

A note from Pastor Phil...

See, I am doing a new thing!
Now it springs up; do you not perceive it?
I am making a way in the wilderness
and streams in the wasteland.-Isaiah 43:19

There came a time in God's relationship with humanity that the people of God- the Israelitesturned away from God's ways to follow their own human desires and Idol's of their own making. God describes it as choosing to be blind and deaf to God's ways and presence. The consequence of this was that God pulled His blessing from the land and people of Israel, they were conquered and eventually ended up in exile in Babylon for about 70 years. Somewhere around the midpoint of exile (Around the 35th year) God spoke through the Prophet Isaiah about their plight in a foreign land of pagan beliefs.

Isaiah 43 is a wonderful prophecy of encouragement for God's chosen people.

In verse 1 God reveals; "Do not fear, for I have redeemed you; I have summoned you by name; you are mine." God assures His people, I have not forgotten you, you are not separated from my love...

In verse 5 God reveals; "Do not be afraid, for I am with you;I will bring your children from the east and gather you from the west. God's promise is that He will be with them in their trials, and make a path to return to Him and the promised land for their children.

In verse 12 God proclaims; "You are my witnesses," declares the Lord, "that I am God." There is judgment for turning away from God, but as God's chosen people judgment does not result in loss of love, nor does it result in a brokenness that is without mending. The Israelite people are still chosen to be the witnesses of God's love for this and all generations to come.

Verse 18 states; ""Forget the former things; do not dwell on the past." What God is saying here is that our past may inform us going forward... but that it should not form us. Do not live into the brokenness and shame that sin has brought to you, but instead live into a new life as God's chosen people...

And then we come to the scripture highlighted above in psalm 43 verse 19...God promises that God is doing a new thing! Can you not tell? Stop dwelling in what sin created your current trials, and focus on this new thing- God's unmerited grace!

This is not the grace of the cross- this is a moment of grace so that God's people can return to the Law... One would hope that this grace was enough... But God knows that we have much to learn and yet overcome... Eternal grace is only welcomed when humanity is ready to acknowledge that eternal grace is necessary. The Law is beyond the ability of the human condition... We all- everyone- need a Savior.

In this time as a church we may feel we are in exile... We have spoken through our voice and vote that the United Methodist Church has turned their eyes from the faith of our ancestors, and are leaving those of us who hold to the authority of scripture and covenants behind as they move in a direction where with integrity of faith we just cannot follow.

But what next? As described at the end of service back in January, our Single Board was charged with wading through all the possible options for us going forward in a new tradition or perhaps looking towards becoming independent. This has been a difficult journey as there are significant time constraints, we have to be aligned somewhere by July 1, 2023, and also many options. There was just no reasonable way to inform the church of all options and narrow it down within the required time frame. I remind all again, the legislation 2553 that allows for disaffiliation was designed for a three year process, not the 9 months that the lowa Conference of the UMC has required. The Single Board split responsibilities in January with one subgroup working on the requirements of disaffiliation with our attorney, and another focusing on a recommendation for the best next step for our church to continue being a place of acceptance and worship for all with a focus on biblical authority and service to the glory of Jesus Christ from this unique place in this unique time.

At the March meeting of the Single Board the subcommittee presented the two top options they have narrowed it down to that would not require us to change who we are and how we believe.

The Free Methodist Church would be a good fit on polity (supporting that which we already believe) but there is a trust clause. There would be apportionments though less than what we experienced in the UMC.

The Global Methodist Church would be an easy fit as this is the denomination that has grown from the conflict in the UMC. So the things we appreciated we get to keep, and the things that caused us to leave are changed so that once again the entire denomination is in line with the polity that we support. The GMC is transitional at this time but should we join we would have a vote and voice in how it is ultimately structured. There would be apportionments but significantly less- guaranteed by written polity to be significantly less than the UMC, and no trust clause. The GMC is a coalition of the willing... Should there be moves away from our defining beliefs we can just move on... Which is what makes this Wesleyan tradition and leadership much more accountable to the individual churches.

The subcommittee ultimately recommended to the Single Board that We recommend to the body of the church that we go forward in joining with the Global Methodist Church. The Single Board unanimously voted to affirm this recommendation.

Your Single Board will announce several opportunities for informational meetings for the congregation to be informed of what they are recommending and why. On April 16th, immediately after service, we will hold a Church Conference to vote to either support the recommendation of the Single Board or to send them back to consider other alternatives. We will also vote on a new name for the church, which the Single Board unanimously voted to recommend "Manchester Methodist Church."

If you have any questions please be sure to attend the informational meetings, Conversations with Pastor on Thursdays, or ask a Single Board member or Pastor Phil.

God is doing something new in Manchester, lowa! The time is shortly upon us to not look back on the conflict that has brought us to this place, and instead begin to dream God sized dreams about how we respond to God's call to come and see, find your rest, and go and tell!

MUMC Single Board March 21, 2023 6:00p.m. Wesley Hall

Mark called the meeting to order at 6:00p.m. followed by a devotional from Matthew 6:7-8 which reminded us again that our Father knows what we need even before we ask Him. Seek Him and His goodness.

Prayers and praises were lifted up followed by the Lord's prayer. We need to especially keep Dennis in prayer as he has some upcoming surgeries this month and next.

Ministry Reports

Finance: Bruce reported that Year-to-Date actual expenses were \$36,146 and actual income was \$34,716 leaving us with a small shortfall. Our contributions are behind last year at this time by -\$4,433. The Brick-by-Brick campaign has a balance of \$87,160 as work continues on the bathrooms. February contributions for this fund were #320.

Trustees: The upstairs bathrooms are nearing completion. Four old pews have been removed from the building. Some sidewalk needs to be replaced on the south side of our parking lot by July 1st. Trustees are looking at someone to professionally re-wax the Wesley Hall flooring. Additional janitorial work is needed to clean the church. There was discussion on usage of rooms in our church and it was shared that Trustees are the committee that needs to be contacted with ideas of how to use rooms before any work proceeds with changing a room. Many different groups use rooms throughout the week and they need to be available for

various purposes. April 1st there will be a general church cleaning day before Holy Week for anyone who is available. Jean is in charge and will have lists of areas to be cleaned.

Missions: Wayne announced there will be a potluck and fellowship time at the church on April 30th. There will be a brief presentations on the history of our church at that time. Pastor is working on a board for the Rahab House mission as well as mentoring teams. Al Saunders will do a walk through to determine what repairs and materials will be needed. There was discussion on possible projects for Paint by neighbor this summer. We will be joined by a youth group from Altoona who will be staying in our church that week. The clothing closet needs to upgrade their space.

Congregational Care: Sherry mentioned that several cards had been sent to those experiencing health issues and Marlene Reth visited and delivered Chimes and Upper Rooms to the GNH and Meadows. Phone calls have been made to shut-ins.

Action Items: It was moved by Charlie, seconded by Kathy to hire an additional person for up to 30 hours a week for janitorial services. Staff Parish will pursue applicants as soon as possible. Motion carried.

Motion by Ruth, seconded by Kathy that the new name for our church after disaffiliation will be **Manchester Methodist Church** pending church approval. Motion carried.

Motion by Bruce, seconded by Charlie that we adopt the new denominational affiliation of the Global Methodist Church as recommended by committee after presentation, discussion and approval by the congregation. Motion carried.

April 16th will be the date for a church conference to vote on these matters so we can get our application work all done and approved by July 1st. There will be information and discussion times in the coming weeks. Some members of the Single Board will be available after church in Wesley Hall on March 26th. There will be a discussion session immediately following church service on April 2nd. We need to have our application work done in a timely manner so we are ready to go July 1st.

Meeting adjourned at 8:30 p.m. followed by the Lord's Prayer and singing of the Doxology.




