### A note from Pastor Phil...

11 For the grace of God has appeared that offers salvation to all people.
12 It teaches us to say "No" to ungodliness and worldly passions, and to live self-controlled, upright and godly lives in this present age, 13 while we wait for the blessed hope—the appearing of the glory of our great God and Savior, Jesus Christ, 14 who gave himself for us to redeem us from all wickedness and to purify for himself a people that are his very own, eager to do what is good.- Titus 2:11-14

This Chimes newsletter is our first as a Global Methodist Church! As of this writing we have not decided on our new logo, or completed our new website... But this will all come in the near future. What is important to note is that it looks about the same around here... Same pews, same carpets, same people... What is new is that we are free to pursue our identity of truly being traditional Methodists. For the next several months I will speak to the unique theological understandings of Methodism as revealed in the teaching of John Wesley who was the founder of Methodism.

First- everyone, everywhere, all, can be saved! John Wesley taught;

"All need to be saved. All may be saved. All may know themselves saved. All may be saved to the uttermost."

In our human condition we live in an unjust, selfish, and violent world. We would love to change this, but often feel powerless to do so. #### MMC Single Board June 6th, 2023 5:00p.m.-Wesley Hall

**Present:** Bruce Nodurft, Paul Lyman, Wayne Birkenholz, Bill Scanlan, Ruth Voshell, Phil Rogers, Charlie Dighton, Kathy Dolan, Sherry Goranson, Jean Gross, Lori Snyder, Mark Reth.

Mark called the meeting to order at 5:04 p.m. followed by scripture from Revelations 21:5-7: He who was seated on the throne said, "I am making everything new!" Then he said "write this down, for these words are trustworthy and true." He said to me: "It is done. I am the Alpha and the Omega, the Beginning and the End. To the thirsty I will give water without cost from the spring of the water of life. Those who are victorious will inherit all this, and I will be their God and they will be my children."

This scripture ties in with the new path on which we are embarking. A new beginning as the Manchester Methodist Church. God richly rewards those who remain faithful and steadfast to His word.

Prayers and praises were lifted up followed by a prayer for guidance by Jean Gross.

**Finance:** Bruce reported the actual expenses (without apportionments) year to date are \$97,475 and actual income year to date was \$90,224 leaving us a shortfall of -\$7,251. The Brick by Brick campaign has a balance of \$49,306 as of the end of May with May contributions of \$325. WE have received memorial monies from the following: Berdina Carradus designated for the Adult Library, OCC, and Women's Ministry; Jim DeKeyser for undesignated and Jean Taylor for OCC. Bruce is still working with F&M Bank to get our financial items all changed by July 1, 2023.

**Trustees:** Charlie reported all insurances through Dolan Insurance including Workman's Comp will be ready for the change July 1 included Workman's Comp. The new policy will cost \$10,393/year. Rates have gone up considerably on all properties due to recent weather related losses.

**Education:** Paul said there will be a renewed effort for education this fall and there will be a report at the next meeting.

**Congregational Care:** Sherry reported the visits and phone calls are being done and cards sent. The group will help with food for the mission project coming up and also will help the clothing closet move items for a room update.

The May 23rd special zoom meeting of the Iowa Conference delegates voted 541-21 to allow 83 Iowa United Methodist Churches to disaffiliate who voted to do so and there is a list so far of 40 additional churches for the scheduled November special meeting. We are waiting for the final approval from Global of the acceptance of our church but we are already listed on their website. There is a backlog on their end because of the more than expected number of churches that are disaffiliating.

Discussion was held on the signage changes that will be need to the exterior of our church after June 30. Plans are in the works for how to proceed with that job.

Pastor Phil shared the compensation package that will be in effect for him from July until the end of the year. He will temporarily move onto his wife's health insurance policy until Global is ready to accept him on theirs. His new pension plan will be a personal 401K through Global. He also said that Lance our tech advisor is working on a new website. Pastor shared he does not yet know what types of new responsibilities he may have with Global. He also asked if the board would be interested in helping to plant a Methodist Church in Epworth as they are losing their building and are meeting elsewhere. They have about 55 people

who left the congregation and have rented accommodations for meeting as they move on.

Action Item: Motion by Paul, seconded by Wayne to satellite Epworth the needed support and training for six months at \$200/month while using our EIN# until they receive theirs which is in the works. Motion carried unanimously.

Golden church is in need of a pastor. We are hoping someone local can help fill that pulpit.

Next Meeting will be July 18, 2023, at 6:00p.m. in Wesley Hall. Meeting adjourned at 6:40p.m.

We are still looking for the following volunteer positions to be filled:

**STATION LEADERS (Adults):** Students (who are grouped in crews) move through various stations that are stationed by an adult leader and feature a different Bible-learning activity. You are the "teacher" for your station. Crews are at your station for approximately 20 minutes. Stations

#### include:

- \*\*Games: This enthusiastic individual leads the crews through a variety of games that connect with the daily Bible Point or Bible story. There are always a variety of games for the leader to choose from to best suit the kids at our VBS.
- \*\*Bible Leader: This organized storyteller brings the Bible to life for groups of elementary age kids through interactive and engaging experiences, then helps kids apply the word of God to their own lives.

**ELEMENTARY CREW LEADERS (HS Students or Adults):** These individuals are assigned to a group of approximately 6 kids. They lead their crew through each station assisting the station leaders as needed.

PRESCHOOL CREW LEADERS/HELPERS (MS OR HS STUDENTS, ADULTS): Rather than have our three to five-year-olds rotate through the stations with the older kids, they have their own class. We still need 3 or 4 more helpers for this class. Crew leaders will help organize these kids and assist the leaders.

**STATION HELPER (MS Students):** These helpers assist the station leaders with anything they need extra hand with.

PRESCHOOL GAMES & CRAFT TEACHER (ADULT): This patient and creative leader manages materials and guides groups of preschoolers through creating a variety of Bible point reinforcing crafts. This energetic, patient, and organized individual is in charge of leading preschool age kids in fun activities and discussions. You don't need to be an Olympian, you just need to be organized, energetic, and fun loving.
