## A note from Pastor Phil...

11 For I know the plans I have for you," declares the Lord, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future. 12 Then you will call on me and come and pray to me, and I will listen to you.

-Jerimiah 29:11-12

At the time Jerimiah wrote this prophecy Israel was entering into the 2nd exile, this time to Babylon. Israel would be decimated of their most educated and their leaders. The people were afraid of leaving the promised land to go and live in this new and different place. How would they worship God? How will God find them?

In chapter 29 God reveals that He is the one and only God and will follow them to wherever they are, and care for them in exile as they return their proper worship away from man made idols and worship Him only. In verse 11 God proclaimed "I know the plans I have for you!" Plans not to punish, not to harm, but to prosper the people of God and then the promise of hope and a future. In the original Greek it might be better translated as a "hopeful future." Then God invites His people into a deeper relationship- pray to Me... I will listen!

Things around the church have been pretty chaotic since last September. As a church we voted 82% to disaffiliate from the United Methodist Church on the issue of biblical authority. Last month we voted 96% to join the new denomination Global Methodist Church. One can hope that we would all be of one accord, and wouldn't things be so much easier if we had voted 100%. 82% is a very strong majority, and significantly higher than the 67% required to disaffiliate... But in this conversation it seems we shall have winners and losers. Our course is set, we are off to a new thing, participating in a new Methodist denomination that promises to better align with who we are and how we understand the nature and character of God revealed in Holy Scripture. But there is still some anxiety and sadness around this splitting of the denomination. I found Jesus in a small UMC church in Oklahoma. My wife and all my kids were baptized in a UMC church... I baptized my first 4 grandsons here in this sanctuary... I found my love and call in ministry and worship in a United Methodist Church. But I also found a sense of betrayal as well in broken covenants, and brokenness in that which defined us as a people.

So let us remember and celebrate all the ways that we experienced the movement of the Holy Spirit in our time affiliated with the UMC... Let us not focus on the end of our relationship with the UMC denomination, and all the angst, hurt, and anxiousness that we have experienced at the end. Let us turn our vision ever forward and with great anticipation await that which God shall reveal to us so that He is glorified in our ministry and witness.

#### **MUMC Single Board** April 18, 2023 6:00p.m.-Wesley Hall

Present: Lori Snyder, Paul Lyman, Bill Scanlan, Wayne Birkenholz, Bruce Nodurft, Ruth Voshell, Pastor Phil, Sherry Goranson, Kathy Dolan, Shirley Davis, Jean Gross, Mark Reth.

Mark called the meeting to order at 6:00p.m. followed by scripture from Matthew 28:5-6. The angel said to the women, "Do not be afraid, for I know that you are looking for Jesus, who was crucified. He is not here, he has risen, just as he said. Come and see the place where he lay."

Jesus Christ is the cornerstone of our faith. Christ's victory over death proves that He is the Son of God and it is this victory that gives us hope, even in the midst of trials and challenges. As the world changes around us, we are dedicated to helping Christians navigate these "changing times" so that the message of hope, salvation, and the resurrection of Jesus Christ continues to reach those who need it most.

**Finance:** Bruce reported that actual expenses to date through the first quarter are \$19,157 and actual income has been \$17,638 giving us a budget shortfall of \$1,519 for the year without apportionments. Brick-by-Brick contributions for March were \$600 and expenses totaled \$7,396, laving a total of \$80,373 as of March 31. Work is still progressing on the bathrooms. Discussion was held on what is needed to shine up the new floor in Wesley Hall. A possible solutions are: to purchase a scrubber/buffer that Dust can handle, sharing one with another facility or renting one locally if available. We hope to make a decision next month. Al Seibert gave us some ideas of how to properly care for that flooring. Our extra janitorial help is working out well. Dennis will be on sick leave soon.

Missions: Wayne reported future missions of the month including: Samaritans Purse, Disaster Response, Pay It Forward, Operation Christmas Child, Stead Family Extenuating Circumstances Fund and Stead Family Toy Tree. Yard Cleaning Mission: Neighbors helping Neighbors is a new mission benefiting those within our congregation and not intended to take work away from those who offer such services for a fee. Paint by Neighbor will continue this summer. A reminder was given about the April 30th Brunch/Potluck after service. Bring a dish to share. Drinks will be provided.

Congregational Care: Sherry reminded us that Berdina Carradus' funeral will be May 6th and Jim Dkeyser's will be May 13th. Mission meals have been taken to those recently hospitalized and sympathy and get well cards have been sent. Easter cards also were sent to homebound members as well as the Meadows and GNH.

**Staff Parish:** Shirley reported the *Another Set of Eyes form* needs to be filled out soon.

Action Item: Motion by Kathy, seconded by Wayne to approve the minutes from the April 16, 2023, Special Church meeting as presented with one additional statement as an addendum. Motion carried.

**Additional topics:** Single board was presented with several documents having to do with the upcoming disaffiliation from the UMC. Pastor Phil shared recent correspondence received from our Bishop regarding a special session being called of the Iowa Annual Conference on May 23, 2023 beginning at 6:30p.m. CDT. This special session will be conducted via electronic conferencing using Zoom. The sole purpose of this special session

is for voting on the Iowa Annual Conference Board of Trustees' recommendations for the churches disaffiliating per Paragraph 2553 of The Book of Discipline.

Mark shared several documents with Single Board which are necessary to complete the disaffiliation process including: Insurance and Closing Statement; EIN Paperwork; Disaffiliation Agreement; Bill of Sale; Deed; List of Local Church Real and Personal Property; and Bylaws. Following discussion on some of these items and designating those responsible, a motion was made by Paul Lyman, seconded by Kathy Dolan that we adjourn at 8:40pm. Motion carried.

Our next meeting is scheduled for May 16, 2023 at 6:00 p.m. in Wesley Hall.

## Manchester United Methodist Church Special Meeting April 16, 2023 10:00 a.m.

**Purpose:** To vote on two recommendations from Single Board regarding (1) applying for membership in the Global Methodist Church and (2) renaming our church Manchester Methodist Church as of July 1, 2023.

Congregation members were invited to Wesley Hal after service to sign in and receive a ballot.

Mark Reth, Single Board Chair, called the meeting to order at 10:00 a.m. He gave a brief explanation again on the two recommendations being voted on. There was a question from the congregation as to what percentage was needed to pass. A simple majority is all that is needed for this purpose.

Pastor Phil led us in a prayer for guidance before voting. All those present voted at this time and were free to leave or stay for the results. Included in the votes cast were a few people who chose to vote absentee the previous week.

"I move that Manchester Methodist Church become a member congregation of the Global Methodist Church, that it affirms and endorses the doctrinal standards (Part One), Social Witness (Part Two) and church governance of the Global Methodist Church as set forth in its Transitional Book of Doctrines and Discipline, and agrees to be accountable to such standards, witness, and governance. Our leadership and trustees are authorized to take all actions necessary to implement this motion."

The final tally was as follows:

Recommendation to apply for membership in the Global Methodist Church:

65 Yes 6 No 91% in favor

Recommendation to use the name Manchester Methodist Church:

68 Yes 2 No 97% in favor

A motion was made by Wayne Birkenholz, seconded by Kathy Dolan to accept the recommendations and the votes as tallied. Carried.

**Board Members Voting:** Ruth Voshell, Lori Snyder, Wayne Birkenholz, Charlie Dighton, Kathy Dolan, Sherry Goranson, Paul Lyman, Mark Reth.

Results were shared with those who chose to stay.

**STATION LEADERS (Adults):** Students (who are grouped in crews) move through various stations that are stationed by an adult leader and feature a different Bible-learning activity. You are the "teacher" for your station. Crews are at your station for approximately 20 minutes. Stations

#### include:

\*\*Games: This enthusiastic individual leads the crews through a variety of games that connect with the daily Bible Point or Bible story. There are always a variety of games for the leader to choose from to best suit the kids at our VBS.

\*\*Bible Leader: This organized storyteller brings the Bible to life for groups of elementary age kids through interactive and engaging experiences, then helps kids apply the word of God to their own lives.

**ELEMENTARY CREW LEADERS (HS Students or Adults):** These individuals are assigned to a group of approximately 6 kids. They lead their crew through each station assisting the station leaders as needed.

PRESCHOOL CREW LEADERS/HELPERS (MS OR HS STUDENTS, ADULTS): Rather than have our three to five-year-olds rotate through the stations with the older kids, they have their own class. We still need 3 or 4 more helpers for this class. Crew leaders will help organize these kids and assist the leaders.

**STATION HELPER (MS Students):** These helpers assist the station leaders with anything they need extra hand with.

**PRESCHOOL GAMES & CRAFT TEACHER (ADULT):** This patient and creative leader manages materials and guides groups of preschoolers through creating a variety of Bible point reinforcing crafts. This energetic, patient, and organized individual is in charge of leading preschool age kids in fun activities and discussions. You don't need to be an Olympian, you just need to be organized, energetic, and fun loving.

#### \*\*\*ENDOWMENT UPDATES\*\*\*

In 2001 the Manchester United Methodist Church lost a longtime faithful servant when Don Reth passed away. In 2003, to honor her brother, Bertha Tribuno established the *Donald Harold Reth Endowment* as a tribute to his life and to keep his memory alive in a special way. The sole purpose of the Reth Endowment fund is to generate income for our Christian Education program. Christian Education is the focus because Don's wife Marlene and his daughter Tammy had served as Sunday school teachers and as Sunday school superintendents.

The Reth Endowment is established through the Iowa United Methodist Foundation. On an annual basis, the Foundation informs MUMC of the income available for distribution. The maximum amount made available is 5% of the current fund balance. This year, 2023, the amount was \$266.00.

When the Reth Endowment was established, Manchester United Methodist Church was asked to annually recognize the establishment and existence of the endowment by placing a letter in the May edition of the <u>Chimes</u>. Don's birthday was May 7<sup>th</sup>. The publication of this letter fulfills our commitment to do so.

The Donald Harold Reth Endowment is an individually owned fund meaning that it is not owned by MUMC and that the church cannot alter the terms of the agreement between the Foundation and Ms. Tribuno. However, anyone who would like to contribute to the Reth Endowment may do so.

MUMC has also established its own endowment fund. The **Manchester United Methodist Endowment** has been in existence since 2005. This is a church owned fund and we direct the use of the earnings. Since it currently is a rather small fund, it is thought of as "seed money" and all of the income earned thus far has been reinvested in the endowment. The hope is that at some time in the future this fund will grow to a point where the income earned can be withdrawn and used to help meet the needs of MUMC.

As with the Reth Endowment, anyone who desires may make a contribution to the MUMC Endowment. If you would like to make a contribution to an existing endowment, would like to establish your own endowed fund, or have questions regarding endowments, feel free to contact any of the individuals named below. Checks may be made out to Manchester Methodist Church. Please note on the memo line 'endowment contribution'




