A note from Pastor Phil...

"Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace to those on whom his favor rests."- Luke 2:14

The Shepherds were dutifully watching their sheep at night. Unknown to them a young mother gives birth to her firstborn, a son they shall call Jesus. Then to the shepherds out of nowhere comes the holy host of angelic voices singing "Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace to those on whom his favor rests." In my minds eye the shepherd's hearts were racing and they were afraid... Something like this doesn't happen everyday... Or ever. Where is this peace that the angels promised? I really doubt the shepherds felt at peace in that moment.

Here we are over 2000 years later and we still search for this promised peace. Consider the last several years. We have had monumental political unrest, a pandemic, all time high inflation, recession, and the Nebraska Cornhuskers defeated the Iowa Hawkeyes in football. (Wait, isn't that a good thing?) On top of that our church denomination is in the midst of a great conflict as well. Lord, where is this peace You have promised? Does Your favor not rest on us?

What is important to recognise here is what we are doing as opposed to what God is doing. We are in the time of Advent- a time of preparation for the coming of the Holy birth. God's self shall enter into the world as a helpless babe in the arms of a virginal mother, born into poverty yet shall be known as the King of Kings! This is what God is doing. The rest of this is just background noise. Our vote for disaffiliation is set for December 12th at 6:00. All members in good standing shall vote in person and our options are pretty clear. As one of our Single Board members put it- "to remain who we are, we need to change the signs... But if we want to keep the signs, we need to change who we are." To disaffiliate is to remain faithful biblical authority, covenants, and to truly be a people called Methodists. To remain is to diminish bible authority, embrace the breaking of covenants, and to no longer be a people connected by our General Conference, but instead to allow a minority voice to take over and force their preferred way and choices. To disaffiliate is to give the local church a greater voice in how we pick our leadership to how the denomination spends their offerings... To remain UMC is to know- well what we have already come to know.

So God calls us to a time of preparation. Perhaps this vote to define the future of this church which began as a Methodist Episcipol Church in 1853 to move forward into a new future. Either We continue to hold scripture in high authority as John Wesley taught and disaffiliate- or to remain in a progressive UMC and trust in something other than the authority of the Word of God.

So we wait. We wait to worship in thanksgiving God's incarnational presence among us on Christmas day. We wait to define ourselves as faithful stewards of God's Word and the Bride of Christ- the church. We wait to see how this plays out as a mystery for us to anticipate, but will be revealed... For now we wait.

MUMC Single Board November 15, 2022 6:00 p.m. - Wesley Hall

Present: Shirley Davis, Lori Snyder, Bruce Nodurft, Pastor Phil, Ruth Voshell, Charlie Dighton, Wayne Birkenholz, Mark Reth, Jean Gross.

Mark called the meeting to order at 6:15 followed by a brief devotional from Acts 2:46-47, summarized by the fact that God lives in community through the Son and Holy Spirit and He wants us to also live in community with Him and each other. Prayers and praises were lifted up followed by a prayer for guidance from Pastor Phil.

Bruce gave the finance report for October. YTD contributions have amounted to \$210,765 and YTD expenses without apportionments are \$189,079. We are ahead of last year's contributions by \$17,437. The Brick-by-Brick campaign has \$122,918 with the October contributions. Two bills have been paid out of this account for the bathroom upgrades and Kluesner Flooring. The electric bill has been paid so far for Rahab House.

Charlie reported for trustees that new locks have been installed on the Rahab House. A list of items needing to be done at that house was presented and it was suggested to have the city do a check to see what needs to be done to bring it up to code. The bathroom contractor assured us they would have the time to do the upgrades of the church bathrooms. Debbie is looking into tile, colors, etc to go forward. Bathroom layout designs are being considered. Sidewalk repairs will be done next summer and Cole Beckman will be contracted for snow removal of the sidewalks around the church and Roger Erickson will be asked to remove snow from the parking lot.

Ruth reported that worship needs to upgrade the sound board among other tech issues needed to be done. Cory Wulfekuhle will be contracted to do what needs to be done for the whole building to improve our technology at a cost of \$3352.

Wayne reported that missions of the month are now including a two month time period to be more effective. Approximately \$1400 was made from the recent soup supper and silent auction with that money designated for the Stead Family Children's Center.

Sherry's congregational care notes included information on the empty chair service for grieving families to acknowledge the loss of a loved one and that there will be an empty chair at their table this Christmas. Sunday December 4 at 4 p.m. is the scheduled time for this service. Marlene is taking the Upper Room to the GNH. Susan Herman is doing the turkey for the Thanksgiving Day potluck at the church. Let Kat know if you are interested in attending.

Shirley Davis reported that Staff Parish will once again be collecting money for our church staff to be presented some time before Christmas. Donations can be given to her or left in the collection plates or church office.

The voting procedures for disaffiliation were discussed and decided. Our voting statement will be followed by a yes or no. No abstained votes will be allowed to be counted for this determination. Only members of our church can vote. More information to follow. Mark Reth will be filling out the needed information to secure legal representation when/if the church makes its determination.

Meeting adjourned at 8:10 p.m. Out next meeting will be on December 20, 2022 at 6:00 p.m. in Wesley Hall.
