A note from Pastor Phil...

9 After they had heard the king, they went on their way, and the star they had seen when it rose went ahead of them until it stopped over the place where the child was. 10 When they saw the star, they were overjoyed. 11 On coming to the house, they saw the child with his mother Mary, and they bowed down and worshiped him. Then they opened their treasures and presented him with gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. 12 And having been warned in a dream not to go back to Herod, they returned to their country by another route.

- Luke 2:9-12

This Luke scripture is the scripture we most often read for "Epiphany" Sunday which is the Sunday after Christmas. So often we focus on the journey of the Magi, or the wonder of their worship of the Son of God when they arrive at the home of Joseph and Mary, or the significance of the gifts they offer to Jesus. But this Sunday we will focus on the Journey home after they have worshiped the Messiah... Scripture tells us "They returned to their country by another route." The Holy Spirit compelled them to return home without sharing with Herod the place where they found the Holy Child. Because they knew that Herod did not intend to worship Emmanuel, but to destroy this child as a threat to his own glory.

As I am preparing for this Sunday's message, it occurs to me that there might be a connection with this story and our vote to disaffiliate from the UMC a couple weeks ago. With around 100 votes cast four out of five votes were to leave the UMC and to seek out a better expression for our path forward as a church. Overwhelmingly the vote was to honor biblical authority over a progressive biblical narrative that is being sought by the UMC leadership in open defiance of our covenants and Book of Discipline. Now we will need to begin to discern our way forward by "another route."

I believe that the most important issue for this church family is that we are not forced to change who we are. We are a church who holds to the authority of scripture, to the acceptance of all people, that all are sinners in need of Jesus, and that we shall with love and community worship together with integrity, working out our salvation with fear and trembling. As I have stated before, we already established who we are, now we just need to decide the best way forward for us to remain who we are... Without compromise we shall remain the Body of Christ that we have established and love as family... Where everyone- sinners all- are welcome and celebrated with eternal value.

John Wesley shared a unique theological understanding around scripture, grace, salvation, and personal and social holiness. This is a part of who we are so we will focus our search on traditions that maintain these important theological priorities. There are many we can consider, each with their own unique voice, we need to align ourselves with the one that fully shares our voice.

We are going to continue our Thursday "Conversations" on January 12th at Fiesta Cancun at noon. Each Thursday we will gather to talk about whatever anyone wishes to discuss, but members of our Single Board and myself will be prepared to discuss our research of other Methodist/Wesleyan traditions that we may consider aligning ourselves with after we are removed from the Iowa UMC Conference on July 1st.

In this time of discernment, I invite all our church family to pray for the church, our leadership, and one another. Four out of five understood this was the right way forward, but one out of five did not. It is time we set aside the discussion of leaving the UMC, that decision has been made. The question is- if we were happy together before this vote, and the vote was to insure we could remain who we are, then perhaps we can come back together to worship and celebrate who God has called us to be...Family. This is my prayer. But for those who feel that we should have remained in the direction of the UMC, Know that I care about you and support you if you feel you need to move to a different church family that is not disaffiliating. You just need to submit a written request to the church office, and we will facilitate the transfer to the church of your choice and pray that you shall go with God.

Mark called the meeting to order at 6:03 PM followed by a devotional on Mark 8:23-34 with special emphasis on verse 23. There was a brief discussion. Prayers and praises were lifted up followed by a prayer for guidance from Pastor Phil.

Bruce gave the finance report for November. YTD contributions have amounted to \$227,544 and YTD expenses without apportionments are \$206,060l. We are ahead of last year's contributions by \$19,000. The Brick-by-Brick campaign has \$121,000 with the November contributions. Bills have been paid out of the account for the bathroom upgrades.

In Charlies' absence. The internet upgrade has been accomplished. The main lights in the sanctuary have been replaced. The furnace in the Remling property was replaced as per the agreement at time of the sale.

Ruth also reported that the internet upgrade has been done. The worship times for Christmas Eve are 4:00 PM, 5:30 PM and 11:00 PM. There will be no WOW service on December 28,

Wayne reported that the Jan-Feb mission will be for Congregate Meals. Meals will be prepared and placed in the freezer for distribution to shut-ins and where needed.

Sherry reported that the next item for Congregational Care will be Valentine's Dinner. The Congregational Care committee will be distributing the Congregate Meals.

Shirley reported that the SPPRC will begin meeting quarterly. The contributions for the Staff were made on Sunday, December 18.

Mark will be contacting the NCLL to get the process started for disaffiliation.

Mark, Charlie and Bruce will be on a sub-committee for Legal matters involved with the disaffiliation.

Kathy will head a sub-committee to research denominations.

After discussion, it was decided to not have a January physical meeting. There will be an email roundup.

Meeting adjourned at 7:55 PM. Next meeting will be February 21, 2023.


