:** Ruth reported that new wiring for the computer system in the sanctuary will be done this week. There was no live feed of last Sunday's service.

**Missions:** Wayne reminded us of the Soup Supper scheduled for November 12. Sign are being made to post around for this event. Items for a silent auction would be appreciated. Sign up sheets are on the welcome desk. There will be another chili cook-off for those

interested. The Stead Family Children's Center is the December Mission of the Month. Unwrapped items need to be returned to the church by December 18. There will be cards on a tree with toys and personal items listed for suggestions as to what can be purchased.

**Reaching:** Lori recently had a brief meeting of her team. The fun afternoon at Sherman's Pumpkin Patch was a big success as usual.

**Congregational Care:** Sherry noted the health clinic will be held on the 3rd Sunday of the month only. Sunday December 4 at 4 p.m. there will be an Empty Chair Service to acknowledge the loss of a loved one and that there will be an empty chair at their table this Christmas. Marlene will deliver the Upper Room to the Good Neighbor Home. Susan is planning a Thanksgiving Dinner and will be doing the meat with attendees to bring a dish to pass. They are looking for volunteers for the

Christmas dinner to do the meat. This is also a potluck. **Old Business:** Mark and board members suggested we have three more meetings to discuss disaffiliation and they are being planned on Wednesday evenings the first part of November depending on the availability of speakers from the outside. The meetings with guest speakers will be taped for any that cannot be present and will be shown later. The third meeting will include audio/video presentations from each side. There will be some time of discussion at each meeting. We are in touch with the District Supt. to set a date for another Charge Conference before the end of the year.

**Action Item:** There was a motion by Mark, seconded by Shirley to resume membership enrollment with previous criteria. Motion carried with 4 approval, 2 no, and 3 abstain.

Action Item: Motion by Kathy, seconded by Charlie to pursue legal representation by a sub group made up of Mark, Kathy, Charlie and Pastor Phil. We have received a letter from an attorney with NCLL that is partnering with United Methodist Churches to provide attorney services at a very reasonable rate. Motion carried unanimously.

#### **Operation Christmas Child Shoebox Tips**

#### Please use one of the red and green GO boxes or a regular size cardboard shoebox.

They are a standard size that packs easily into the shipping cartons at the processing center. While plastic boxes seem practical, many times they break and end up in the "shoebox hospital" at the processing center.

#### Boy or Girl

Determine the gender and age category: 2-4 years, 5-9 years, or 10-14 years. Attach the appropriate label (from the OCC pamphlet) on the box lid. Once the box is full, put a rubber-band around the box.

#### Gifts

*Please focus on the practical!* This one box will be shared with all members of the child's home, neighbors, friends, etc. The one washcloth you include may be used by 10 people living with the child! The simple items you take for granted each day could make all the difference in this child's life! Below are some ideas to get you started.

**Non-liquid Hygiene items** (These items will be shared by everyone living with the child. That could be 10-20 people!)

- $\circ$  Toothbrush
- Mild bar soap (leave in packaging & put in a plastic baggie; Ivory is a great choice because it floats)
- Comb
- Washcloth
- Stick deodorant
- Non-liquid lip balm
- Adhesive bandages
- Nail clippers & file

**School Supplies** (These could mean the difference in whether or not the child gets to attend school.)

- $\circ$  Pens
- ° Pencils (sharpen beforehand if possible) & sharpener
- ° Crayons or markers
- Paper (Steno notebooks fit well in shoeboxes)
- Solar calculator
- Scissors
- ° Glue sticks

#### Clothing/Accessories

- Shirts (plain colors)
- Pants
- ° Shorts
- $\circ$  Shoes
- ° Socks
- Underwear
- Hats/mittens
- ° Hair bows
- ° Jewelry

#### Suggested \$10 Shipping Donation

- Other
  - Flashlights & batteries (This could be lifesaving for children escaping war or domestic violence)
  - Sunglasses
  - Tools (no saws or pocketknives)
  - Duct tape
  - Sewing kit/fabric
  - Cups, bowls, empty water bottle
- ∘ Fisĥing kit
- **Toys/WOW item** (Focus on the practical but still include a few fun items)
  - Balls (even a deflated soccer ball with a hand pump)
  - Stuffed animal
  - Small cars
  - ∘ Yo-yos
  - Jump ropes
  - ° Harmonicas
  - Puzzles
  - Binoculars

#### **DO NOT INCLUDE:**

- Used/damaged items
  - War-related items (toy guns, knives, military figures, or any action figure holding a weapon)
  - Candy, chocolate or any type of food (could melt or spoil)
  - Toothpaste (won't get through customs)
  - Liquids/lotions (containers can break ruining other items in the box)
  - Medications/vitamins
  - Breakable items (snow globes, glass containers, etc.)
- Aerosol cans

#### Missions

As this year is winding down, it is time to review what we have done over the course of the past 12 months. Our first event was the Chili Cookoff/Soup Supper. With the very generous help of our church, we raised \$4,000 for the Haiti water project.

The Luau in May raised \$2,800 for Paint by Neighbor. Here, twenty people helped clean up and repair the properties of Helen Cole and Wayne Cooksley. We have already identified a candidate for the 2023 Paint by Neighbor mission.

The July Ice Cream Social raised funds for shipping OOC shoe boxes. Again, very generous support from our church. Stephanie and her team have been so successful that they were asked to become a Central Drop Off location. We will all step up to that challenge.

In July, we placed our new food pantry by the garage in the gravel parking lot. I wondered how long it would take before the pantry was fully utilized. It didn't take long. Those in need have found the pantry and use it on a regular basis. I would say that contents on the average turnover 3-4 times per week. Again, our church has stepped up to keep the pantry supplied with needed items.

Rahab House has become a reality. The church has purchased the property known as the House of David. More information will be forthcoming as this mission is being organized.

So now we come back to another fall event, the Soup Supper scheduled for Saturday, Nov. 12<sup>th</sup> from 4:30-7:00 PM. We will again have a chili cookoff and a silent auction. This year funds raised will go to the University of Iowa Stead Family Children's Hospital Extenuating Circumstance Fund. Here, families of hospitalized children with extended stays receive help in meeting unanticipated expenses. Many in our congregation have experienced just such a need.

There are signup sheets posted in the hallway for several needs related to the Soup Supper. We will again offer chili and chicken noodle soup along with various desserts. Please review these sheets and help out where you can.

November Mission of the Month is Pay it Forward.

December Mission of the Month is Stead Family Center Toy Drive. Here we will place cards, with pictures of approved toys or personal hygiene items on the tree in the Narthex. Congregants can take as many cards as they choose and return those purchased items unwrapped to the church by Dec. 18<sup>th</sup>. We will deliver those returned items that week to the Stead Family Center in Iowa City.
